Suggested Points for Hill Calls

- Following through on our conversations earlier this week, we are now able to inform you the Administration has decided to provide \$2 million of flood-related assistance to North Korea.
- This modest assistance would be in the form of a grant from USAID's Office of Foreign Disaster Assistance to the World Food Program for procurement of food and related costs. *UN*
- We have made this decision to respond to a genuine humanitarian need and to continue encouraging North Korea's engagement in the international community.
- We have coordinated this decision with South Korea and believe South Korea understands our decision was based on humanitarian considerations. We are confident the WFP can monitor effectively the distribution of the aid.

In response to an appeal from the United Nations World Food Program (WFP), the U.S. government has decided to provide \$2 million of humanitarian assistance for use on flood related relief in North Korea. Recent floods destroyed significant portions of rural farm land resulting in widespread food shortages and malnutrition. The WFP estimates food shortages in North Korea of well over one million tons this spring.

This assistance will be in the form of a grant from USAID's Office of Foreign Disaster Assistance (OFDA) to the WFP for procurement of foodstuffs. The U.S. has chosen WFP as the channel for this assistance because of its ability to monitor closely distribution to ensure that the aid reaches those in need.

Thank you for your letter urging our continued attention to the return of remains of prisoners of war from North Korea.

I want to assure you that this is a subject to which we have paid great attention -- more attention than ever before by the American government.

We have held one set of discussions with North Korean authorities, and another negotiation session is scheduled for late April. Our goal is joint recovery efforts that will enable us to return and identify the remains of our fallen from the Korean War. I hope you will accept my affirmation that we will do what we can to resolve this problem, which has gone unresolved for too long.

Please continue to be in touch with us with your views on this question.

It is troubling to Korean War veterans that the U. S. is proposing humanitarian aid to North Korea while that country is blocking the return of the 8100 Americans still missing in action. We believe their families and friends deserve "humane" consideration, too, and suggest the two issues should be linked as a matter of national policy.

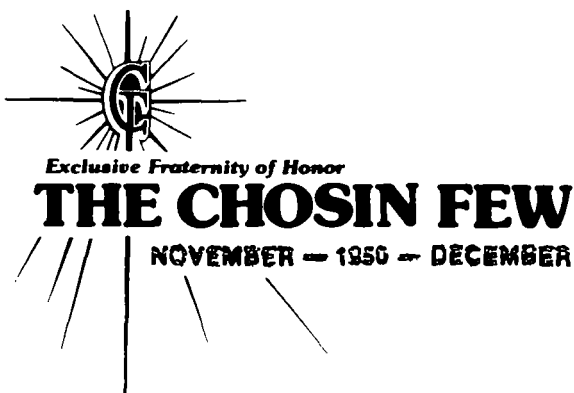

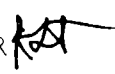

Attached at Tab A is a letter to Professor David Satterwhite of the University of California at Berkeley, who wrote to commend the Administration for the symbolic granting of \$2 million in humanitarian aid to North Korea and to express concern about the tone of a letter from Representatives Gilman, Hamilton and others to the Secretary of State that expressed reservations about the assistance. Satterwhite also wrote you in December about Korean matters. This response covers both letters (includes package #0534.)

Your reply thanks him for his letters and indicates that the aid issue is an important one, on which we have sought and obtained the agreement of South Korea. It closes with the observation that this is an exceptionally critical time and you appreciate hearing the views of U.S.-based experts.

I am chagrined at news reports indicating a tactical retreat by the DPRK leadership regarding international food-aid assistance ("North Korea Tells Groups to Halt Drive for Flood Aid," NYT, February 8, 1996), and the implications of this announcement by DPRK Deputy Foreign Minister Choe Su Hon. If taken at face value, the signalled ascendance of the military in DPRK policy formulation is a matter of concern, as I am sure your analysts have long been aware and have factored into their respective considerations.

I am genuinely heartened, however, by the timing and exceedingly important symbolic gesture recently made, promising provision of aid from the United States in the amount of \$2 million. I commend your Administration for having reached this decision, and for having persevered over the reported initial objections of our allies in the Republic of Korea and Japan. Knowing that you most likely encountered difficulties in convincing our allies in Seoul of the merits of this policy decision, I commend you, and Assistant Secretary Winston Lord, in particular.

While appreciating the variety of perspectives I know you must take into account, I confess to being troubled by the tone of a letter of February 5 from members of Congress to Secretary of State Warren Christopher. The tone carries no sense of seeking dialogue, a reduction in tensions on the peninsula, or improved relations between the U.S. and the DPRK, emphasizing instead points conducive of continued tensions and hostilities. In the area of international terrorism -- which the DPRK has unquestionably supported in the past -- the letter fails to note Secretary of State Christopher's nuanced position as stated on January 18 this year, quite deliberately excluding the DPRK from the list of "usual suspects." Similarly, the letter ignores the strenuously negotiated achievements by your Administration in Geneva and Kuala Lumpur, restraining the DPRK's nuclear program.

Specifically, furthermore, I interpret the letter's condition number 3, regarding the "tapping of North Korean military stocks," as virtually designed to subvert the Administration's provision of humanitarian aid. Given that existing tensions on the peninsula are mutually perceived;

that the DPRK military is intensely concerned not to reduce its own perceived need for "readiness"; and that virtually no military -- ours and that of the ROK included -- is willing to risk weakness by drawing down stocks or provisions; pressing this point upon the DPRK can be predicted to cause a negative, hard-line response. The net effect of this point and the letter's tone, then, is to stray from a more genuinely humanitarian intent, and is most unfortunate.

In response, I trust that the President, you, and your able colleagues in the Administration will find the wisdom to press ahead, not only with the provision of this symbolic and practical humanitarian aid, but with the larger effort to seek a negotiated settlement of the outstanding tensions on the peninsula. I admire your commitment to that end, and am convinced that the decision to provide assistance is consistent with the slow but crucial effort to draw the DPRK into a meaningful dialogue.

I had been looking forward to a conversation in person regarding these matters, but understand that your schedule precluded that possibility at this time. If further opportunities arise, allow me to be in communication with your staff, in hopes that we might meet at some point to discuss future policy considerations. All the best, and

Bipartisan Congressional Letter to Secretary of State Warren Christopher regarding Food Aid for North Korea, February 5, 1996:

Dear Mr. Secretary:

We are writing regarding the World Food Program's (WFPs) appeal for food aid donations to help relieve the starvation caused by recent flooding in North Korea.

>From the briefings recently provided by the State Department, we understand that the WFP issued a call for food aid to help relieve the large unmet need for food aid in North Korea. That appeal received only a limited response from the donor community. We understand that following recent flooding, the WFP reissued its appeal, but only for food aid donations to relieve starvation in specific areas effected by recent flooding(sic.) This smaller WFP appeal totals \$8 million, of which \$2 million would come from the United States as the lead donor.

The State Department informally notified us that the Administration plans to respond to this appeal by providing \$2 million in cash to the WFP, paid from Fiscal Year 1996 funds available to the Agency for International Development's International Disaster Assistance account.

We are very reluctant to approve any assistance to North Korea. As you know, the North Korean government threatens our troops stationed in South Korea, supports international terrorism, and frustrates our efforts to prevent the spread of nuclear weapons and the missiles to carry them.

Nevertheless, we recognize the view of the Administration that the victims of the recent flooding should not pay with their lives for the misguided policies of the North Korean government if we can insure that our assistance actually meets their critical needs. Therefore, we will not seek to block this assistance program as currently described, if the Administration notifies the Congress in writing of the following that:

1. Our South Korean allies to not oppose the delivery of this assistance;
2. Previous food aid and official concessional food deliveries have not been diverted to military needs;
3. North Korean military stocks have been tapped to respond to North Korea's unmet food aid needs; and
4. The WFP will be able to ensure that all upcoming food aid deliveries will not be diverted from intended recipients.

We would ask that you respond to this letter, in classified or unclassified form, before obligating funds to support the WFPs appeal. We look forward to working with you on this issue.

SUBJECT: Proposed Executive Order Entitled "Korean Peninsula Energy Development Organization"

SUMMARY: This memorandum forwards for your consideration a proposed Executive order that was prepared by the Department of State. The proposed order would grant the privileges under the International Organizations and Immunities Act ("Act") to the Korean Peninsula Energy Development Organization ("KEDO").

BACKGROUND: The Act accords privileges and immunities to public international organizations that meet certain criteria. The criteria are that: (a) the organization conduct sufficient business within the United States to warrant the grant of privileges under the Act; (b) the Government of the United States must participate in the organization; (c) the Government's participation must be authorized by treaty, act of Congress, or appropriation; and (d) the organization must be composed principally of governments and not scheduled for liquidation in the near future.

The KEDO meets the criteria under the Act. It is headquartered in New York and the United States participates in KEDO as a member state. Congress has appropriated \$22,000,000 in funds for the United States Government's participation in the organization. KEDO is composed entirely of governments and is not scheduled for liquidation in the foreseeable future.

KEDO's tasks are to manage the financing and construction of a light water reactor project in, and to provide heavy fuel oil to, North Korea, provided North Korea continues to dismantle its current nuclear program. The Department of State believes that the grant of privileges and immunities under the Act to KEDO will help KEDO carry out its tasks.

None of the affected agencies objects to the proposed Executive order.

RECOMMENDATION: I recommend that you sign the proposed Executive order.

By the authority vested in me as President by the Constitution and the laws of the United States of America, including section 1 of the International Organizations Immunities Act (59 Stat. 669, 22 U.S.C. 288), and having found that the Korean Peninsula Energy Development Organization is a public international organization in which the United States participates within the meaning of the International Organizations Immunities Act, I hereby designate the Korean Peninsula Energy Development Organization as a public international organization entitled to enjoy the privileges, exemptions, and immunities conferred by the International Organizations Immunities Act. This designation is not intended to abridge in any respect privileges, exemptions, or immunities which such organization may have acquired or may acquire by international agreements or by congressional action.
