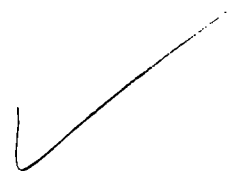

Representative Tate sent a letter (Tab A) to the President expressing his concern for the safety and well-being of his constituent, Evan Carl Hunziker, who is being held by the government of North Korea.

Hunziker illegally entered North Korea in August and is currently being held on charges of illegal entry and espionage. In each of our previous meetings in New York with North Korean representatives we have demanded the immediate release of Hunziker on humanitarian grounds. On 30 October, DPRK American Affairs Director Li Hyong Chol agreed to the release of Hunziker.

On 5 November, North Korea set three conditions on Hunziker's release: departure across the China-DPRK border, an informal statement of regret, and payment of a "legal fine" of \$100,000. State informed North Korea that the USG, by law, can only loan the Hunziker family a maximum of \$1500. The Hunziker family has been informed of the state of negotiations. Because of the possibility of North Korean reneging, we have not announced publicly the agreement to release Hunziker.

The attached letter responding to Tate indicates that we have placed a high priority on Hunziker's case and are working toward his release.

Representative Tate sent a letter (Tab A) to the President expressing his concern for the safety and well-being of his constituent, Evan Carl Hunziker, who is being held by the government of North Korea.

Hunziker illegally entered North Korea in August and is currently being held on charges of illegal entry and espionage. In each of our previous meetings in New York with North Korean representatives we have demanded the immediate release of Hunziker on humanitarian grounds. On 30 October, DPRK American Affairs Director Li Hyong Chol agreed to the release of Hunziker. Details will be worked out in New York on 5 November for Department of State North Korea Desk Officer Eric John to travel to North Korea to get Hunziker. Because of the possibility of North Korean reneging, we have not announced publicly the agreement to release Hunziker.

The attached letter responding to Tate indicates that we have placed a high priority on Hunziker's case and are working toward his release.

Dear Mr. President,

I am writing today to express my deep concern for the safety and well-being of my constituent, Evan Hunziker, who is being held by the government of North Korea.

As you know, Evan Hunziker was captured and arrested in North Korea in August and is being held on charges of illegal entry and espionage. I understand State Department officials have confirmed that Mr. Hunziker is not now and has never been in the employ of any U.S. agency engaged in espionage.

Since his arrest and imprisonment, the Swedish Chargé, representing the U.S. Government in North Korea, has visited Mr. Hunziker twice. Aside from his reports on Mr. Hunziker's condition, his family has received no information on Evan's safety and well-being. I also understand that United States diplomats have been negotiating with the North Korean delegates to the United Nations on behalf of Mr. Hunziker, so far to no avail.

With the understanding that North Korea is the most isolated nation in the world, ruled by a communist dictator, and the largest threat to the safety and security of our South Korean allies, I urge you to do everything within your power to ensure that Evan Hunziker is returned safely to the United States as soon as possible.

While an American citizen sits in jail in North Korea, the United States is providing millions of dollars in aid to the government responsible for his detention. Since February, the United States has provided \$8 million in food aid to North Korea. Furthermore, in Fiscal Year 1996, we provided \$22 million for the government of North Korea to purchase oil and another \$25 million has been appropriated for the same program in Fiscal Year 1997.

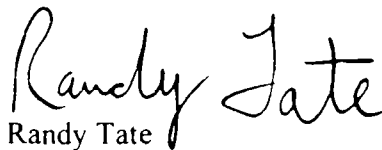

I respectfully request that all U.S. aid to North Korea be withheld until Evan Hunziker is released and returned safely to the United States. We simply cannot allow a rogue nation like North Korea to bully the United States. Unless we stand up to these aggressors, they will continue to act irresponsibly and in violation of international law. Unfortunately, Evan Hunziker has become a pawn of the North Korean government in its struggle for power in the world arena.

Mr. Hunziker's father, the people of the Ninth District of Washington, and all Americans want Evan Hunziker returned safely to the United States. I urge you to send a strong message to North Korea that it cannot get away with such actions without consequence.

Thank you for your attention to this request. I look forward to working closely with you to bring Evan Hunziker home.
