To sign the instruments of ratification of five mutual legal assistance treaties.

Background

On August 2, 1996, the Senate gave its advice and consent to ratification of five mutual legal assistance treaties with Korea, the United Kingdom and Northern Ireland, the Philippines, Hungary and Austria. All are part of a highly successful effort to modernize the legal tools available to law enforcement authorities in need of foreign evidence for use in criminal cases. The treaties should be effective tools in prosecuting a wide variety of modern criminals, including members of drug cartels and "white-collar criminals."

RECOMMENDATION

That you sign the attached instruments of ratification.

Subject: Ratifications of Five Mutual Legal Assistance Treaties

Attached for signature by the President are the instruments of ratification, in duplicate, of five mutual legal assistance treaties between: (1) the United States and Korea, signed at Washington on November 23, 1993, with a related exchange of notes signed on the same date; (2) the United States and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, signed at Washington on January 6, 1994, with a related exchange of notes signed the same date; (3) the United States and the Philippines, signed at Manila on November 13, 1994; (4) the United States and Hungary, signed at Budapest on December 1, 1994; and (5) the United States and Austria, signed at Vienna on February 23, 1995.

The treaties cover mutual legal assistance in criminal matters. All are part of a highly successful effort to modernize the legal tools available to law enforcement authorities in need of foreign evidence for use in criminal cases. The treaties should be effective tools in prosecuting a wide variety of modern criminals, including members of drug cartels and "white-collar criminals". Similar bilateral treaties have been concluded and have entered into force with Argentina, the Bahamas, Canada, Italy, Jamaica, Mexico, Morocco, the Netherlands, Panama, Spain, Switzerland, Thailand, Turkey, the United Kingdom, and Uruguay.

The Senate gave its advice and consent to ratification on August 2, 1996. The Senate's advice and consent to all of these treaties was subject to the following two provisos:

Nothing in the Treaty requires or authorizes legislation or other action by the United States of America that is prohibited by the Constitution of the United States as interpreted by the United States.

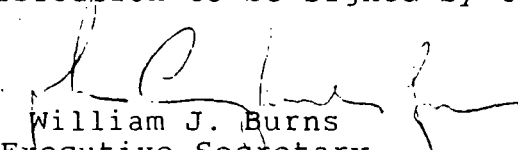

Pursuant to the rights of the United States under this Treaty to deny requests which prejudice its essential public policy or interest, the United States shall deny a request for assistance when the Central Authority, after consultation with all appropriate intelligence, anti-narcotic, and foreign policy agencies, has specific information that a senior government official who will have access to information to be provided under this Treaty is engaged in a felony, including the facilitation of the production or distribution of illegal drugs.

The Senate indicated these provisos shall not be included in the instruments of ratification to be signed by the President.

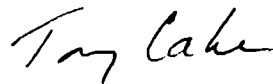

We know that as President of the United States you have recognized the importance of close relations between the United States and the Republic of Korea. We also know of the political, economic and diplomatic support you have extended to Korea, and of your strong concern for Korean security. We are also aware of the special trip you made to Korea as part of your Far Eastern trip in 1995. It was a display of support for Korea that we welcome.

Unfortunately, the government of President Kim Young Sam does not fully appreciate that support, and does not fully reciprocate it. 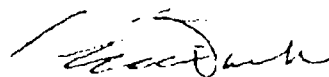

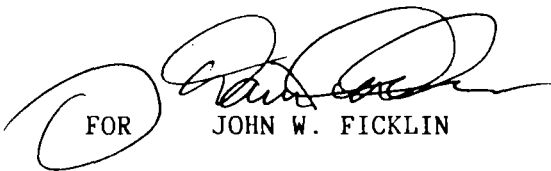

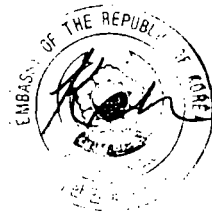
