ABOUT KOREA

Located at approximately the same latitude as northern California and southern Spain, the Korean Peninsula is comprised of almost 221,000 square kilometers. The northern end of the peninsula is the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (North Korea); the southern end, the Republic of Korea (South Korea) where our host city for the conference, Seoul, is located.

Geographically, the Korean Peninsula lies between East Asia and Japan with the West (Yellow) Sea, East Sea, and South Sea (Korea Strait) encircling the non-landlocked coasts of the country. Considered by many to be a cultural conduit between China and Japan, the Korean Peninsula is also highly regarded for its strategic military position and geopolitical significance. Some descriptions of the country claim that as much as 70 percent of South Korea is mountainous including five mountain ranges. Pre-Cambrian volcanic activity resulted in the development of hot and mineral springs which are popular locales for both visitors and natives.

CLIMATE*

Korea, and South Korea in particular, experience four seasons very similar to the Mid-Atlantic States in the U.S. or the United Kingdom. Coastal waters and the Asian continent also have an effect on the climate in the region; but for the most part, and in Seoul, particularly, the average temperature in May and June ranges from 18 to 22 Celsius (64 to 72 degrees Fahrenheit). At the time of our conference, Seoul should be experiencing weather in the low 70's.

AIR AND OTHER MEANS OF TRANSPORTATION; DEPARTURE TAX*

Kimpo International Airport is located 18 km west of downtown Seoul and boasts two international terminals and one domestic terminal. Over 600 international flights per week connect Seoul to cities in Asia, Australia, New Zealand, the Americas, Europe, the Near East, and North Africa. Domestic airlines include Korean Air and Asiana Airlines. These domestic airlines maintain websites at: <http://www.koreanair.com/main.htm> and <http://www.asiana.co.kr/easiana>, respectively.

Transportation to and from the airport is available by several means including taxi, bus, subway, and limousine. Taxi stands are located in front of each of the terminals at Kimpo with fares ranging from ₩1300 to ₩3000. Bus schedules are posted at the curb in front of each terminal and are oftentimes posted on the World Wide Web at the Airport Access Transportation System section of the Kimpo Airport web site (<http://www.kimpo-airport.co.kr/ENG/index.HTM>). Subway connection information is also available at this site for more adventurous individuals. Shuttle service from our host hotel is available from 7 a.m. every one and one-half hours; however, arrangements should be made in advance with the Concierge.

Please be prepared to pay a Passenger Service Charge in Korean Won when you leave the country. International passengers pay ₩9000 PSC, while domestic passengers pay a PSC of ₩3000.

Asia-Pacific is the world's most important center of international trade, management innovation, and technological development. As the importance of this region has increased, so have global geopolitical conflicts and competition among the countries. Threats of trade barriers, illegal transfers of technology, and corporate espionage indicate symptoms of continuing problems. The reality of EU, NAFTA, and WTO have additional implications for the current situation.

There are solutions to these problems.

Business educators, industry leaders, and government officials in the Pacific region, and the entire globe, have been attending the Pan-Pacific Conferences to find such solutions. Pan-Pacific Conference XV will be held in Korea. This conference is a result of enthusiastic participation in the previous conferences in Sydney, Australia; Singapore; Taipei, Taiwan; Hawaii; Calgary, Canada; Beijing, China; Bangkok, Thailand; Dunedin-Queenstown, New Zealand; Chiba, Japan; and Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia.

The conference will serve as an important forum for the exchange of ideas and information to promote understanding and cooperation among the Pacific countries. Special plenary sessions and panel sessions featuring top executives and government officials will be held to discuss trade issues, management innovations, and technology-transfer problems. Numerous paper sessions and workshops will be held. Plant tours are also planned.

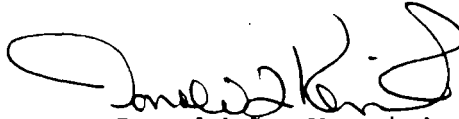
