A Consortium of American Private Voluntary Organizations to Advocate the Expedious Delivery of 500,000 tons of American Wheat Surplus this year to North Korea

Dear Dr. Berger,

We were very grateful to learn the initiative which President Clinton made in his July 18 radio address that the U.S. government will purchase 2.5 million tons of surplus American wheat to help American farmers, and donate them to a few nations including North Korea, Sudan, and Ethiopia which have all been suffering from the humanitarian crisis.

Yet, we were very troubled and disappointed to learn that hunger-stricken North Korea was omitted in the list of wheat beneficiaries announced on August 5 by Administrator Brian Atwood of the US Agency for International Development. In the light of the following recent findings, we urge your immediate support for expeditious delivery of 500,000 tons of American wheat surplus to North Korea with mutually agreeable transparent measures of monitoring wheat aid:

It is the right thing to do. The most catastrophic famine in human history should and can be stopped. "The food crisis in North Korea has killed about 300,000 to 800,000 people annually over the past three years," according to the bipartisan U.S. Congressional fact-finding mission in mid-August to North Korea. The U.S. Congressional mission's high-end estimate of 2.4 million deaths, representing about 10 percent of North Korea's population, proportionately approaches the Irish Potato Famine of 1846-50 which killed 11 percent of then its 8.5 million population, and surpassed the 1985 Ethiopian famine with 1 million famine victims. Even North Korea's soldiers and elite members are dying. How many more civilians can we expect to see dying this year? The bipartisan Congressional mission to North Korea witnessed, "sickly, emaciated children, some with stick-thin bodies." North Korean children are getting shorter and thinner due to years of malnutrition, potentially leaving an entire cohort of children physically ill and mentally retarded for the rest of their lives. Mark Kirk, the mission chief, said, "We found that the hospitals are really hospices." Andrew Natsios, former director of OFDA during the Bush administration and current Senior Fellow of the US Institute of Peace, was struck by "the absence of adults over age 50 on the streets of Pyongyang and in the countryside," in his trip even a year ago to North Korea. Allowing powerless civilians to famine death is inhuman, and unconscious policy. The U.S. administration and Congress should uphold the proud American humanitarian policy not linking political conditions to food aid.

It is the right time to expedite. Torrential rain, hail and tidal waves in July and August have again damaged 180,000 acres of arable land in North Korea, and destroyed 42,500 homes. July to September in North Korea also is the leanest period. We have learned that famine survivors in the past three years had consumed green maize and other premature grains before the fall crop, thus costing otherwise

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hundreds of thousand tons of grain that could be produced in the fall. This premature consumption of grains during the leanest months took place as North Koreans knew over time there would not be food by the winter or the following spring. The American decision and announcement NOW to provide wheat will help change North Koreans' coping mechanism and food policy. As they would be informed of the upcoming American wheat aid, North Koreans can prepare more proactive measures of protecting the fall crop and saving current survivors.

It is the right amount to send. North Korea's upcoming fall crop would produce far less than half of its 23 million people's grain needs according to the estimates of WFP, FAO, and international NGOs. The emergency operation resources prioritized by the World Food Programme on the July 10 report indicate that the shortfall of emergency aid to North Korea is 374,706 metric tons and accounts for 54% of the total amount of current shortfall, 690,286 metric tons. Such a shortfall is based on the WFP's programs to assist only one third of North Korea's 23 million population. The actual critical shortage amount for the total population is estimated to be about 1 million metric tons by this October. Even after having donated a very generous 1.5 million tons of the American wheat surplus to Indonesia, Washington still has 1 million tons to help the nine countries designated by WFP as "high" or "other" priority. American aid of 500,000 tons of wheat will meet about half of a North Korea shortfall while other nations are asked to fill in the remaining shortage.

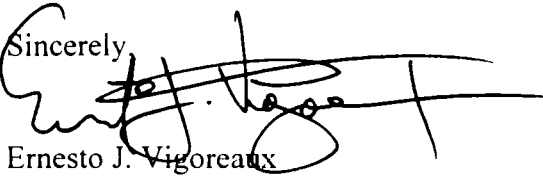
It is America's vital interests. Congressman Tony Hall, America's champion of hunger relief, noted, "Denying North Korea food will not hurt the military and political elites in that country; it will only hurt innocent civilians and our own national interests" in his early August letter to Secretary of State Madeline Albright and National Security Adviser Samuel Berger among others. Delaying famine aid in the tense geopolitical atmosphere of the Korean peninsula with 37,000 American soldiers is like throwing gas into a house in fire. The IMF-stricken South Korea, unfortunately looking after its own economic recovery with foreign aid, can not stand yet to provide mass aid to North Korea.

It develops the people-to-people engagement. Recently, North Korea has shown a new pattern of engagement with the international community by hosting the Geneva Roundtable to discuss agricultural rehabilitation measures and allowing a dozen international NGOs and over 100 international relief workers to stay in its country. None of these foreigners were allowed three years ago. The World Food Program's food monitors including three Korean-speaking monitors on the ground are verifying that donor food aid reaches the intended beneficiaries around five regional offices. WFP is allowed to access over 90 percent of the public distribution system and use helicopters for air lifting and monitoring. American PVOs have also independently verified that aid is reaching those in need. Food monitors reported that timely aid has been helping to ease political and military tension on the Korean peninsula because North Koreans are feeling at ease when they learned that American aid have been sent on a humanitarian ground.

It is President Clinton's public pledge to keep. We remind you of President Clinton's radio announcement on July 18 that the U.S. government is buying 2.5 million tons of surplus wheat to help American farmers, and will be donating the wheat to countries including Indonesia, Sudan, Ethiopia, Eritrea, and North Korea which all have been hit by humanitarian crises. Secretary of State Madeleine Albright said on July 31 that Washington has pledged to send 500,000 tons of wheat to Indonesia with another one million tons to be potentially allocated as well. Yet, Administrator Brian Atwood of US AID announced on August 5 the expanded list of 18 nations and regions to receive the U.S. wheat surplus excluding North Korea. We urge you to implement President Clinton's generous initiative, a right decision.

In partnership with the undersigned voluntary organization members of The American Council on Wheat for Reconciliation, we appeal to you to help continue the proud tradition of American humanitarian leadership by helping to expedite 500,000 tons of wheat to North Korea before the fall crop. Remember President Reagan's words, "A child knows no politics." To forget the children in the North Korean famine is to kill the 21st century for North Korea. To abandon the elderly in the Great Famine is to kill its history.

We would be very honored to work with you to overcome any obstacles you may see to send American wheat surplus to North Korean civilians, many of whom would succumb to death without the wheat aid. Many thanks.
