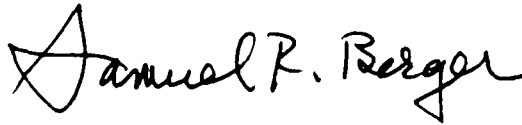

NATIONAL SECURITY ADVISOR - LIM DONG-WON

Lim Dong-won, KDJ's choice for the top Blue House foreign policy job, has had a stellar career as a military officer, diplomat, and senior ROKG bureaucrat. He was a key member in the South Korean team negotiating the 1992 basic agreement with North Korea. Over the past two years, Lim has been Secretary General of KDJ's Asia-Pacific Peace Foundation, i.e. the National Security Advisor to Kim Dae-jung. Lim is well and favorably known to generations of embassy and USG officials, and U.S.-based think-tanks.

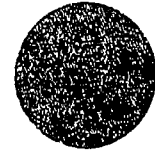

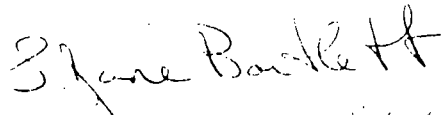

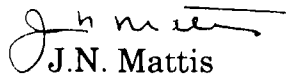
