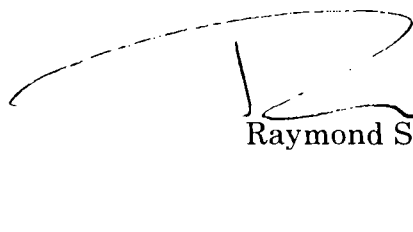
Dear Sandy:

Secretary Daley and South Korean Trade Minister Launch the U.S.-Korea Committee on Business Cooperation

Representatives of the public and private sectors of the United States and South Korea launched a new era through the inaugural meeting of the U.S.-Korea Committee on Business Cooperation on October 1 in Washington, D.C. This meeting, facilitated by the U.S. Department of Commerce and the South Korean Ministry of Trade, Industry, and Energy (MOTIE), laid a solid foundation for future expansion of commercial relations between the two countries.

South Korea is the United States' fifth largest export market and seventh largest trading partner overall, with two-way trade expected to total about \$50 billion this year. In 1995, recognizing the maturity of the U.S.-Korean commercial relationship, the Commerce Department and MOTIE signed a Memorandum of Understanding creating the U.S.-Korea Committee on Business Cooperation, or "CBC." The CBC is a joint government-business undertaking designed to enhance commercial cooperation between our two countries. The vision for the CBC was to go beyond some of the conflicts which tend to mark our government-to-government trade dialogue and seek areas of cooperation.

The CBC is structured to meet the needs of both sides. For the United States, this means developing ways to increase access for U.S. firms seeking to do business in Korean markets. For South Korea, this translates into the formation of joint ventures or technology agreements with high-tech

American firms. Both countries, in addition, view the CBC as a vehicle for developing their small- and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs).

U.S. Commerce Secretary William Daley and South Korean Trade Minister Lim, Chang Yuel, launched the October 1 meeting in an opening plenary session. "I'm very optimistic that the Committee on Business Cooperation will be a positive force in the U.S.-Korean relationship," stated Secretary Daley, "and that it will help lead us into a 21st century full of prosperity and opportunity for both of our nations." For the remainder of the day, the two Vice Chairs, Raymond Calamaro of Hogan & Hartson and Hwang, Doo Yun, of the Korea International Trade Association guided the bilateral discussions of the U.S.

and Korean private sector delegations. This 43-member business group was diverse in both size and sector represented. Among the 17 U.S. participants were familiar names such as Caterpillar, the Motion Picture Association of America, and the

American Automobile Manufacturers Association, as well as active and enthusiastic representatives of small- and medium-sized enterprises. Korea's 21-member delegation included Hyundai Motor Company, Korea Cottrell, LG Electrics,

and Star Communications.

Through this first meeting, a bilateral dialogue was initiated, through which members were able to air ideas, voice concerns, and collaborate on the development of industry-specific and project-oriented initiatives. This private sector committee tackled the task at hand with great intensity, striving for meaningful dialogue, productive exchanges, and concrete business relations.

Two Working Groups provided the committee with an approach to developing and fleshing out initiatives. First, the expansion of trade opportunities in specific industry sectors and through cooperative projects was the objective of the Business Development Working Group. Discussions were centered around the following sectors: the environment, telecommunications, filmed entertainment, electronic commerce, transportation, and automobiles. Among the many areas in which the U.S. and Korean participants agreed to cooperate was the exploration of a possible database information network system. The Korea-U.S. Business Network would provide efficient dissemination of information on business opportunities and trade and investment missions by unifying and working with the body of trade information that is already on the World Wide Web con-

cerning U.S.-Korea commerce.

The Business Facilitation Working Group focused on identifying impediments to trade and investment and determining avenues for cooperation across sectoral and industry lines. In talking through the various obstacles that firms on both sides have faced, opportunities for cooperation were uncovered. The discussion on government procurement led to the suggestion that U.S. and Korean firms form joint teams to perform projects in both countries. Another idea that surfaced was for matchmaking to occur between Korean suppliers and U.S. buyers in the retail distribution sector. Citing their country's exclusion from the U.S. Visa Waiver Pilot Program as a commercial impediment, the Korean delegation petitioned the U.S. members to cooperate with them in this area by supporting legislation that would grant this privilege to Korean business travelers.

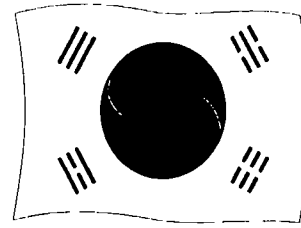
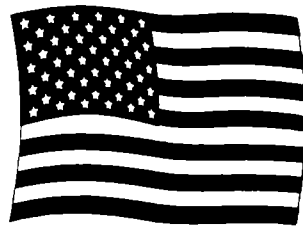
Several commitments were made by members of the U.S. and Korean pri-

vate sectors that will result in the development of work plans by December in these areas: the environment, telecommunications, filmed entertainment, electronic commerce, intellectual property, automobiles, government procurement, SME development, and the Korea-U.S. Business Network. These projects comprise the workload for CBC for 1998 and provide the foundation for the possible development of other working groups as the Committee matures.

At the end of the day, the private sector delegations presented their ambitious work program to Secretary Daley and Trade Minister Lim, who received it with optimism. Secretary Daley remarked: "Having worked with business development committees with several of our other trading partners, I've seen firsthand how these collaborations can move problems toward resolution, helping the private sectors of both countries identify and pursue opportunities that promise mutual benefits." Minister Lim added that he felt confident that the work plans contained the forward momentum necessary to achieve the progress envisioned by the CBC. The second meeting of the CBC will be held next year in Seoul at a mutually convenient date.

We encourage American companies to be a part of a forward-looking trade initiative. Get in on the ground floor and be a part of Korea's economic recovery and future growth.

The CBC is jointly chaired by Secretary of Commerce William Daley and the Korean Minister of Trade, Industry and Energy, Tae-Young Park. The private sector vice chairs are Raymond Calamaro, a partner in the law firm of Hogan & Hartson, and Doo-Yun Hwang, Senior Vice President of the Korean International Trade Association.

The Department of Commerce and the Ministry of Trade, Industry and Energy provide organizational support to the CBC, while the two countries' private sectors produce the cooperative efforts. The private sector members

advise the governments on ways in which our commercial relations can be expanded.

The CBC regularly brings together private sector and government representatives — now up to 40 private sector members — from both sides. Priorities for the U.S. members are gaining greater market access and building cooperation in areas that hold market potential for American companies. The Korean members mainly focus on forming joint ventures and technology agreements with high-technology American companies. Within this framework, the CBC, through a network of working groups and sector-specific subgroups, produces concrete measures to promote business and resolve trade issues.

Although the work of the CBC is useful to companies large and small, special emphasis is placed on assisting small and medium-sized U.S. and Korean companies to explore market potential.

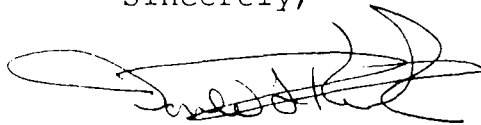

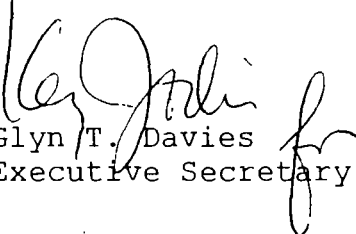
