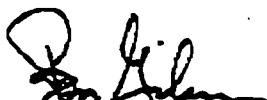
At the request of Speaker Hastert, we are conducting a review of the situation in North Korea and the threat it poses to the United States, our friends and allies. We will review both unclassified and classified material on topics covering the following developments in North Korea since 1993:

1. Nuclear weapons and civilian power
2. Other weapons of mass destruction, including chemical and biological weapons
3. No Dong, Taepo Dong, other long range missiles and their proliferation
4. KEDO program, including reports of diversion
5. Economic activity and food assistance, including reports of diversion, and
6. Human rights, including 9.27 prisons.

Given the large amount of material on these topics, we would limit our request to all relevant all-source analytic assessments from the last five years produced by the Intelligence Community, inclusive of, but not limited to, the National Intelligence Council, CIA, DIA, State/INR, DOE/Intelligence, and the Service intelligence centers.

We would ask that no material be transmitted above the level of Top Secret - SI/TK. Material should be transmitted to Mr. Curtis Banks in the International Relations Committee's Special Compartmented Intelligence Facility, located in the Rayburn House Office Building. Only cleared staff with the appropriate clearances will have access to this material. Given the urgency of our review, we would ask that these materials be transmitted to the committee in three weeks time.

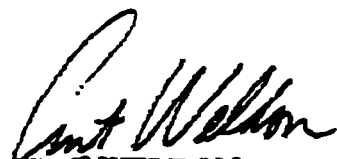

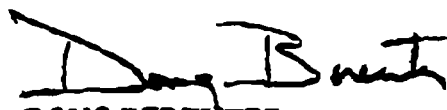

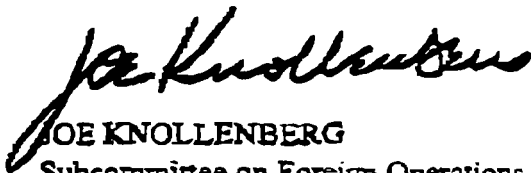

KEY LAWMAKERS JOIN TO REVIEW NORTH KOREA POLICY

WASHINGTON (August 23) - U.S. Rep. Benjamin A. Gilman (20th-NY), Chairman of the House International Relations Committee, announced today that the House Leadership has asked him to form a "North Korea Advisory Group" to report on the serious threat North Korea poses to the U.S. and its allies.

"It is gratifying that the Leadership has asked us to review the threat that the North Korean dictatorship poses to the United States and our friends and allies. Under the Leadership's direction, I will be working with eight other congressional members to prepare a report that will provide the Congress and the American people with a comprehensive picture of the North Korean problem," said Gilman.

The eight members who will be participating in this review are: the Chairman of the Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence, Rep. Porter Goss (FL); the Chairman of the Armed Services Committee, Rep. Floyd Spence (SC); the Chairman of the Subcommittee on Military Research and Development, Rep. Curt Weldon (PA); the Chairman of the Republican Policy Committee, Rep. Chris Cox (CA); the Vice Chair of the Republican Conference, Rep. Tillie Fowler (FL); the Chairman of the International Relations Committee's Subcommittee on Asia and the Pacific, Rep. Doug Bereuter (NE); the Chairman of the Appropriations Committee's Subcommittee, Rep. Sonny Callahan (AL); and a key member of that subcommittee, Rep. Joe Knollenberg (MI).

"I have joined with Chairman Goss to request the relevant information needed for our review from George Tenet, the Director of the Central Intelligence Agency," Gilman stated.

"We will initiate our review upon the return of the Congress in early September. With cooperation from the Administration, we look forward to completing our work quickly so that we can report our results expeditiously."

US-DPRK Press Statement
September 12, 1999, Berlin

US and DPRK delegations, headed by Ambassador Charles Kartman and Vice Minister Kim Gye Gwan, respectively, met in Berlin from 7- 12 September 1999 to discuss bilateral relations and other issues of mutual concern. The discussions, a continuation of high-level talks the two sides have held on a regular basis, took place in a constructive and businesslike atmosphere.

The two sides held productive discussions on pending issues, including the sanctions and missile issues. Each side came to a deeper understanding of the other's concerns and each acknowledged the need to continue taking steps that address these concerns.

The two sides agreed to continue these efforts and agreed that, in the interim, each would endeavor to preserve a positive atmosphere conducive to improved bilateral relations and to peace and security in Northeast Asia and the Asia-Pacific region.

SUGGESTED CONGRESSIONAL TALKING POINTS

re: Berlin talks, Perry Report, and Reprogramming

- I wanted to touch base to give you a sense of what will be happening over the next couple of weeks with respect to our North Korea policy.
 - The President intends to send to Congress ^{this} ~~next~~ week Dr. Perry's classified report to him on the results of his policy review. I recognize that members have been waiting for this report, and I wanted to convey my thanks to Congress personally for its patience in what has been a difficult and complicated process.
 - We have briefed members several times on the concepts Dr. Perry presented to the North Korean leadership this past May. Essentially, we will present North Korea with two alternative paths.
 - If North Korea is willing to address our concerns about its missile and nuclear activities, we would be prepared to take steps to improve bilateral relations. If the North rejects this path, however, we need to work with our allies, the ROK and Japan, to contain and protect ourselves from the North Korean threat.
 - The first step to determine whether the DPRK will choose the positive path is to engage North Korea in serious negotiations to address our full range of missile and nuclear concerns and for North Korea to forego additional missile tests until these negotiations can be successfully concluded.
 - Based on Ambassador Kartman's discussions with the North Koreans in Berlin this week, it is our understanding that the DPRK will refrain from testing any long-range missiles for the duration of our negotiations to improve relations.
 - On this basis, we will recommend to the President that he lift a number of economic sanctions against North Korea.
 - Lifting these sanctions will allow normal trade and investment with North Korea in non-strategic goods. Sanctions associated with North Korea's WMD program and exports and terrorist activities will remain in place.
 - Of course, if the North tests a missile, we will immediately reimpose these sanctions, and we have told that to the North Koreans.
 - Finally, we are recommending to the President that he notify Congress next week that he intends to use his authority to reprogram funds (\$18.1 m) for KEDO, which is needed to help KEDO complete this year's oil shipments to North Korea under the Agreed Framework.
 - Dr. Perry, Amb. Sherman, and Amb. Kartman will be available to brief you next week on the Perry Review, the outcome of the Berlin talks, consultations in Auckland, and reprogramming for KEDO.

- As I mentioned earlier, we are entering into a very delicate phase in our discussions with the North Koreans. Your efforts and those of your colleagues over the past few months have been critical to our efforts vis-à-vis the DPRK. I have very much appreciated it. Your support over the next few weeks will be even more essential. I know I can count on you.
