EMMY LOVES LUCCI

The Daytime Emmy Awards were announced today, and Susan Lucci -- Erica Kane on ABC's "All My Children" -- picked up her 18th Daytime Emmy Award nomination for best actress. (So far, she has never won.) In other categories, "The Oprah Winfrey Show" will compete for its fifth consecutive Emmy as best talk show. Other nominees are "Leeza," "Live with Regis and Kathie Lee," "The Rosie O'Donnell Show" and "The View." Oprah, Rosie, Kathie Lee and Regis, Leeza and the ensemble on "The View" -- Barbara Walters, Meredith Viera, Star Jones, Debbie Matenopolous and Joy Behar -- will compete for best talk show host. Jerry Springer, whose combative talk show has been soaring in the ratings lately, was snubbed in the talk show category. The awards will be given out May 15 in a ceremony telecast on NBC.

LLOYD BRIDGES, 1913-1998

Lloyd Bridges, whose acting career spanned five decades and encompassed TV's "Sea Hunt" and the "Airplane!" and "Hot Shots" movie satires, died Tuesday at his Holmby Hills, CA, home, with his family at his bedside, said his son, actor Beau Bridges. He was 85 and had been married to the former Dorothy Simpson for nearly 60 years. Besides Beau, they had another actor son, Jeff, and a daughter, Lucinda. Trained as a classical actor, Lloyd Bridges played Gary Cooper's vengeful deputy in "High Noon" (1952). Other important roles followed until, at the height of McCarthyism in the 1950s, his name was added to the movie-industry blacklist. Bridges cleared his name with the FBI and was allowed to work again. In 1957, he took the role that changed his career: Mike Nelson, a Navy frogman turned undersea investigator, in "Sea Hunt." The networks turned down the series as being too limited in scope, so producer Ivan Tors offered it in syndication a year later. Soon it drew bigger ratings than the network shows and lasted for 156 episodes.

BUDDY'S MANHOOD: QUE SERA SERA

The First Pooch is about to get fixed, and animal rights activist -- and movie legend -- Doris Day had a hand in it. Day heads an animal welfare group that urged President Clinton to set an example for other pet owners by having Buddy neutered. (White House doctor E. Connie Mariano did not say when the operation would be performed.) A representative of the Doris Day Animal Welfare League, which promotes neutering of pets to help fight overpopulation and the killing of unwanted animals in shelters and animal pounds, said the actress was thrilled by the news.

THE BOSS: SHOW TUNES?

Bruce Springsteen will perform from an unlikely source, the Rodgers and Hammerstein songbook, at an April 4 theater benefit in New York's posh Hamptons resort area, reports the New York Observer. When the Bay Street Theater in Sag Harbor dedicates its stage to Elaine Steinbeck, widow of the great American author John Steinbeck, Springsteen will sing to her -- hopefully, says the Observer, a song from "Oklahoma!," because Steinbeck once stage managed the Broadway production of the landmark musical. She and Springsteen are said to have developed a friendship while he was assembling his "The Ghost of Tom Joad," inspired by John Steinbeck's "The Grapes of Wrath."

JFK JR. GETS PRESIDENTIAL

John Kennedy Jr. has assumed a new position at his political magazine George: president. That's in addition to his existing titles of editor in chief and co-owner. "This doesn't mean he will go out on sales calls," David J. Pecker, CEO of Hachette Filipacci (the magazine's parent company), told The New York Times. "But he will determine the editorial mission of the magazine." While some critics find the publication soft and unfocused, George claimed a circulation of nearly 425,000 last year, says The Times.

DICK CLARK KEEPS SPINNING

Music and TV veteran Dick Clark has formed a joint-venture record label called American Bandstand Music, which will offer reissue and compilation records encompassing nearly half a century of rock music, reports Variety. The BMG-distributed label will have access to rare and exclusive audio and video footage from the long-running TV series. The launch will mark the first time the American Bandstand logo and trademark will be used on records sold in stores. Clark's joint-venture partner is Wind-up Entertainment, which is best known for developing the modern rock band

Creed.

JACKSON STILL AMUSED

Michael Jackson is pressing on with his plans for a \$500 million amusement park at an old military airport in Warsaw, Poland, even though a commission rejected the location. Jackson may go to Poland this month -- two months earlier than planned -- to discuss the park, but his move shouldn't be interpreted as a last-ditch effort to save the project, said Jacques Tourel, the singer's Warsaw representative. "Michael wants to come to Poland in March because of his personal schedule only," Tourel said Tuesday, adding that the singer planned to be in Europe anyway.

HEF, STEINEM SHARE KUDOS

Strange bedfellows they may be, but Playboy magazine founder Hugh Hefner and Ms. magazine founder Gloria Steinem will both be inducted April 29 into the American Society of Magazine Editors' Hall of Fame. "It's kind of delicious more than ironic," Hef, 71, told the New York Post about sharing the honor with the feminist (who in the past has been an outspoken opponent of Hefner's publication and its principles). "It suggests we've come a long way."

ALBANIA IS SAFE

Albania's prime minister hasn't seen the satirical film "Wag the Dog," but he says he isn't afraid of life imitating art.

In the movie, a U.S. president enlists the help of a filmmaker (Dustin Hoffman) and public-relations expert (Robert De Niro) to stage a make-believe military assault on Albania to distract public attention from a presidential sex scandal. Prime Minister Fatos Nano, on a three-day visit to Israel, told Reuters he wasn't offended by the movie's choice of Albania as an obscure target for a fake U.S. attack. "Since the beginning of the century we have had a close partnership with the U.S.," he said, "and probably the people there chose this national reference because [the filmmakers know] it will never happen."

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SPLIT: Paula Abdul and her husband of 17 months, sportswear manufacturer Brad Beckerman, a spokeswoman for the Grammy Award-winning singer said. Divorced from actor Emilio Estevez in 1994, Abdul, 35, met Beckerman on a blind date arranged by friends and married him in October 1996. It was the first marriage for Beckerman, 31.

SUED: Mike Tyson, by Sherry Cole, 30, and Chevelle Butts, 30, who allege that the former heavyweight champ became abusive during breakfast at a Georgetown bistro March 1 after a night out. They are asking for \$22.5 million. Tyson's lawyer, John Branca, said the boxer is considering a counter suit.

Locked in a controversy with the magazine's owners over running unauthorized photos of "Titanic" star Leonardo DiCaprio, the editor-in-chief of Playgirl says she has resigned. "It goes against my ethics," Ceslie Armstrong told the New York Post about running the pictures. "It's an invasion of privacy. I can't be associated with it." The Post quoted execs at the male nudie magazine as saying Armstrong had not quit but had been fired. They gave no reason and did not confirm Playgirl would publish pictures of DiCaprio. Armstrong said they are due to be run in the July issue, reports the Post. Publicist Cindy Guagenti, who reps both DiCaprio and Pitt, said Leonardo is consulting his attorneys about this new matter.

Cement producer Southdown Inc., signed a definitive agreement to acquire industry rival Medusa Corp. for \$1 billion in stock.

Southdown said Medusa shareholders will receive 0.88 of Southdown shares for each Medusa share held, which values Medusa at \$61.22 a share. Southdown said the offer is a 17% premium. Southdown expects the transaction will add to earnings, excluding one-time costs from the acquisition. The combined company will have a market capitalization of about \$2.7 billion. The transaction is proposed as tax-free pooling of interests, Southdown said. (Dow Jones)

*** Lockheed, Northrop offer gets rejected

U.S. regulators have rejected an offer by aerospace firms Lockheed Martin Corp. and Northrop Grumman Corp. to sell businesses with as much as \$1 billion in sales in exchange for approval of their merger proposal, the Wall Street Journal reported. Defense and Justice Department officials told the companies they would need to divest even more, with sales amounting to as much as \$4 billion, in order to win federal antitrust approvals, the Journal said, citing unnamed sources. But company officials fear such a huge divestment would drain most of the benefits from the merger, the Journal said. They worry regulators want simply to block the deal altogether. The sale will result in the transfer of all of the shares of Dow Jones Markets to Bridge. Dow Jones Markets will be renamed Bridge Telerate. Bridge will become a non-exclusive distributor of Dow Jones Newswires around the world. At the time of closing, Dow Jones expects to take a significant charge against earnings, reflecting severance and other transition costs, and a write-down of the value of Dow Jones Markets. The amount of the

charge has not yet been determined.

*** U.S. labor markets stretched, growth vigorous - Fed

The economy is growing so vigorously that tightly stretched labor markets are generating substantial wage demands and hampering production in much of the country, the Federal Reserve said Wednesday. "With labor markets stretched to the limit in many areas, there have been reports of rather large wage increases," the Fed's Beige Book summary of regional economic activity said, painting a picture of an economy in which strong domestic demand offsets the drag from Asia's simmering economic crisis. The Fed said most districts were experiencing reduced exports to Asian markets. But in contrast to the last summary, which was released Jan. 21 and which said that Asian turmoil was hurting U.S. manufacturing, the latest report said "industrial activity is on the rise in most parts of the country, with orders and production up." *** Asian stocks close mixed; Japan's Nikkei, Yen tumble

Equities closed mixed in the major Asian-Pacific bourses on Wednesday. Tokyo stocks plunged as the yen also fell sharply, driven by fears that the Japanese government's new economic-stimulus package will not contain significant tax cuts. The Nikkei 225 average fell 377.52, or 2.22%, to 16619.68. The dollar surged after Japanese newspaper Mainichi Shimbun quoted Taku Yamasaki, head of the ruling Liberal Democratic Party's Policy Affairs Research Council, as saying he didn't think the package would include an income-tax cut.

Meanwhile, Hong Kong's blue-chip Hang Seng Index fell 1.2%, dragged down by profit-taking in HSBC Holdings. Earlier this week, HSBC posted gains on rumors it might link up with J.P. Morgan & Co. Shares in China closed mixed. Elsewhere, Australian shares edged higher but ended well below earlier levels. Weakness in other regional markets - Tokyo and Hong Kong in particular - damped buying interest in Sydney.

*** European stock prices slip after small drop in the U.S.

Share prices lost ground across Europe on Wednesday, depressed by a weak start to trading on Wall Street. Belgian shares inched lower as investors focused on banking stocks. Swiss, French, Dutch and Swedish stocks slipped as investors locked in profits following an early slide in the U.S. market. But investors in Britain were cheered by the government's new budget and Italian stocks surged to a new high on the back of sharp gains for energy giant ENI and Telecom Italia. Profit-taking sank South African industrial shares, while gold stocks tumbled more than 5% after rumors of persistent sales from the stockpiles of Belgium's central National Bank were confirmed. *** GM counting on Astra in Europe

Profit is down to \$313 million in 1997, just one-fifth of what GM was earning in the late 1980s. Market share has dropped to just under 12% through February. Still, GM officials vow a 1998 turnaround in Europe, and they are pinning their hopes on the latest version of compact Opel Astra, arriving in showrooms this week. (USA Today)

*** Indonesia in talks with IMF team

Indonesia and the International Monetary Fund have opened a new round of talks to try to get a \$43 billion economic bailout plan back on track. The IMF suspended the \$43 billion loan package, saying President Suharto was not moving fast enough on promises to overhaul Indonesia's economy. But Indonesian officials say the reforms, which would slash subsidies on food and fuel, ignore the plight of the poor and the danger of social unrest. (USA Today)

*** Bayer cancels \$1.5 bln Taiwan plant

Chemical conglomerate Bayer has dropped a \$1.5 billion project to build a plant in central Taiwan and says it will build the facility in Texas instead. The plant will produce toluene diisocyanate, or TDI, a polyurethane component used in elastic fibers and coatings. Bayer has been negotiating for four years to proceed with the project which has triggered violent protests by opponents and proposals to put it to a public vote. Residents said it was an environmental risk. (USA Today)

*** Bank accepts local bid for Oilers

(AP) - The bank handling the sale of the Edmonton Oilers has accepted a \$70 million bid from the group of local investors to buy the NHL

club. The Alberta Treasury Branches confirmed Wednesday that the Edmonton bid to buy the Oilers, which was submitted last Friday just hours before the deadline, was satisfactory. If the bid from the 17-member local group had been rejected, Texan Les Alexander's offer would have gone through. Alexander had said he would move the team to the United States. Alexander's offer has been terminated, the bank said, and his \$5 million deposit will be refunded. However, Alexander can reactivate his offer if the conditions of the sale outlined in the Edmonton Investors Group Ltd. offer are not met by April 27, when approval from the NHL Board of Governors and final agreements must be granted. The remaining \$65 million to close the deal must be paid in full by May 5.

*** Libel trial of former NFL quarterback Kelly begins

(AP) - Former Buffalo Bills quarterback Jim Kelly damaged the career of "one of the real Jerry Maguires" when he wrote in his book that a sports agent mishandled his money, according to the agent's lawyer. Kelly's libel trial began Tuesday in U.S. District Court in New Hampshire with A.J. Faigin's lawyer saying Kelly knew when he wrote his book, "Armed and Dangerous," that the claim was false. Faigin is suing Kelly, saying he lost more than \$1 million in business because of the book. Faigin's lawyer, Alan Mandel, compared his client to the fictional Maguire character during his opening, saying Faigin was an ethical agent. Mandel said Kelly defamed Faigin in his book, making it harder for him to compete with people who don't hesitate to cheat. Kelly's lawyer, Steve Gordon, said Kelly's statements are not

libelous because Kelly believed what he wrote and Faigin knew that his agency, Lustig Pro Sports, was mismanaging Kelly's money.

*** Bucs' Sapp nears contract extension

(AP) - Tampa Bay's Warren Sapp is on the verge of becoming one of the NFL's highest-paid defensive players with a contract extension that could include a signing bonus of \$8 to \$10 million. The team scheduled an afternoon news conference Wednesday amid reports an agreement was imminent. The Bucs, who have about \$11.3 million remaining under the salary cap, had a self-imposed deadline of this week to reach a deal with the Pro Bowl tackle or let him play the final season of a four-year contract for the \$1.1 million he was scheduled to earn in 1998. Sapp, who would become a free agent next season, emerged as one of the NFL's top defensive linemen last season. He had 10 1/2 sacks during the regular season, then added three more during a playoff loss to Green Bay in helping the Bucs compile their best record (11-7) since 1979.

*** Fortin signs 2-year deal with Chargers

(AP) - Former Atlanta Falcons center Roman Fortin, the fourth free agent brought in to help shore up one of the NFL's worst offenses, has signed a two-year contract with the San Diego Chargers. The deal struck Tuesday is loaded with incentives and could be worth between \$2.2 million and \$2.8 million if Fortin starts. Fortin, an eight-year NFL veteran, joins fellow linemen John Jackson and Aaron Taylor and

running back Natrone Means as free agent additions. Fortin started the first three games of 1997, got hurt and then spent the rest of the season on the inactive list. He felt he fell out of favor with Dan Reeves' coaching staff and was waived on Feb. 11. From 1994-96, Fortin started 47 of 48 regular-season games at center. In 1993, he played the five line positions, plus tight end and blocking fullback in short-yardage situations. He played his first two seasons in Detroit.

*** Brazil unearths one of world's oldest dinosaurs

Paleontologists in southern Brazil said Wednesday they had discovered three bones from one of the world's oldest dinosaurs dating back some 200 million years. "The bones belong to a dinosaur in the prosauropod suborder which lived in the Triassic age, making it one of the oldest existing specimens registered in the world," said Max Langer, a paleontologist at the Catholic University in Rio Grande do Sul state. The dinosaur was a plant-eating, lizard-like animal about the size of a large dog, he said. See

Robert Downey Jr. is making progress in drug rehabilitation, but his probationary restrictions will not be relaxed because of past violations, a judge in Malibu has decided. A former White House intern has been charged with harassing former senior Presidential adviser George Stephanopoulos, showing up at his home and his workplace and sending him letters. Tangela Burkhart, 30, of Manhattan, was arraigned July 3 on harassment charges, according to a criminal complaint recently made public, reports the Associated Press. Between Jan. 22 and July 2, Burkhart allegedly followed Stephanopoulos around New York, showing up at Columbia University, where he is a visiting professor of political science, and at his home, prosecutors said. Burkhart also allegedly went to a coffee shop and a deli Stephanopoulos frequented, followed him to other cities and to private meetings and sent him one or two letters a week. Stephanopoulos has been granted an order of protection requiring Burkhart to have no contact with him.

'RYAN' STILL BLUE-RIBBON WINNER

It was a big movie weekend. Box-office estimates show the top three movies brought in more than \$16 million each in ticket sales. But despite the competition from a pair of openers, Steven Spielberg's "Saving Private Ryan" retained its top spot on the chart for the third straight week. But after the story was picked up by the national media, Whitaker withdrew his offer. "Everybody bought it," said Whitaker.
