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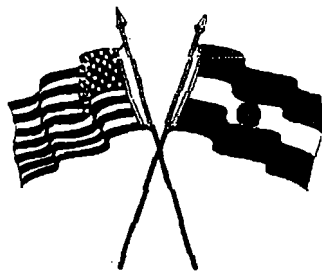

USEA and CII Host Indo-US Business Dialogue on Clean Energy

Washington, D.C. — On Friday, September 15, 2000, the United States Energy Association (USEA) and the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) will host the "Indo-US Business Dialogue on Clean Energy." Several US and Indian business leaders will be in attendance, including executives from GVK Industries Ltd., SRF Ltd., RPG Enterprises Ltd., BSES Ltd., Thiru Arooran Sugars Ltd., Ambuja Cements, GE Power Systems, Foster Wheeler Energy International Inc, and Global Solar Energy, and many other energy companies.

The Dialogue will be held in the East Room at The Mayflower Hotel, 1127 Connecticut Ave., NW in Washington, DC. The dialogue will begin at 2:15 p.m. and end at 4:30 p.m., followed by a Reception until 6:00 p.m.

USEA and CII entered into a partnership in March of 2000 with the objectives of enhancing private sector partnerships between US and Indian firms and supporting the creation of policies in both countries that promote commercially viable clean energy and environmental development in India. USEA and CII created a working group comprised of industry leaders in both the United States and India to formulate effective strategies for these goals. Topics of discussion will include opportunities for clean coal, gas, and renewable energy and efficiency projects, as well as lessons learned from developing and financing energy projects. The Dialogue will serve as the first major gathering for the working group since the inception of the CII-USEA partnership.

CII is an association comprising over 4,000 member companies in India from the private and public sectors, including over 100 U.S. companies. USEA represents over 150 public and private energy-related organizations, companies, and government agencies in the US. The dialogue is being co-sponsored by the U.S. Agency for International Development, the U.S. Department of Energy, the U.S. Department of State, the U.S. Department of Commerce, U.S.-Asia Environmental Partnership, the Business Council for Sustainable Energy, The Louis Berger Group, Inc., and the U.S. Hydropower Council for International Development.

Dear Gene,

It now appears that in regard to co-operation in the area of Power, the agenda would comprise of the following :-

- i) MOU between Ministry of Power, Government of India and US Department of Energy for setting up of a sub-Ministerial Working Group to carry forward the bilaterals.
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- iii) Four Joint Development Agreements between Indian and US developers in respect of the power projects, namely, (a) Srinagar HEP, UP (330 MW) (b) Hirna TPP, Orissa (6,660 MW) (c) Tanir Bavi Barge Mounted CCPP, Karnataka (200 MW) and (d) Ennore LNG Project, Tamil Nadu (1884.645 MW).

These when signed would represent some tangible progress in enhancing co-operation in the economic sphere. It would also to some extent help in dissipating impressions that India is not a good place to do business!. We, in our side would be keen that the signatures be witnessed by the President and the Prime Minister because it would be desirable for them to be associated with these successes. I think the idea of signing them more quietly as part of the Commercial Alliance Dialogue

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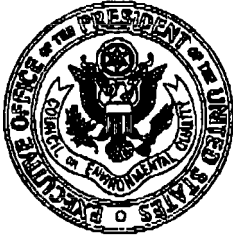
