

**Biennial Report to Congress
on the
Emergency Immigrant Education Program**

United States Department of Education

JUNE 15, 1999

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I. INTRODUCTION

The Emergency Immigrant Education Act of 1984 was enacted by Congress in response to the financial challenges facing school districts with large numbers of recent immigrant students. Although immigrant students comprise only 5 percent of the overall school-age population, their concentration in certain school districts represents a significant burden for those local communities. Through the Emergency Immigrant Education Program (EIEP), Congress reimburses school districts for part of the cost of educating these children.

Congress enacted amendments to the EIEP in 1988 and reauthorized the program in 1994 as Part C of Title VII of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (Appendix A). The secretary of Education is required under Section 7308(b) to submit a Report to Congress every two years on the status of the program.

In order to meet this requirement, every local educational agency (LEA) receiving funding must report enrollment and expenditure data for each program year to its state educational agency (SEA). The SEA then consolidates these data and submits one report on behalf of the state to the Office of Bilingual Education and Minority Languages Affairs (OBEMLA) of the U.S. Department of Education (see Appendix B).

The following report to Congress provides information on the EIEP, participants, grant allocations, expenditures and services for the school years 1994-1995 and 1995-1996. Information comes from the state reports of 38 states and two territories in the 1994-1995 school year and from the state reports of 38 states and three territories in the 1995-1996 school year¹.

¹ American Samoa and Guam receive EIEP funds as part of their consolidated grant for insular areas. They are not required to submit a separate report under the EIEP. Thus, the total number of state reports submitted in 1994-1995 and 1995-1996 does not reflect total number of EIEP grantees.

II. BACKGROUND

According to U.S. Department of Education biennial reports on the EIEP, the number of immigrant children served by the program has more than doubled since 1984. In a 1994 report on the education of children in poverty, the GAO reported that immigrant children make up about 5 percent of the country's school-age population (ages 5-17)². As a result, the provision of services for immigrant students, many of whom have limited English proficiency, is a significant concern for some SEAs and LEAs. Fluctuations in the number of immigrants arriving each year can make it more difficult to plan and provide services. The EIEP provides financial support to LEAs with concentrations of recent immigrant students in order to help serve this population.

A. Overview of the EIEP

The U.S. Department of Education is authorized to award and monitor grants to eligible SEAs. Funds are then distributed to eligible LEAs to pay for enhanced instructional opportunities for immigrant children and youth, as well as for materials, supplies, and the staff training needed to serve this population. Section 7307 describes the services for which LEAs may use their program funds:

"(a) Use of Funds.—Funds awarded under this part shall be used to pay for enhanced instructional opportunities for immigrant children and youth, which may include—

"(1) family literacy, parent outreach, and training activities designed to assist parents to become active participants in the education of their children;

"(2) salaries of personnel, including teacher aides who have been specifically trained, or are being trained, to provide services to immigrant children and youth;

"(3) tutorials, mentoring, and academic or career counseling for immigrant children and youth;

"(4) identification and acquisition of curricular materials, educational software, and technologies to be used in the program;

"(5) basic instructional services which are directly attributable to the presence in the school district of immigrant children, including the costs of providing additional classroom supplies, overhead costs, costs of construction, acquisition or rental of space, costs of transportation, or such other costs as are directly attributable to such additional basic instructional services; and

"(6) such other activities, related to the purposes of this part, as the Secretary may authorize.

Based on the law, the formula for funding eligibility is determined by the number of immigrant children and youth currently enrolled in a school district who were not born in the United States and who have been attending school in the United States for fewer than three complete academic years. In order to have its immigrant children and youth included in the state count, a school district must have either a minimum of 500 eligible immigrant students, or eligible immigrant students must comprise 3 percent or more of its total student population. The total number of immigrant children and youth in each state's school districts that can be included in this count determines the amount of each state's EIEP grant. The intent underlying these criteria is to provide assistance where these students are concentrated.

During the 1994 reauthorization of the EIEP, a new provision was included in Section 7304(e) of the ESEA. This section provides that if the amount appropriated for the program in a given fiscal year is more than \$50,000,000, an SEA may reserve not more than 20 percent of its grant to make grant awards on a competitive basis within the state. However, Congress provided additional flexibility to states in the 1996 Labor, Health and Human Services and Education Appropriations Act, which allowed SEAs to use all or any part of their EIEP allocation for making competitive grants to their LEAs. Since 1996, every annual Appropriations Act has included this provision.

In FY 1996, none of the SEAs exercised this option. However, in FY 1997 and FY 1998, a few states conducted competitive grant programs with a portion of their EIEP allocations.

B. Administration of the EIEP

Management and administration of the EIEP are the responsibility of OBEMLA. Duties of the program officer responsible for the EIEP include processing and reviewing grant application materials for SEAs interested in applying for funding. EIEP funds are distributed based on the ratio of eligible immigrant students within each SEA to the total number of eligible immigrant students in the United States. After the EIEP grant awards are made, the OBEMLA program officer is responsible for reviewing the biennial reports required from each SEA under Section 7308(a) of the legislation.

III. EIEP PARTICIPANTS

According to a 1991 report on the EIEP by the GAO, there were about 700,000 eligible immigrant children in over 4,500 school districts during the 1989-90 school year.³ The GAO study, based on a survey of 529 school districts that received EIEP funds during 1989-90 and a representative sample of 995 districts that did not receive EIEP funds, estimated that about 85 percent (564,000) of the identified eligible immigrant students were receiving EIEP funded services. The other 15 percent were either in school districts with too few students to qualify (90 percent of non-funded districts) or in districts electing not to apply for an EIEP grant (10 percent of non-funded districts). School district officials, according to the report, did not request EIEP funds because they were not aware of the program, or did not realize that they were eligible for funding, or did not have sufficient resources to identify immigrant children.

A. *EIEP Participants by State*

The information in tables 1 and 2 shows the total percentage of immigrant students served by each state during the 1994-1995 and 1995-1996 school years, as compiled from SEA reports. For the 1994-1995 school year, 38 states and 2 territories reported that they served 773,976 immigrant students.⁴ Thirty-eight states and 3 territories provided services to 823,149 immigrant students in the 1995-1996 school year, an increase of 6 percent.

Since 1990, five states--California, Florida, Illinois, New York, and Texas--have accounted for roughly 75 percent of total EIEP participants. During the 1994-1995 and 1995-1996 reporting periods, this was also the case.⁵

B. EIEP Participants by National Origin

Students from over 200 countries participated in the EIEP in 1994-1995 and 1995-1996 school years. The top 10 countries of origin for students served are shown in table 2. In each program year, these countries accounted for over two-thirds of all EIEP participants, with the largest proportion of students coming from Mexico.

Approximately 50 percent of the EIEP students represented in the above chart are from the following Spanish-speaking countries:

- Mexico
- The Dominican Republic
- El Salvador

Between the 1994-1995 and 1995-1996 school years, the composition of the top 10 countries changed. Poland and Jamaica replaced Guatemala and India in the latter school year.

A detailed breakdown of this information by country of origin can be found in Appendix C. Appendix D contains a detailed breakdown by state and country of origin.

IV. EIEP APPROPRIATIONS, 1984-1996

Table 3 enumerates the funds Congress has appropriated for the EIEP since its inception in 1984. Between 1984 and 1993 the funds remained constant at approximately \$30 million. However, the number of students served over this period doubled. As a result of this increase in enrollment, per student allocation was more than cut in half (\$86 to \$36). For the latest two reporting periods, appropriations increased dramatically to \$38.9 million (1994-1995) and \$50 million (1995-1996), resulting in a much higher allocation of funds per student (\$50 to \$61). Refer to Figures A-C for graphical presentation of data in Table 3.

EIEP Appropriations, 1984-1996

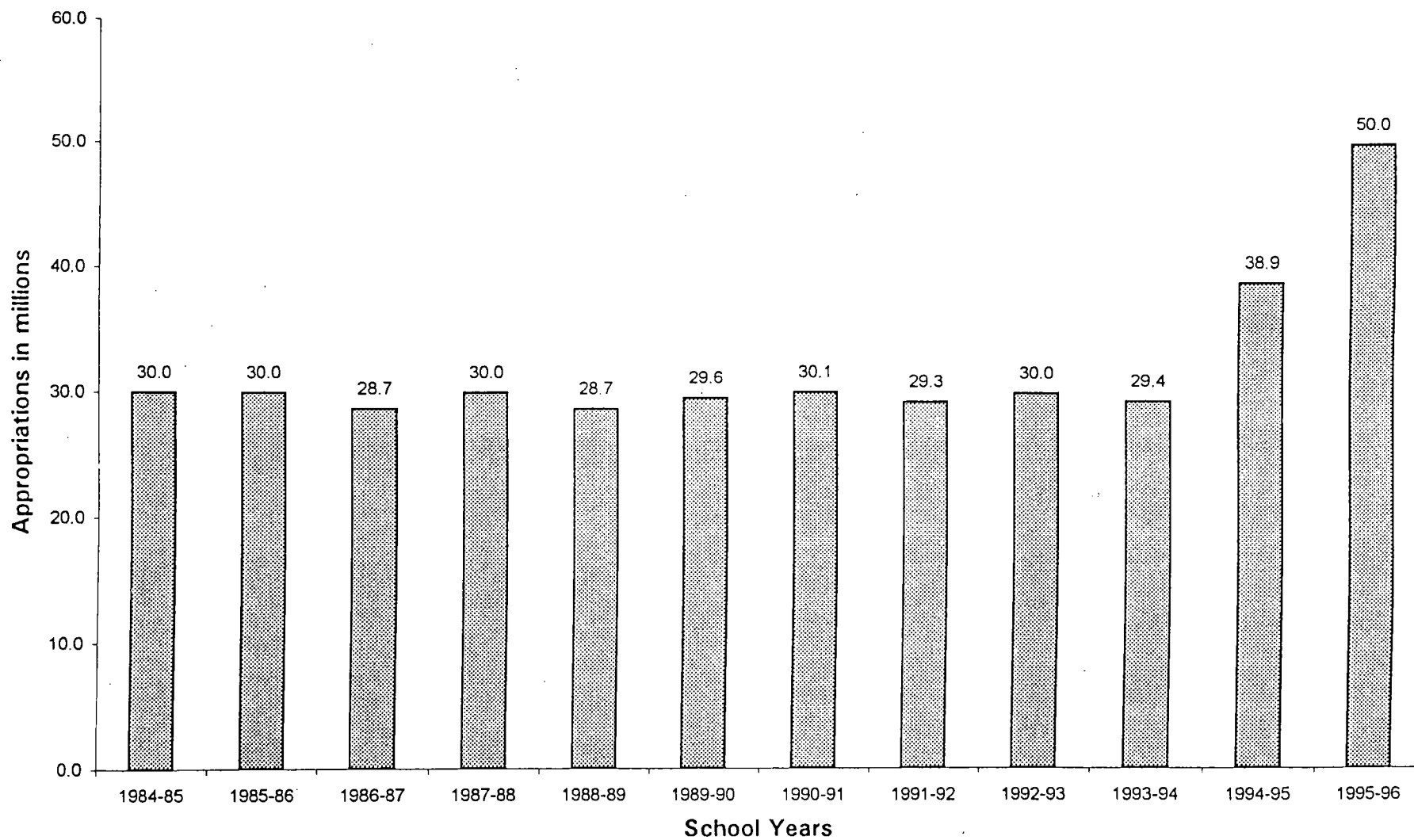

Number of Students Served by the EIEP, 1984-1996

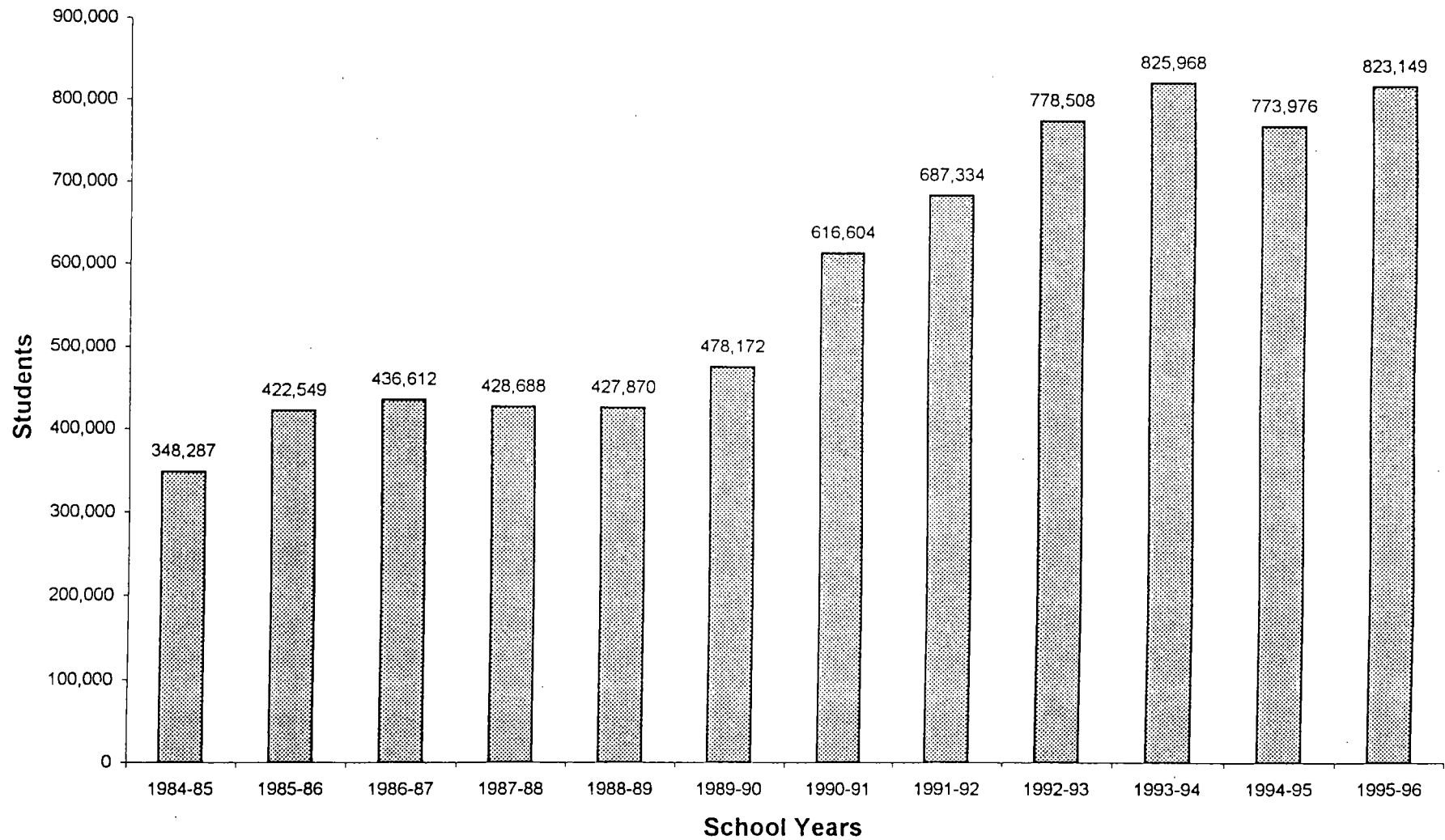
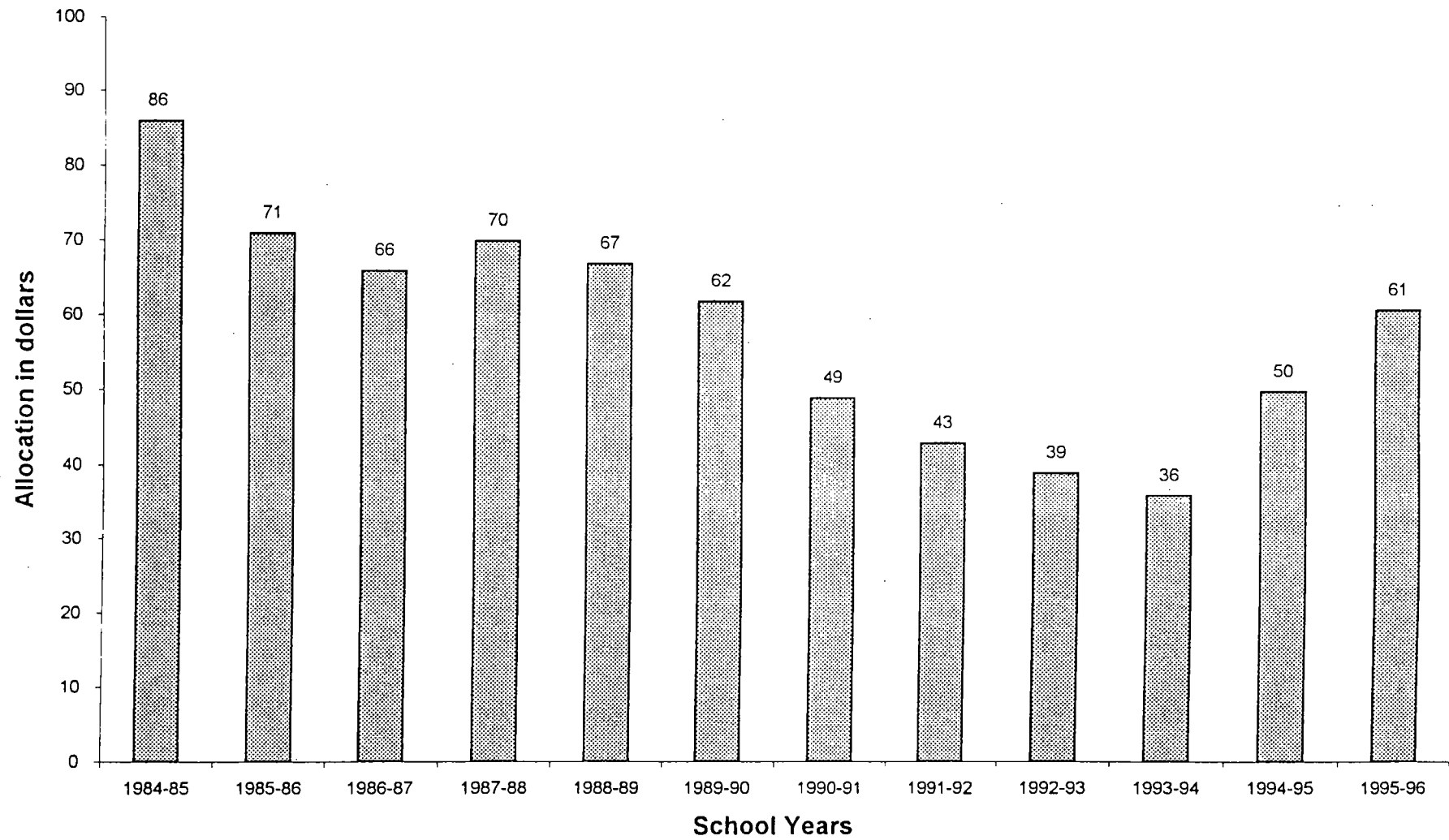

EIEP EXPENDITURES

A. Fiscal Year 1994-1995

According to SEA reporting, total EIEP expenditures by 38 states and two territories amounted to \$39,071,144.72.⁶ These funds were used in the following four subcategories:

- Enhanced Instructional Services comprised 79.8 percent (\$31,162,120.25);
- Basic Instructional Services comprised 17.2 percent (\$6,738,151.11);
- Administrative Costs comprised 1.2 percent (\$465,324.60); and
- Other Costs comprised 1.8 percent (\$705,548.76).

Table 4 presents a numerical breakdown of these categories, and figure D depicts a graphical representation of the same data.

Five states--California, Florida, Illinois, New York, and Texas--accounted for 75 percent of total expenditures, as illustrated by table 5. Appendix E presents a detailed breakdown of this information by state and category.

B. Fiscal Year 1995-1996

Total EIEP expenditures by 38 states and three territories amounted to \$47,609,422.05.⁷ The reported number of EIEP immigrant students served rose during this period by 49,173, an increase of 6.3 percent from the previous reporting period. Funds were used in the same four subcategories used in 1994-1995:

- Enhanced Instructional Services comprised 80.1 percent (\$38,155,238.62);
- Basic Instructional Services comprised 16.1 percent (\$7,644,609.12);
- Administrative Costs comprised 1.2 percent (\$594,828.97); and
- Other Costs comprised 2.6 percent (\$1,214,745.34).

Table 4 presents a numerical breakdown of these categories, and figure E depicts a graphical representation of the same data.

Similar to 1994-1995, five states--California, Florida, Illinois, New York and Texas--accounted for 73 percent of total expenditures, as illustrated in table 5. Appendix E presents a detailed breakdown of this information by state and category.

EIEP Expenditures, by Category, 1994-1995

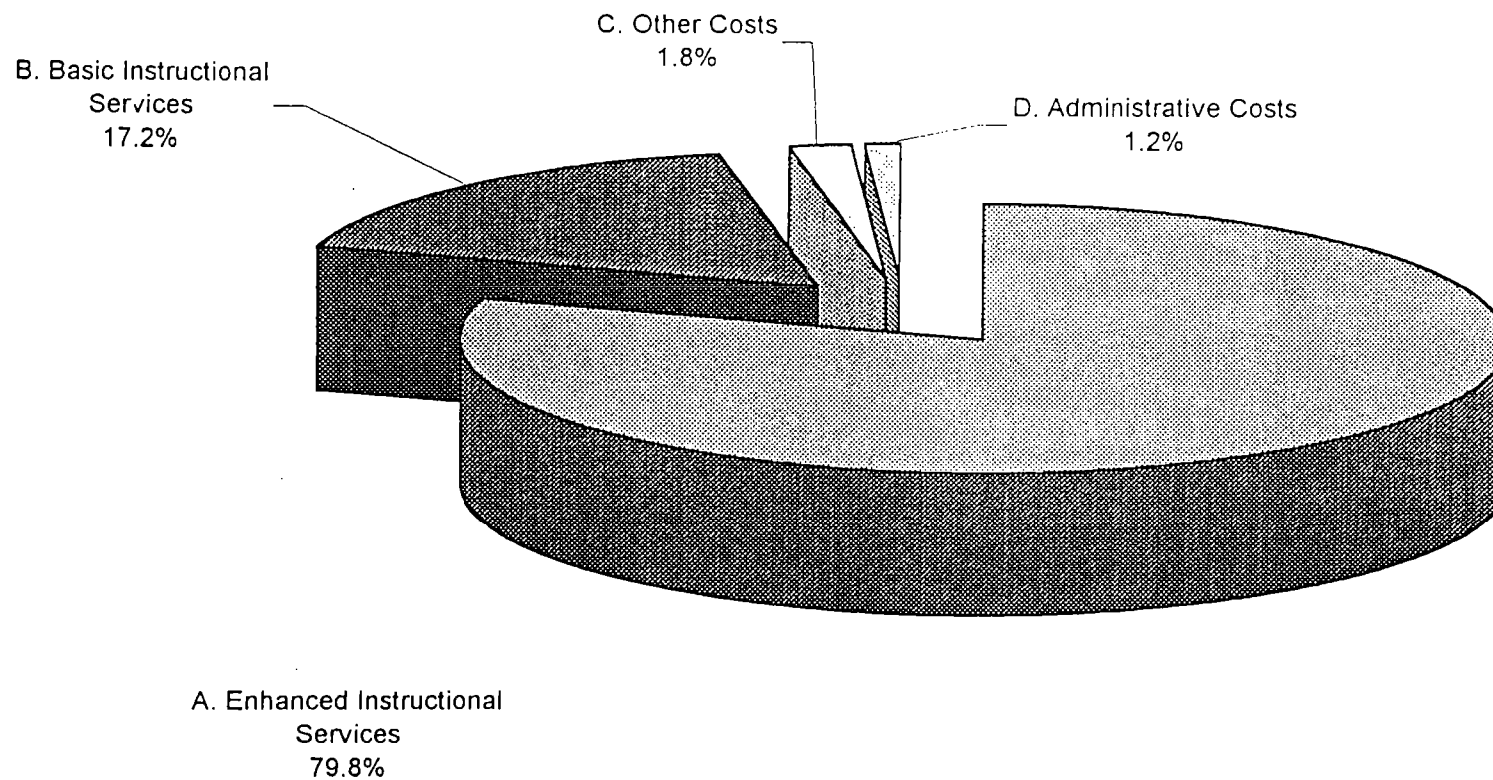

EIEP Expenditures, by Category, 1995-1996

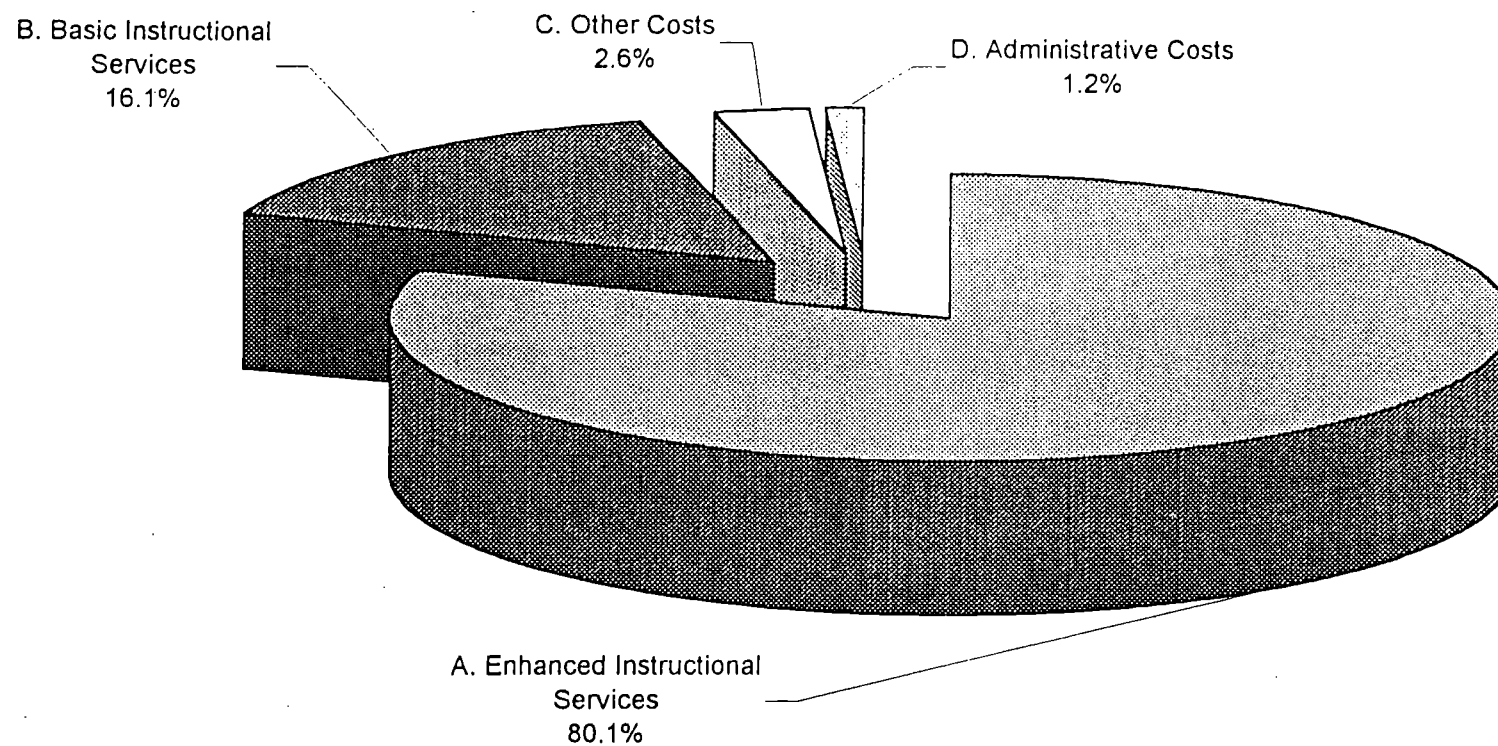

V. DESCRIPTION OF EIEP SERVICES

During the 1994-1995 and 1995-1996 reporting periods, SEAs were asked to describe how their LEAs were meeting the purpose of the EIEP statute provided in section 7301(b) of the ESEA. Reporting focus was placed on three general areas:

- a) providing high-quality instruction to immigrant children and youth;
- b) helping those children and youth with their transition into American society; and
- c) helping those children meet the same challenging state performance standards expected of all children and youth as specified in the state plan submitted under Title I of the Act or the Goals 2000: Educate America Act.

SEA responses to this inquiry varied in detail and length. As table 6 and figure F indicate, however, service descriptions fell consistently into the expense category of Enhanced Instructional Services. Specially Trained Personnel was reported by 95 percent of SEAs, Curricular Materials and Instructional Technologies was listed by 90 percent, Family Literacy was included by 66 percent, Special Projects was detailed by 59 percent and Academic/Career Counseling was reported by 42 percent of SEAs. A comprehensive list of service examples as reported by SEAs for each of these subcategories is provided in table 7. (Appendix F provides a list of SEA coordinators by state.)

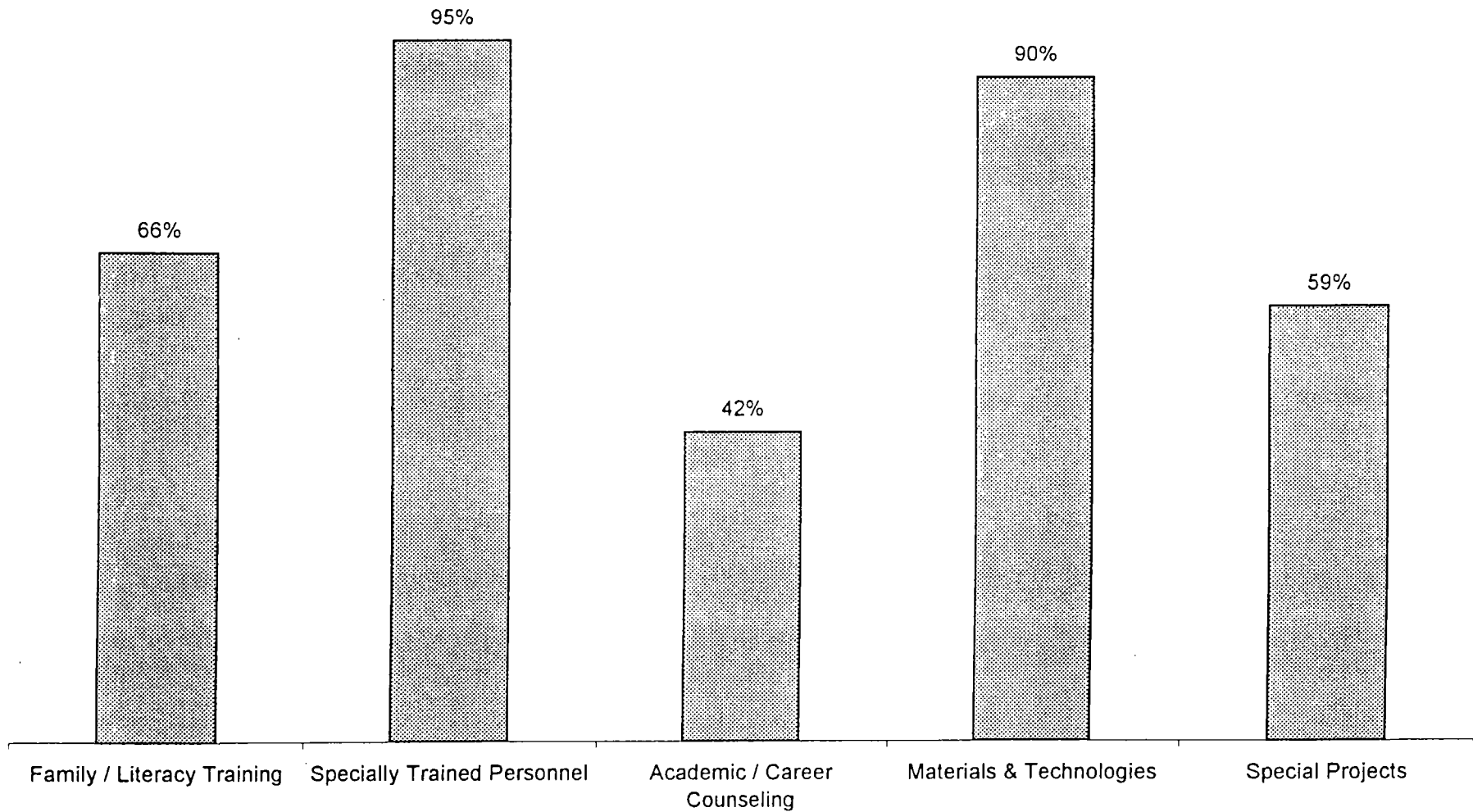

VI. SUMMARY

Program Participation

Since its inception in 1984, the number of students participating in the EIEP has more than doubled. An analysis of 1994-1995 and 1995-1996 data indicates that program participants represent over 200 countries of origin. Mexico was the largest country of origin, averaging 311,063 students (40 percent). Participants during the 1994-1995 school year totaled 773,976, and during the 1995-1996 school year this total increased to 823,149. California, Florida, Illinois, New York, and Texas accounted for over 75% of these participant totals in both school years.

Program Funding

From the program's inception in 1984 until 1993, funding from Congress remained relatively consistent at about \$30 million. Then in FY 1994, 1995 and 1996, Congress appropriated \$38,992,000, \$50,036,568 and \$50,000,000, respectively. In FY 1997, the funding went up to \$100 million. The Clinton administration requested funding levels of \$150 million from Congress for both FY 1998 and FY 1999.

The EIEP provided funding to 38 states and two territories in the 1994-1995 school year and 38 States and three territories in the 1995-1996 school year. California, Florida, Illinois, New York, and Texas accounted for nearly 75 percent of total expenditures for both school years.

The amount spent by states on the allowable expense categories varied only slightly across the two school years. The majority of the funds (80 percent or \$31 million in 1994-1995 and 80 percent or \$38 million in 1995-1996) were spent on Enhanced Instructional Services such as Family/Literacy Training and Salaries of Specially Trained Personnel. A smaller amount of funds (\$6.7 million representing 17 percent of funds in 1994-1995 and \$7.6 million representing 16 percent of funds in 1995-1996) were spent on Basic Instructional Services such as classroom supplies and overhead costs. Administrative and Other Costs accounted for the smallest amount of funds (\$1.2 million in 1994-1995 and \$1.8 million in 1995-1996, representing 3 percent and 3.8 percent respectively in these years.)

Program Services

SEAs provided narrative descriptions of services extended to immigrant students during the 1994-1995 and 1995-1996 school years. Descriptions focused on the areas of quality instruction, societal transition and performance standards. Services discussed were predominantly Enhanced Instructional Services, such as Specially Trained Personnel (95 percent), Curricular Materials and Instructional Technologies (90 percent), Family/Literacy Training (66 percent), Special Projects (59 percent) and Academic/Career Counseling (42 percent). Within these broad categories, SEAs reported service examples like parent voluntarism, adult literacy programs, parent orientations, computer training, CD-ROM Competency Test preparation and after-school programs.

APPENDIX A:
Emergency Immigrant Education Program

"PART C—EMERGENCY IMMIGRANT EDUCATION PROGRAM

"SEC. 7301. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE.

20 USC 7541.

"(a) FINDINGS.—The Congress finds that—

"(1) the education of our Nation's children and youth is one of the most sacred government responsibilities;

"(2) local educational agencies have struggled to fund adequately education services;

"(3) in the case of *Plyler v. Doe*, the Supreme Court held that States have a responsibility under the Equal Protection Clause of the Constitution to educate all children, regardless of immigration status; and

"(4) immigration policy is solely a responsibility of the Federal Government.

"(b) PURPOSE.—The purpose of this part is to assist eligible local educational agencies that experience unexpectedly large increases in their student population due to immigration to—

"(1) provide high-quality instruction to immigrant children and youth; and

"(2) help such children and youth—

"(A) with their transition into American society; and

"(B) meet the same challenging State performance standards expected of all children and youth.

"SEC. 7302. STATE ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS.

20 USC 7542.

"For any fiscal year, a State educational agency may reserve not more than 1.5 percent of the amount allocated to such agency under section 7304 to pay the costs of performing such agency's administrative functions under this part.

"SEC. 7303. WITHHOLDING.

20 USC 7543.

"Whenever the Secretary, after providing reasonable notice and opportunity for a hearing to any State educational agency, finds that there is a failure to meet the requirement of any provision of this part, the Secretary shall notify that agency that further payments will not be made to the agency under this part, or in the discretion of the Secretary, that the State educational agency shall not make further payments under this part to specified local educational agencies whose actions cause or are involved in such failure until the Secretary is satisfied that there is no longer any such failure to comply. Until the Secretary is so satisfied, no further

payments shall be made to the State educational agency under this part, or payments by the State educational agency under this part shall be limited to local educational agencies whose actions did not cause or were not involved in the failure, as the case may be.

20 USC 7544.

"SEC. 7304. STATE ALLOCATIONS.

"(a) PAYMENTS.—The Secretary shall, in accordance with the provisions of this section, make payments to State educational agencies for each of the fiscal years 1995 through 1999 for the purpose set forth in section 7301(b).

"(b) ALLOCATIONS.—

"(1) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in subsections (c) and (d), of the amount appropriated for each fiscal year for this part, each State participating in the program assisted under this part shall receive an allocation equal to the proportion of such State's number of immigrant children and youth who are enrolled in public elementary or secondary schools under the jurisdiction of each local educational agency described in paragraph (2) within such State, and in nonpublic elementary or secondary schools within the district served by each such local educational agency, relative to the total number of immigrant children and youth so enrolled in all the States participating in the program assisted under this part.

"(2) ELIGIBLE LOCAL EDUCATIONAL AGENCIES.—The local educational agencies referred to in paragraph (1) are those local educational agencies in which the sum of the number of immigrant children and youth who are enrolled in public elementary or secondary schools under the jurisdiction of such agencies, and in nonpublic elementary or secondary schools within the districts served by such agencies, during the fiscal year for which the payments are to be made under this part, is equal to—

"(A) at least 500; or

"(B) at least 3 percent of the total number of students enrolled in such public or nonpublic schools during such fiscal year,

whichever number is less.

"(c) DETERMINATIONS OF NUMBER OF CHILDREN AND YOUTH.—

"(1) IN GENERAL.—Determinations by the Secretary under this section for any period with respect to the number of immigrant children and youth shall be made on the basis of data or estimates provided to the Secretary by each State educational agency in accordance with criteria established by the Secretary, unless the Secretary determines, after notice and opportunity for a hearing to the affected State educational agency, that such data or estimates are clearly erroneous.

"(2) SPECIAL RULE.—No such determination with respect to the number of immigrant children and youth shall operate because of an underestimate or overestimate to deprive any State educational agency of the allocation under this section that such State would otherwise have received had such determination been made on the basis of accurate data.

"(d) REALLOCATION.—Whenever the Secretary determines that any amount of a payment made to a State under this part for a fiscal year will not be used by such State for carrying out the purpose for which the payment was made, the Secretary shall

make such amount available for carrying out such purpose to one or more other States to the extent the Secretary determines that such other States will be able to use such additional amount for carrying out such purpose. Any amount made available to a State from any appropriation for a fiscal year in accordance with the preceding sentence shall, for purposes of this part, be regarded as part of such State's payment (as determined under subsection (b)) for such year, but shall remain available until the end of the succeeding fiscal year.

"(e) RESERVATION OF FUNDS.—

"(1) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provision of this part, if the amount appropriated to carry out this part exceeds \$50,000,000 for a fiscal year, a State educational agency may reserve not more than 20 percent of such agency's payment under this part for such year to award grants, on a competitive basis, to local educational agencies within the State as follows:

"(A) At least one-half of such grants shall be made available to eligible local educational agencies (as described in subsection (b)(2)) within the State with the highest numbers and percentages of immigrant children and youth.

"(B) Funds reserved under this paragraph and not made available under subparagraph (A) may be distributed to local educational agencies within the State experiencing a sudden influx of immigrant children and youth which are otherwise not eligible for assistance under this part.

"(2) USE OF GRANT FUNDS.—Each local educational agency receiving a grant under paragraph (1) shall use such grant funds to carry out the activities described in section 7307.

"(3) INFORMATION.—Local educational agencies with the highest number of immigrant children and youth receiving funds under paragraph (1) may make information available on serving immigrant children and youth to local educational agencies in the State with sparse numbers of such children.

"SEC. 7305. STATE APPLICATIONS.

20 USC 7545.

"(a) SUBMISSION.—No State educational agency shall receive any payment under this part for any fiscal year unless such agency submits an application to the Secretary at such time, in such manner, and containing or accompanied by such information, as the Secretary may reasonably require. Each such application shall—

"(1) provide that the educational programs, services, and activities for which payments under this part are made will be administered by or under the supervision of the agency;

"(2) provide assurances that payments under this part will be used for purposes set forth in sections 7301 and 7307, including a description of how local educational agencies receiving funds under this part will use such funds to meet such purposes and will coordinate with other programs assisted under this Act, the Goals 2000: Educate America Act, and other Acts as appropriate;

"(3) provide an assurance that local educational agencies receiving funds under this part will coordinate the use of such funds with programs assisted under part A or title I;

"(4) provide assurances that such payments, with the exception of payments reserved under section 7304(e), will be distributed among local educational agencies within that State on the basis of the number of immigrant children and youth

counted with respect to each such local educational agency under section 7304(b)(1);

"(5) provide assurances that the State educational agency will not finally disapprove in whole or in part any application for funds received under this part without first affording the local educational agency submitting an application for such funds reasonable notice and opportunity for a hearing;

"(6) provide for making such reports as the Secretary may reasonably require to perform the Secretary's functions under this part;

"(7) provide assurances—

"(A) that to the extent consistent with the number of immigrant children and youth enrolled in the nonpublic elementary or secondary schools within the district served by a local educational agency, such agency, after consultation with appropriate officials of such schools, shall provide for the benefit of such children and youth secular, neutral, and nonideological services, materials, and equipment necessary for the education of such children and youth;

"(B) that the control of funds provided under this part to any materials, equipment, and property repaired, remodeled, or constructed with those funds shall be in a public agency for the uses and purposes provided in this part, and a public agency shall administer such funds and property; and

"(C) that the provision of services pursuant to this paragraph shall be provided by employees of a public agency or through contract by such public agency with a person, association, agency, or corporation who or which, in the provision of such services, is independent of such nonpublic elementary or secondary school and of any religious organization, and such employment or contract shall be under the control and supervision of such public agency, and the funds provided under this paragraph shall not be commingled with State or local funds;

"(8) provide that funds reserved under subsection (e) of section 7304 be awarded on a competitive basis based on merit and need in accordance with such subsection; and

"(9) provide an assurance that State and local educational agencies receiving funds under this part will comply with the requirements of section 1120(b).

"(b) APPLICATION REVIEW.—

"(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall review all applications submitted pursuant to this section by State educational agencies.

"(2) APPROVAL.—The Secretary shall approve any application submitted by a State educational agency that meets the requirements of this section.

"(3) DISAPPROVAL.—The Secretary shall disapprove any application submitted by a State educational agency which does not meet the requirements of this section, but shall not finally disapprove an application except after providing reasonable notice, technical assistance, and an opportunity for a hearing to the State.

“SEC. 7306. ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS.

20 USC 7546.

“(a) **NOTIFICATION OF AMOUNT.**—The Secretary, not later than June 1 of each year, shall notify each State educational agency that has an application approved under section 7305 of the amount of such agency’s allocation under section 7304 for the succeeding year.

“(b) **SERVICES TO CHILDREN ENROLLED IN NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS.**—If by reason of any provision of law a local educational agency is prohibited from providing educational services for children enrolled in elementary and secondary nonpublic schools, as required by section 7305(a)(7), or if the Secretary determines that a local educational agency has substantially failed or is unwilling to provide for the participation on an equitable basis of children enrolled in such schools, the Secretary may waive such requirement and shall arrange for the provision of services, subject to the requirements of this part, to such children. Such waivers shall be subject to consultation, withholding, notice, and judicial review requirements in accordance with the provisions of title I.

“SEC. 7307. USES OF FUNDS.

20 USC 7547.

“(a) **USE OF FUNDS.**—Funds awarded under this part shall be used to pay for enhanced instructional opportunities for immigrant children and youth, which may include—

“(1) family literacy, parent outreach, and training activities designed to assist parents to become active participants in the education of their children;

“(2) salaries of personnel, including teacher aides who have been specifically trained, or are being trained, to provide services to immigrant children and youth;

“(3) tutorials, mentoring, and academic or career counseling for immigrant children and youth;

“(4) identification and acquisition of curricular materials, educational software, and technologies to be used in the program;

“(5) basic instructional services which are directly attributable to the presence in the school district of immigrant children, including the costs of providing additional classroom supplies, overhead costs, costs of construction, acquisition or rental of space, costs of transportation, or such other costs as are directly attributable to such additional basic instructional services; and

“(6) such other activities, related to the purposes of this part, as the Secretary may authorize.

“(b) **CONSORTIA.**—A local educational agency that receives a grant under this part may collaborate or form a consortium with one or more local educational agencies, institutions of higher education, and nonprofit organizations to carry out the program described in an application approved under this part.

“(c) **SUBGRANTS.**—A local educational agency that receives a grant under this part may, with the approval of the Secretary, make a subgrant to, or enter into a contract with, an institution of higher education, a nonprofit organization, or a consortium of such entities to carry out a program described in an application approved under this part, including a program to serve out-of-school youth.

“(d) **CONSTRUCTION.**—Nothing in this part shall be construed to prohibit a local educational agency from serving immigrant chil-

dren simultaneously with students with similar educational needs," in the same educational settings where appropriate.

20 USC 7548.

"SEC. 7308. REPORTS.

"(a) BIENNIAL REPORT.—Each State educational agency receiving funds under this part shall submit, once every two years, a report to the Secretary concerning the expenditure of funds by local educational agencies under this part. Each local educational agency receiving funds under this part shall submit to the State educational agency such information as may be necessary for such report.

"(b) REPORT TO CONGRESS.—The Secretary shall submit, once every two years, a report to the appropriate committees of the Congress concerning programs assisted under this part in accordance with section 14701.

20 USC 7549.

"SEC. 7309. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

"For the purpose of carrying out this part, there are authorized to be appropriated \$100,000,000 for fiscal year 1995 and such sums as may be necessary for each of the four succeeding fiscal years.
