On **Monday, July 13**, the International Migration Policy Program of the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace and the Georgetown University Law Center will be co-sponsoring a **Conference on Immigration and Race**. Thomas Professor of Sociology and Chair of the Department of Sociology at the University of Pennsylvania will deliver the **Keynote Address** at 9:00 a.m. These will be followed by three panel discussions, the first from 10:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. will be on **Race and Immigration: Beyond the Black/White Paradigm**. The second session, from 2:00 p.m. to 4:15 p.m., will identify and discuss **Strategies and "Best Practices"** for creating and sustaining multi-ethnic and inter-racial communities.
