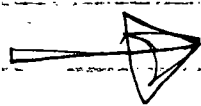

According to the PIR, the DOE and DOJ have signed off on an affirmative action handbook for universities. Judy sent an e-mail to Sylvia and Elena on Saturday, asking whether it could be released at the Nov. 19th Board meeting. I got a copy on Sunday. Have we reviewed this? E-mail about review also went to Dawn Chirwa in WHC.

2.

Town Hall meeting is December 3, 1997; Youth; Akron, Ohio (Newspaper did a big story on racial reconciliation. Have a coming together program; arose out of a newspaper series.

- There is a meeting today at 2pm with Ann Lewis to discuss the theme for the Town Meeting.
 - May want to incorporate "service" into this town hall.
- According to Mike Wender (PIR) it will not be issue oriented; more experiential. Hockey players (Native American and Black) involved in a name-calling incident as a lead (per VPotus).

3. Finalizing the November 19th agenda.

- We have a final draft of the agenda.
- Will include a discussion of discrimination and enforcement at the end and someone from the National Council of Educational Opportunity Associations on pipeline programs.

4. Met (with Tom) with OMB for first half of "how to spend money for civil rights enforcement." Had to end, but have a lot more to do.

- The Director asked the OMB members to look again at how to think about enforcement as more than disposing of complaints and decreasing backlog. Issues of compliance, mediation, data, and technology.

5. Sat in on first half of the PIR group developing essay topics on "hard issues." Was some discussion, but no list of ideas or topics by the time I left (3pm).

6. Data issues

- Spoke briefly with Judy and Lin re: difficult issues with out participating in the decisions surrounding the data project. A project that is worth anything will take a long time to do well. The model that they are using (Child Welfare?) took a year to create. Concerns about the report not being "cooked": i.e., influenced by

the policy decisions of the President.

7. When is the meeting on Education Empowerment Zones?
8. Spoke with Jamie Daves from the FCC (works for Chairman Kennard -- first African American Chair of the FCC). He is interested in being kept in the loop. Kennard has interests in minorities in the media and how the communications revolution is including or not including minorities.
 - Said that the President is meeting with cable operators on the 19th. Wanted some more information. Thinks it is related to the PSAs during Black History Month.

American Indians

1. Met Monday with Lynn Cutler of Intergovernmental Affairs (w/Leanne). Will be assuming, with Mary, the responsibility for Native American issues.
 - We have a draft of the report and are editing it. Lyn will do a cover memo to the President through Bruce and Erskine describing what it is.
 - They are making some policy recommendations, which we will have to look at to decide which (if any) we think are worth looking into.
2. Met on American Indian Education proposals on Wednesday (first with Mike, Tom and Mary and then later with a group from DOI and DOE). Mike is taking the lead in helping to put together a list of initiatives that we could present as a package, which could include school construction, money to assist them in coordinating student enrollment among BIA schools.

Immigration

1. First INS restructuring meeting was last Thursday. With DOJ (and INS), WHC, OPL and OMB.
 - Leanne has set up meetings with Labor and State for next Wed. and the following Friday or Monday. She has also put together a schedule for the next couple of weeks with the other players.
 - Should we have the communications/strategy meeting early in the process? What do we want?
 - Re-think the idea of having INS at every meeting. Less candid? Less helpful because of turf issues?
 - What do we have to decide by December?
 - A marker in the budget? That we will reorganize immigration functions; draw lines between enforcement and service. State an intention to do an improvement and a commitment to sever enforcement from services. Leaves question of whether to do it within INS or to split into other agencies. INS already has additional \$ appropriate for ongoing improvements -- substantial \$.
 - Will talk to Steve Mertens (OMB) about cost.
 - We are also setting up meetings with someone from the CIR, others at INS (Dave Marten from the General Counsel's office), INS lawyers, former INS lawyers, advocacy groups, Labor (unions), immigration lawyers, business, Carnegie Foundation, representatives from the Hill.
 - Creating a side-by-side that compares the various proposals (CIR, OMB, INS, Reyes)
2. Meeting Thursday afternoon with immigration groups re: Central American issue.
 - Happy with outcome; want more -- regulation re: Sal and Guat w/ a presumption of "extreme hardship" and an administrative rather than an immigration court procedure for processing these groups.

 - By end of Monday will have a write up from NSC, State and OLC on the foreign policy rationale for doing DED. Would like to have a decision by the end of the

- OLC still opposed to using DED.
 - How many Haitians are we talking about?
 - NSC received a letter from the President of Haiti about not sending Haitians back. We have a copy.

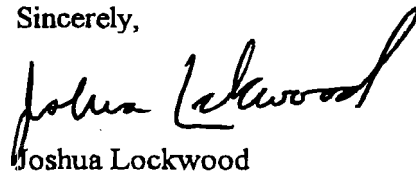
I am a Presidential Management Intern with the Department of Justice who is interested in a rotational assignment with the Domestic Policy Council. Jennifer O'Connor, a fellow alumnus from Columbia University's School of International and Public Affairs, suggested that I contact you to discuss the possibility of such a rotation.

If you are unfamiliar with the program, each year the Presidential Management Intern (PMI) program selects outstanding graduate students for a two year appointment with the federal government. One of the most appealing aspects of the PMI program is the opportunity for the intern to rotate to a different post at some time during the span of the two years. The hiring agency, in my case the Department of Justice, pays for the rotation, so that the Intern is ideally a highly qualified, free staff member.

Having spent the past 6 months as a Budget Analyst for the Department of Justice in the Law Enforcement and Corrections Group, I have gained valuable experience in justice issues. In a fast paced and challenging environment, I have been required to perform sophisticated policy analysis, explain complex policies both orally and in writing, and justify the investment of public funds in meaningful programs. I have also written and then discussed reports with various high level officials, including the Attorney General. I have developed an outstanding knowledge of immigration issues in particular, but as an excellent writer and communicator, I feel that I would be an asset in many different policy areas.

Ideally, I would like to rotate for several months this spring, but of course that would depend on your needs and the discretion of the Department of Justice. Jennifer O'Connor informed me of some of the institutional obstacles that might preclude a rotation to your office, and I appreciate your taking the time to consider my inquiry. I have enclosed a resume that expands on my skills and experience. Please feel free to contact me at your convenience should you like to speak to me about a possible rotational assignment.
