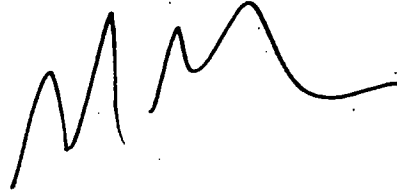

Dear Mr. President,

This letter is to inform you that the American Probation and Parole Association (APPA) supports a veto of prison advocates' efforts to delete funding for the crime prevention efforts embodied in the 1994 crime bill. The American Probation and Parole Association is a membership organization for community corrections professionals. We have approximately 3000 members throughout the country and 65 agency members for a total membership of approximately 12,000. Additionally, we have 47 affiliate organizations from 35 states that work in the area of criminal justice.

We are very concerned with the narrow direction that our nation's crime policy will take if the prison advocates' legislation is passed by Congress. As administrators and practitioners working for the protection of the public everyday we know that it takes a comprehensive and balanced approach of crime prevention, punishment and rehabilitation to make a significant impact on our crime problems.

Enclosed please find an Information Sheet on the benefits of community corrections. We are circulating this kind of information as much as we can in the hopes that community corrections will be given more focused consideration in our nation's continuing public debate regarding crime; after all, the vast majority of criminal offenders are returned to the community at some point. We supervise that transition with public safety as our priority and offender rehabilitation as a goal.
