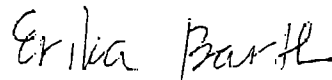
Dear Todd:

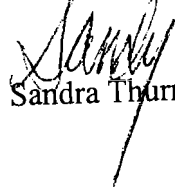

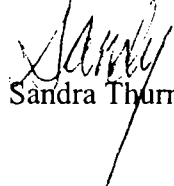

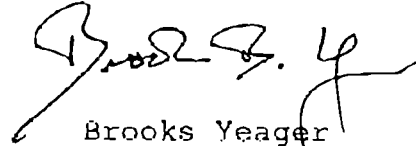
