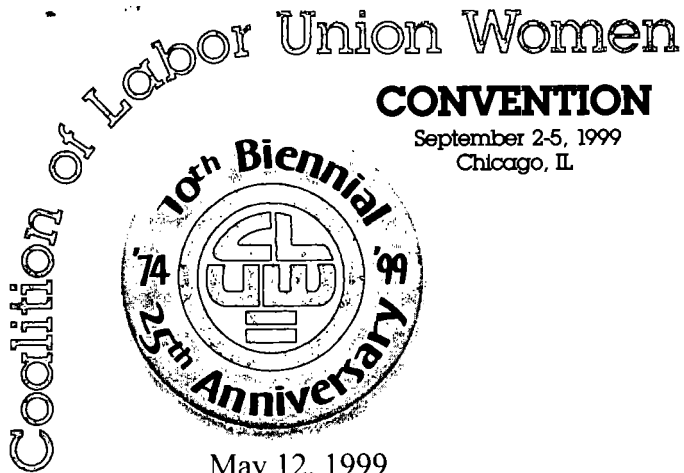

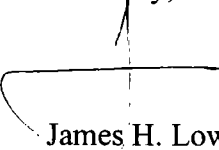

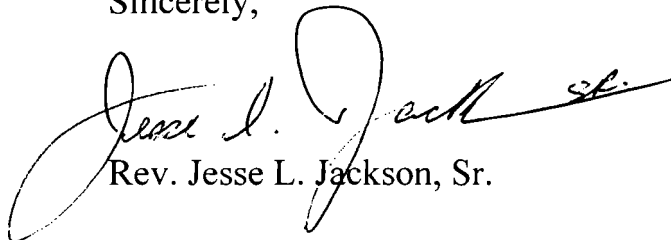

As we discussed, there is a short-term issue and a long-term goal. In the short term, we pledge to work with Health Minister Tshabalala to overcome the obstacles involved in protecting the intellectual property of our products in South Africa and appreciate the support of the U.S. government. Without strong intellectual property protection, innovation will be thwarted.

In the long-term, we share your concerns for the global AIDS crisis and agree that there may be a fruitful role for a public-private partnership to develop a program that would provide relief to patients in Africa. We look forward to working with you together on such a proposal.
