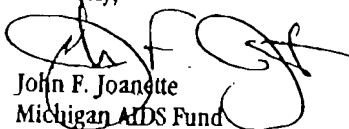

PROPOSED RECEPTION FOR SANDRA THURMAN AND THE DETROIT AREA
AFRICAN-AMERICAN FAITH COMMUNITY

The Michigan AIDS Fund (MAF) is providing second year financial support to Gospel Against AIDS (GAA), a Detroit area program specifically targeting African-American churches. GAA provides HIV/AIDS information, education/prevention training and resource information about networking with local AIDS services providers and ways to help support local efforts. Though still a small program, GAA has been highly effective in engaging AA churches to raise awareness about HIV/AIDS.

MAF is in the beginning stages of a 3-way dialogue that includes GAA and AIDS National Interfaith Network (ANIN) in Washington, D.C. This partnership will explore, among other things, the possibility of a regional HIV/AIDS conference in Detroit aimed at faith outreach communities (particularly AA churches) as a way to more effectively reach urban communities of color now greatly impacted by the onset of AIDS and new cases of HIV infection.

Rev. Rosetta DuBois-Gadson, an AA minister and Board Secretary for ANIN, was in Detroit recently for early discussions, and will return and be present for AIDS Walk Michigan - City of Detroit.

The proposed reception for Sandra Thurman would be co-sponsored by MAF and ANIN, and targeted at 20-40 AA clergy who are among the spiritual leaders in Detroit. Rev. DuBois-Gadson and Rosalind Andrews-Worthy, Executive Director of GAA, would be present as special guests. The linkage between a representative of the White House, ANIN, and locally based AIDS efforts would provide a major impetus for future local efforts to reach the faith community.

An invitation to attend would also be extended to Loretta Davis-Satterla, new Director of the Division of HIV/STD's at the Michigan Dept. of Community Health. Loretta was until recently head of HIV/AIDS programs at the Detroit Health Dept. She is also currently the Chair of the Coordinating Committee for the Detroit walk.

The reception would be about 1 ½ hours. Sandra Thurman could speak for about 10 (?) minutes on subjects to engage the faith community, followed by brief remarks by Rev. DuBois Gadson, Mrs. Worthy, and an opportunity to network with people in the room.

The idea and opportunity for this event is predicated on the fact that Ms. Thurman will be in Detroit for Detroit's new AIDS walk on Sunday Sept. 26. If she were able to arrive in Detroit on Saturday the 25th, the reception could be about 4:00-5:30PM.
