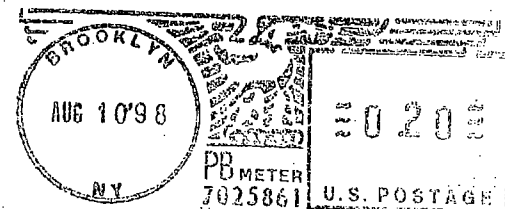

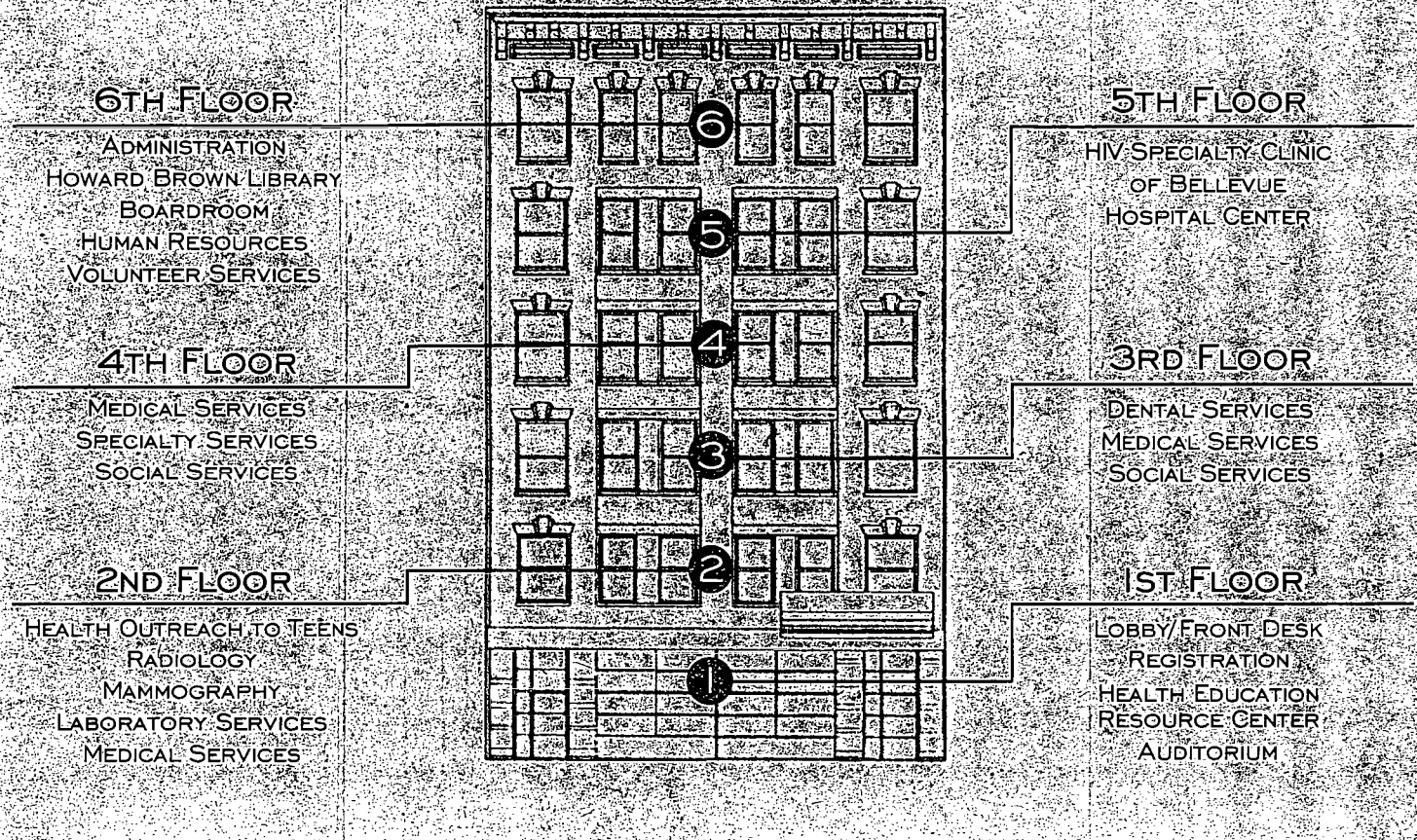

FACT SHEET



Michael Callen-Audre Lorde Community Health Center

(*formerly Community Health Project*) is New York City's *only* medical facility dedicated to meeting the myriad health care needs of the lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (lgbt) community and people living with HIV/AIDS -- *regardless of any patient's ability to pay*. Established in 1983, when the St. Mark's Community Clinic merged with the Gay Men's Health Project to create Community Health Project (CHP), Callen-Lorde Community Health Center is one of the lgbt community's most precious and important resources providing essential primary health care to thousands of individuals. Callen-Lorde's high quality, affordable, sensitive and non-judgmental care is provided through the following vital and innovative on-site services and programs:

■ **PRIMARY MEDICAL CARE:**

- ▶ **PRIMARY CARE:** A comprehensive health service model which provides on-going health maintenance and preventive care, as well as screening and treatment for sexually transmitted diseases (STD), hepatitis B prevention and immunization, walk-in services for acute and episodic medical care, dermatological care and other medical and specialty services. Primary care is provided by paid providers and episodic (walk-in) care is provided by a combination of paid and volunteer medical staff.
- ▶ **LESBIAN HEALTH SERVICES:** Comprehensive primary health care, gynecological care, breast health (including on-site mammography) and comprehensive HIV care, as well as targeted health education and counseling for women who partner with women exclusively or not.; provided by both paid and volunteer staff.
- ▶ **HIV/AIDS SERVICES:** HIV counseling and testing; early medical intervention for newly diagnosed individuals; *immediate* HIV primary medical care appointments and timely follow-up care visits that include diagnostic testing, medical treatments, access to clinical trials, benefits and entitlements advocacy, mental health care, HIV/AIDS education, and risk-reduction education.
- ▶ **HIV/AIDS PRIMARY CARE (BELLEVUE SATELLITE) CLINIC:** One of the nation's first community-based HIV primary care clinics, operating in conjunction with Bellevue Hospital Center and offering comprehensive HIV/AIDS-related medical care and social services.
- ▶ **HEALTH OUTREACH TO TEENS (HOTT) PROGRAM:** Free, confidential, comprehensive primary medical care (including a full continuum of HIV care), social services, counseling and health education to lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and questioning adolescents and young adults (ages 13-21), delivered both on-site at Callen-Lorde and on the 34-foot mobile medical HOTT van.
- ▶ **TRANSGENDER HEALTH & EDUCATION (THE) CLINIC:** Comprehensive primary medical care (including HIV-related care), counseling, and targeted health education and harm reduction information for people of transgender experience.

■ **SOCIAL SERVICES**

- ▶ **COUNSELING:** Provides crisis intervention and on-going one-on-one and group counseling, as well as supportive services and targeted support groups to HIV+ individuals, adolescents, etc.

- ▶ CASE MANAGEMENT: Offers assistance and advocacy for access to benefits and entitlements (i.e., DAS, Medicaid, ADAP, housing, etc.) for those living with HIV, as well as general case management services for others with chronic needs.
- ▶ PEER COUNSELING: Provides a safe and sensitive setting where patients as well as individuals who walk- or phone-in can speak to a trained volunteer peer counselor/educator about a variety of health and psychosocial issues, as well as obtain other lgbt and HIV-related health education and community referrals.

■ **HEALTH EDUCATION**

- ▶ TRAINING: Offers on-site and community-based lgbt health and HIV/AIDS educational workshops, presentation and targeted health ed materials.
- ▶ COMMUNITY OUTREACH: Outreach and training services to members of our community and other community-based organizations and training programs for health professionals (e.g. medical schools, nursing schools) on subjects such as "Unlearning Homophobia."
- ▶ RESOURCES: State-of-the-art health resource center offering a library and access to the health internet for patients and the lgbt community-at-large.

■ **COMING SOON!!!**

- ▶ *On-site Dental Care, Radiology (x-rays) and Mammography.*

Our greatest challenge and effort to date -- the construction of and relocation to our new, six-story, state-of-the-art, spacious, handicapped-accessible, and dignified primary care health center for the lgbt community, located on West 18th Street in Chelsea -- was realized in March of 1998.

In the rich tradition of Community Health Project, **Michael Callen-Audre Lorde Community Health Center** offers services to all, *regardless of ability to pay*, ensuring that our lgbt community will **thrive...not merely survive**.

Callen-Lorde currently accepts Medicaid, ADAP+ and out-of-network health insurance plans. An affordable sliding fee scale exists for all self-pay (uninsured) individuals. Cash, checks and most major credit cards are acceptable methods of payment.

Callen-Lorde's annual operating budget of \$3.4 million sustains a paid staff of 50 and more than 120 dedicated and caring volunteers. One-third of Callen-Lorde's revenue is derived from city and state contracts; one-third from corporations and foundations; and one-third from other fundraising sources. More than 20,000 patient visits were logged in 1997 at our old (13th St.) location; a 50% increase in visits is anticipated for 1998.

CHP's new **Michael Callen-Audre Lorde Community Health Center** was designed by the architectural firm of Thanhuaser & Esterson. Long-term financing for this facility was obtained from the Dormitory Authority of the State of New York and the Primary Care Development Corporation. Additional generous financial support was received from a variety of foundations and corporations who support Callen-Lorde's mission, and from the generosity of many donors from the lgbt community.
