As members of the NIH Office of AIDS Research Advisory Council, we feel a responsibility to ensure that relevant new scientific data are translated into appropriate action to improve the health of the nation.

As recently reported by you and the President's Advisory Council on HIV/AIDS, the overwhelming preponderance of data from numerous well-conducted scientific studies has demonstrated that needle exchange programs can decrease the transmission of HIV without encouraging the use of illegal drugs.

We strongly support the recent statements by you, Surgeon General David Satcher, NIH Director Harold Varmus, and White House Coordinator Sandra Thurman, each of whom has indicated that Federal funding of needle exchange programs would save American lives.

We therefore urge President Clinton and the Congress in a bipartisan demonstration of public health leadership, to do all in their power to initiate Federal funding of needle exchange programs.

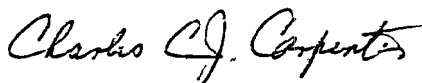
Dear Secretary Shalala:

As the Chair of the NIH Office of AIDS Research Advisory Council, I am transmitting to you a recommendation that received the unanimous support of the Council at our April 29 meeting.

The Office of AIDS Research Advisory Council expresses great concern that the system for tracking the HIV/AIDS epidemic in the United States may become increasingly inaccurate as a result of the current method of name reporting of HIV infection. The need for accurate and timely data on both AIDS and HIV disease prevalence and incidence remains of central importance for prevention, treatment, and policy planning. However, continuing concern about the potential and real misuse of name reporting of HIV infection will likely result in individuals' and communities' avoidance of the use of prevention and treatment resources. Underreporting and biased reporting will result. This, in turn, will have adverse effects on the nation's response to the continuing threat and consequences of HIV disease and may blunt the great progress that has been made in both prevention and treatment.

The technology exists for coded encryption. The Advisory Council strongly recommends that this technology be applied to an HIV reporting system that would assure both accuracy and completeness of reporting, and the protection of confidentiality.

I saw a great picture of you in The Washington Post recently preparing for your newest endurance test...and in your free time.... Best of luck and count me in as a supporter.

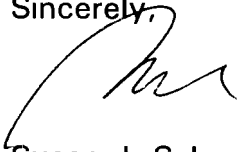
As we discussed during your visit here this spring, working women and men look to their unions for leadership on issues that threaten their health and safety both on and off the job. Since 1989, the George Meany Center's HIV/AIDS Workplace Education Project has provided cutting edge information on AIDS as it impacts working people. Over these past nine years, we have directly and indirectly reached tens of thousands of workers and their families through training sessions, workshops and technical assistance efforts as well as through three national conferences and an extensive bibliography of educational print and multimedia materials. Together with our partners in CDC's *Labor Responds to AIDS* initiative, AFSCME, SEIU and NEA, *LRTA* has become a reliable source of life saving information that workers perceive to be credible and valuable. We know that the workers who we are talking to are often hearing the facts about AIDS from us for the first time! Despite years of prevention education being conducted through traditional community prevention mechanisms, we know that working people do not hear the warnings from organizations with which they do not identify.

I was greatly encouraged by your commitment to support our efforts to protect working men and women from becoming infected with HIV. I would appreciate any encouragement that you could offer Helene Gayle and others at CDC to continue to fully support this important national partnership at this critical time in the epidemic.

I don't need to tell you that AIDS is the number two leading cause of death for Americans 25-44...the same age group that the majority of working men and women are in. You also know that AIDS is striking more and more women, youth and people of color. Today's unions are comprised of nearly 50% women, and a growing majority of younger workers and people of color; precisely the people who are most vulnerable as this pandemic enters the new millennium. Given our record of success and the emerging pattern of new infections, this is NOT the time to end a valuable program like this one.

Dear Sandra Thurman:

Thank you for your letter dated April, 24, 1998 in reply to my letter regarding my claim of having discovered the cure to Herpes, HIV and other viruses. The cure is not a drug, it is something common, found in nature and will purge the body of all viruses and permanently prevent any further infection.

I am not asking for anything in advance. Only that three conditions be met once the proper authority is convinced that "my cure" is 100% safe and effective. The three conditions are: one billion dollars, recognition for my accomplishment, and my conviction of the book store robbery is to be investigated. I did not rob the book store, David Jurek did it.

I have written many people in Washington about this matter including various health agencies. I have a thick stack of letters in response to my claims. I also have a list of persons who chose to completely ignore me, I might add, at the expense of the suffering and needless death of other people. Because of the serious nature of my claims and the persistence of those responsible to procrastinate, instead of taking the appropriate action, I have written the United States Attorney Janet Reno informing her that I would like to take this matter into court. I expect a reply from her office soon. I thank you again for your nice letter.

- Produce a feature that is of great value socially, critically, and financially.

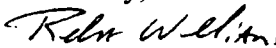
Our company is donating ten percent of our proceeds from this project to AIDS patient care agencies.

Thank You for coming to the Kansas City AIDS Update conference.

Two Issues I wish to address

1. Teen Challenge as a successful Christian drug rehabilitation program in 137 cities is required by law to have each entering client have a physical exam with syphilis, gonorrhea, hepatitis and TB test. Yet by law we can not require an HIV test. The others are treatable but HIV/AIDS to date is not.

If we know they are HIV+ ,there are many precautions and behaviors that can delay to onset of AIDS. (Enclosed is a suggestion we make to all of our Centers) We have no desire to give them the black ball or discriminate. No One is refused entry if they HIV+.. Most centers are not equipped or staffed to handle full-blown AIDS clients.

By making it a political disease we have set back support and treatment. Unfortunately some extreme Gay-Lesbian Activists have hurt the cause of treatment and research. They have turned off many caring, compassionate, concerned "conservatives". that you see as the enemy.

2. Needle exchange policy. I have worked at the street level with mainline addicts 26 years. Many programs have for years provided vials of bleach and junkies can't be bothered. Most street addicts wont bother to go to needle exchange unless they really need a sharp new needle. To spend precious dollars for this takes away from the real need for rehabilitation.

I am personally involved in helping the growth and development of Casa Vida in Puerto Rico.. This is a branch of Teen Challenge that is ministering to over 400 HIV+ clients. 24 are terminal in our Casa Vida Hospice.

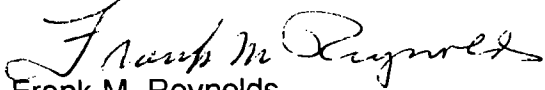
An aside--My daughter-in-law works in the Kansas City office that processes health insurance claims for federal employees. Thursday evening 4/30/98, I was talking about the conference. She told how that day she had been chewed out on the phone by an HIV+ PERSON BECAUSE THE INSURANCE REFUSED TO PAY FOR HIS

PRESCRIPTION of VIAGRA. We need to teach abstinence as well as condoms as responsible behavior.

The scientific studies people need to do more more with the street level worker.

TEEN CHALLENGE & ITS RESPONSIBILITY & OPPORTUNITY TO THE HIV POSITIVE STUDENT

At this time there is no known cure for someone infected with HIV. The time of infection until the onset of AIDS varies from individual to individual.

Without a blood test for HIV, a person may not know they have it. The disease advances as other infections are encountered which triggers the immune system to fight off the infection, This also triggers the HIV virus to multiply.

It is important that you know who is HIV positive so you can counsel them in lifestyle and occupational choices as a Christian.

There are guidelines available to help you guide HIV positive students to protect them and others in your program.

There may be laws saying you cannot require an HIV test. May I suggest a counseling procedure that could and ought to be used with entering students.

1. Outline to the student the lifestyles and activities that may have exposed them to HIV.
 - a. Sharing needles with other intravenous drug users.
 - b. Promiscuous sexual activity with infected individuals, homosexual and heterosexual activity. NOTE:--The use of a latex condom carries no money back guarantee.
 - c. Exposure to body fluids from an infected person especially in an open sore.
 - d. Tainted blood transfusions.
2. Emphasize the need to know whether they have HIV virus so proper precautions can be taken in their choices of vocations and avocations.
3. Their responsibilities if HIV positive to not pass it on to another.
4. Frank and open understanding of sexual activity if HIV positive.
5. This is not a criteria for entering the Teen Challenge program.
6. Early detection provides a better opportunity to slow the onset of AIDS through healthful living and possible medication.
7. There will be no blacklist or public disclosure, only to the primary counselors responsible for their discipleship and training.

This is an health issue not a legal issue. The fear of a lawsuit is a poor motivation for doing nothing. If we are irresponsible in this area we may open ourselves to criticism and/or lawsuits if a fellow student or staff becomes infected by someone HIV positive in the program.
