In reference to the travel authorization request for Sandy's upcoming trip to New York City, you had asked why the event sponsors were not paying for her travel. There are several reasons.

First, they did not offer and we are not allowed to ask.

Second, this an excellent opportunity to spend time with many of the nation's leaders on AIDS and to work with the NY constituency, which continues to address the worst AIDS crisis in the country.

Third, Ms. Fisher is an icon in AIDS advocacy and Sandy wants very much to represent the Administration in an event honoring her efforts. As you may recall, Ms. Fisher was the woman who spoke of living with AIDS at the 1992 Republican national convention--challenging her party to lead on the fight against AIDS. As recently as this past fall, the First Lady participated in an event honoring Ms. Fisher at the Elizabeth Glaser Pediatric AIDS Foundation annual awards dinner.

Given the minimal cost of the trip and the opportunity to participate in a worthwhile and highly visible event, we continue to feel that this is worthwhile expenditure.
