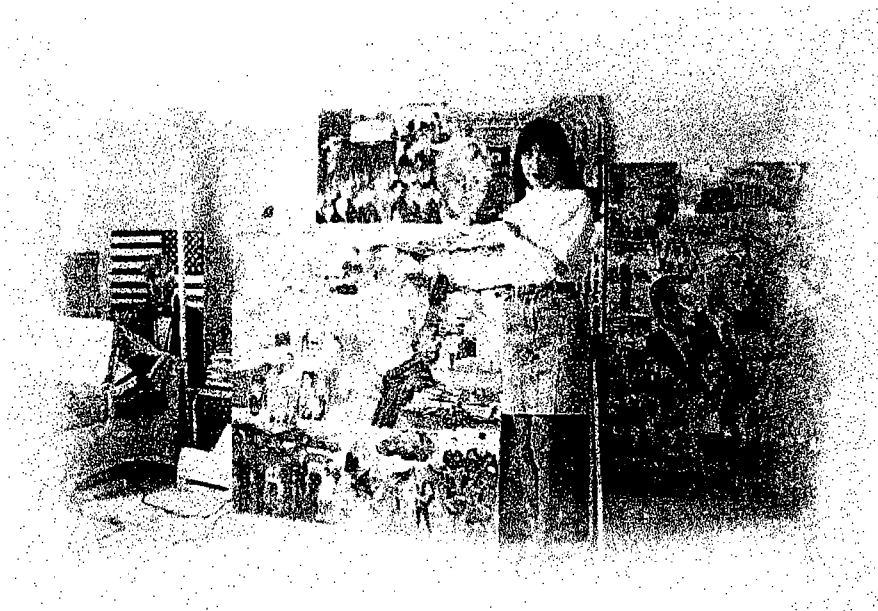

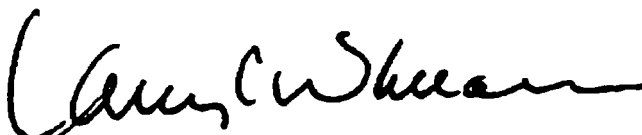

Dear Dr. Cravero,

I am writing you this fax to introduce the purpose of my telephone call to you. I am special counsel to Mr. J. Virgil Waggoner of Houston, Texas, the principal shareholder and Chairman of Phyto-Riker Pharmaceuticals located in Ghana. The Government of Ghana and the Modern Africa Fund are minority shareholders.

The plant currently produces the cotrimoxazole generic medicine, which is used as an antibiotic to normally treat ailments such as urinary tract infections, bronchitis and a type of pneumonia. The trademark product of Roche Pharmaceuticals, Bactrim, is now "off patent." It is used to treat various diseases in Africa and was recently endorsed for the first time by AIDS experts in Zimbabwe in early April. This was reported in early April from the World Health Organization and the United Nations AIDS programs. I am attaching a copy of the New York Times article of April 6, 2000 on this subject. We watched with interest the articles from Washington and Geneva the last couple of days and today's article in the New York Times which is on their web page.

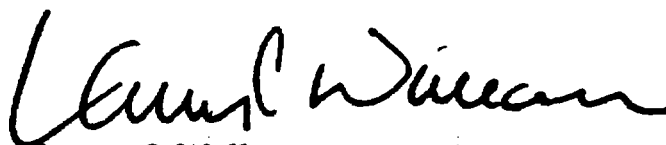
