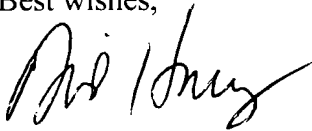

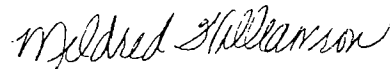

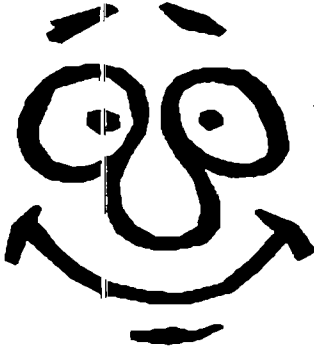

The briefings will be one and one-half hours in length. Each panelist will have ten minutes to present their information, followed by a thirty minute question and answer period.

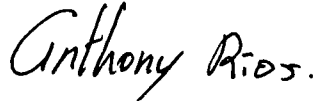
