Talking Points¹

Kansas City

State of Emergency

- ❖ In 1998, the number of new cases among African-Americans surpassed the number for whites for the first time (national);
- ❖ In June 1999, Kansas City declared a public health State of Emergency for HIV/AIDS among African Americans and Latinos, and St. Louis declared the same among their African American populations.

Kansas City Overview²

- ❖ In 1998, there were 486 new cases of HIV infection statewide (70% of those were contained within the St.Louis/Kansas City metro area);
- ❖ Men who have sex with men continues to be the leading cause of new cases;
- ❖ IV drug users (including perinatal transmissions) have the second highest incidence;
- ❖ 40.6% of all new HIV cases were reported in the African-American community. This is four times the incidence of whites;
- ❖ African-American females had 9-times the rate of HIV compared with white females;
- ❖ From 1990 – 1998, the number of AIDS cases fell 82% for whites but only 54% for African Americans;

Issues

- ❖ Given the positive impact of drug therapy on death from AIDS, the focus is shifting to tracking new HIV cases to measure the effectiveness of prevention efforts and of bringing HIV+ persons into care;
- ❖ In Missouri prisons, 256 inmates were found to be positive, 68% are African American males. Testing is not mandatory. Kansas City officials consider this to be a burgeoning problem among their prison populations;
- ❖ Kansas City initiatives focus on: faith-based partnerships, enhanced awareness programs for local officials, identification of best practices, enhanced prevention efforts directed towards the African American community.
