- They need assurance that:

(1) VA will remain an independent system as a participant in the reformed national system.

(2) service-connected veterans will continue to have their needs addressed, especially in Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder, spinal cord injury treatment and rehabilitation medicine.

(3) low income veterans will continue to have their needs addressed.

(4) other higher income veterans will be able to "buy in" to the system with their private insurance, their Health Insurance Purchasing Cooperatives (HIPC), medicare eligibility, or their own dollars, that is, that veterans can choose VA.

(5) no need to decide right now about non-veterans in system. If, in the future, there is excess capacity, then we can talk about dependents of veterans.

Secretary Brown asked me to send

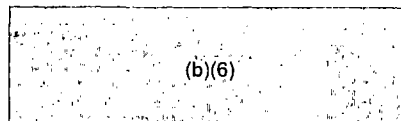
