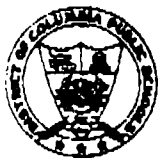

Subject: WHITE HOUSE D.C. KIDS EVENT

We are pleased to share with you how the schools were selected to participate in the White House Party.

The schools were top winners in a contest sponsored by the United Black Fund. The winners had the greatest number of parents, guardians or other adults accompanying their children on the first day of school. The determination of winners was based on the highest percentage of parents representative of students.

Briefly, the Stoddert and Key Elementary Schools are located in North West Washington and represent outstanding academic achievement by students, intense parent involvement and a diverse school population. Malcolm X, Wilkinson and Turner Elementary Schools are located in South East Washington. The school has a large free lunch program for students and many families on public assistance who live in public housing. However, these schools have outstanding parent involvement and good achievement by students.

These students are looking forward to coming to the White House and I know that they will long remember such a bright occasion.

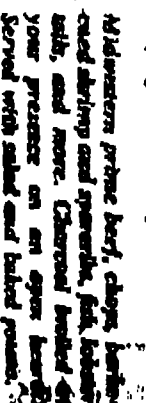

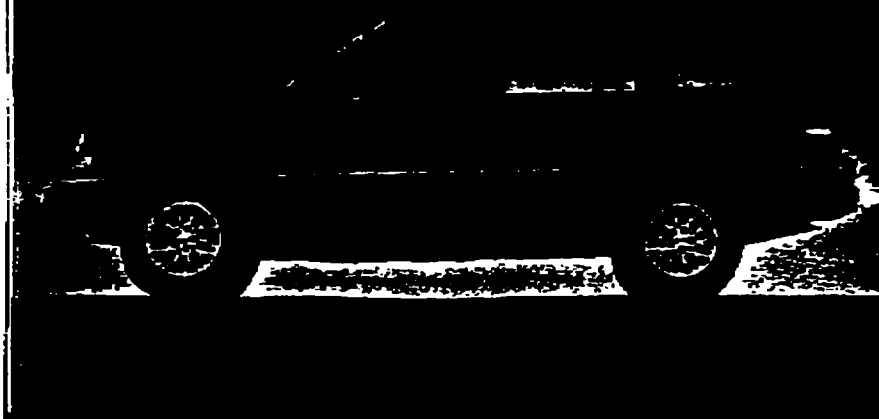
