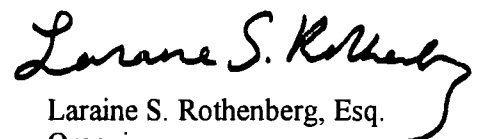
We hope you will agree to join us. Thank you for your consideration.

Finally, looking toward next year, we are planning our third meeting of the entire group in April 1997; more information will follow. We are delighted with your participation in the committees of the Alumnae of Columbia Law School. Each committee has held its first meeting. To give you an idea of some of the projects being pursued by the committees, the mentoring committee is creating a data base of alumnae interested in serving as mentors for other alumnae and hopes to conduct a panel discussion on the value of mentoring and how to serve effectively as mentors and mentees. The law firm committee on career development plans to meet with women lawyers to assist them in career development. The committee on flexible work arrangements is creating a data base of written flexible work policies of legal employers. 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I look forward to seeing you at the committee meetings and the October 28 meeting.

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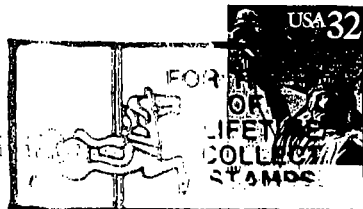

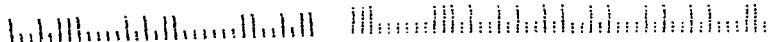

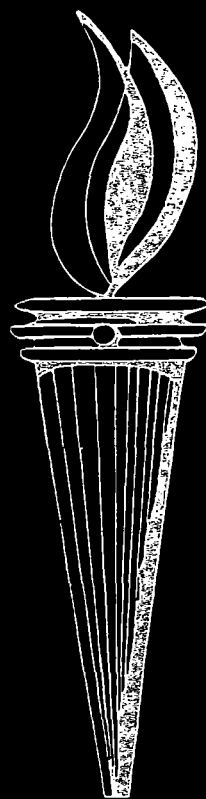
