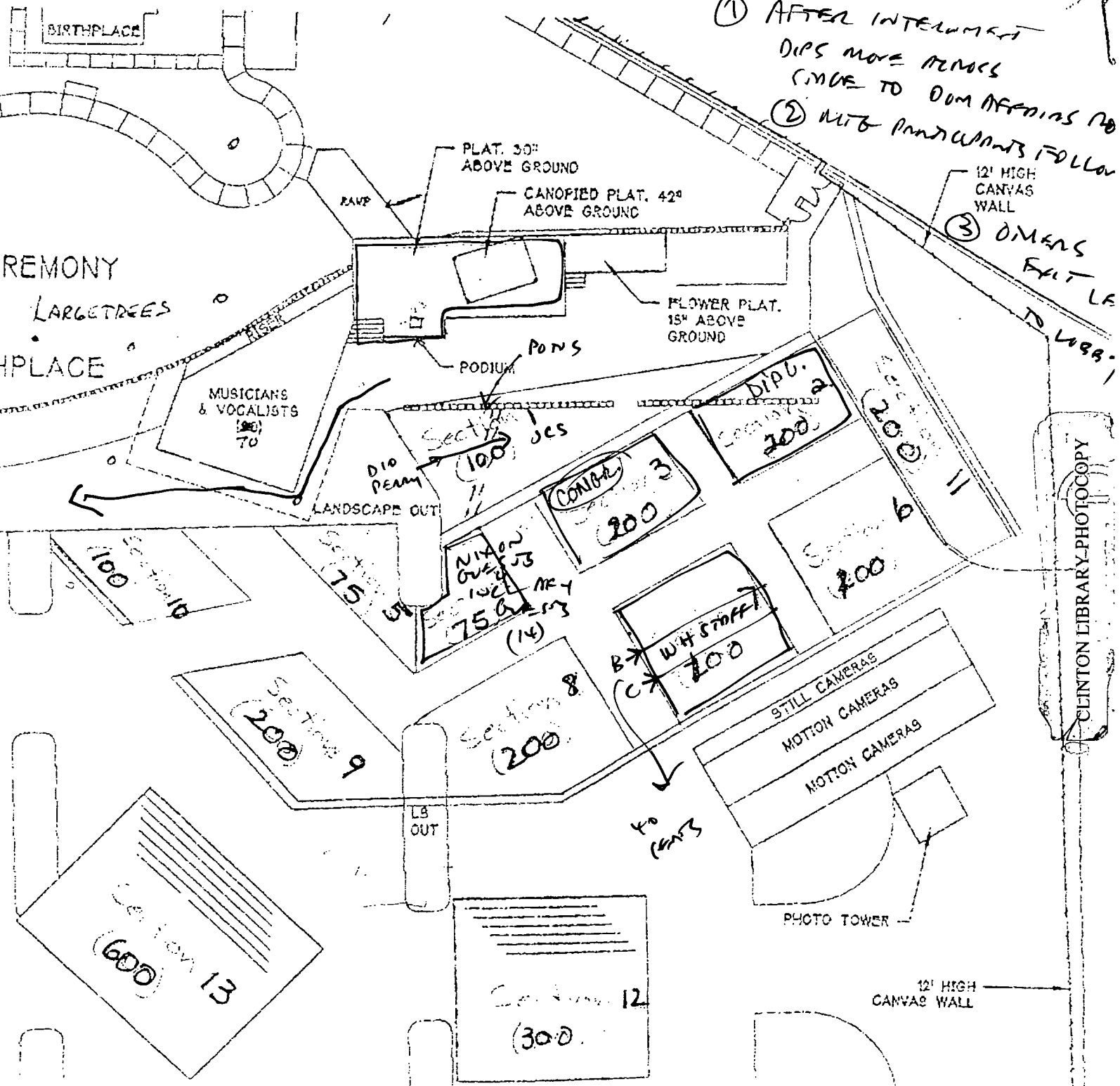

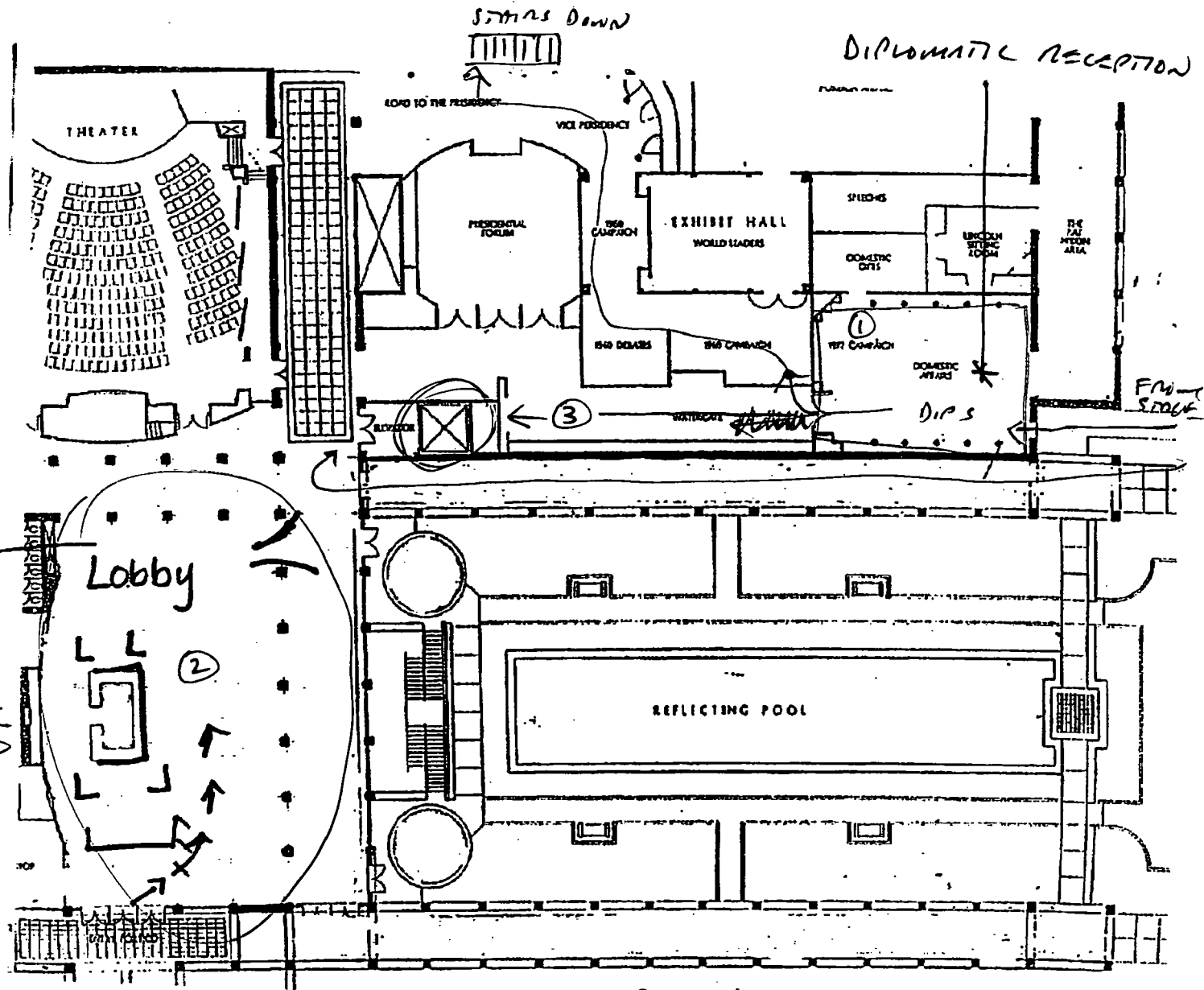

1. FORMER PRESIDENT RICHARD M. NIXON DIED ON FRIDAY,
APRIL 22, 1994, AT NEW YORK CITY.

2. ON TUESDAY, APRIL 26, THE BODY OF THE FORMER
PRESIDENT, ACCOMPANIED BY HIS FAMILY, WILL BE TAKEN TO
THE RICHARD M. NIXON LIBRARY AND BIRTHPLACE IN YORBA
LINDA, CALIFORNIA. THE LATE PRESIDENT WILL LIE IN
REPOSE IN THE LOBBY OF THE LIBRARY BEGINNING AT 3:00
P.M. (PDT) ON TUESDAY, APRIL 26, UNTIL 11:00 A.M. (PDT)
ON WEDNESDAY, APRIL 27. THE LIBRARY WILL BE OPEN TO THE
PUBLIC DURING THIS TIME.

3. ON WEDNESDAY, APRIL 27, AT 4:00 P.M. (PDT), A
FUNERAL SERVICE WILL BE HELD AT THE LIBRARY AND
BIRTHPLACE. EULOGIES WILL BE DELIVERED BY PRESIDENT
CLINTON, SENATOR ROBERT DOLE OF KANSAS, AND GOVERNOR
PETE WILSON OF CALIFORNIA. DR. BILLY GRAHAM WILL BE
OFFICIANT. DRESS WILL BE DARK BUSINESS SUIT. MORE
DETAILED INFORMATION REGARDING THE FUNERAL SERVICE WILL
BE PROVIDED LATER.

4. MEMBERS OF FOREIGN DELEGATIONS ARE WELCOME TO ATTEND
THE FUNERAL SERVICE. THE HEAD OF EACH DELEGATION AND
ONE ACCOMPANYING PERSON WILL BE SEATED. IF THE RESIDENT
AMBASSADOR OR CHARGE IN WASHINGTON ATTENDS, AND IS TO BE
SEATED, HE/SHE IS TO BE CONSIDERED AS ONE OF THE TWO
SEATED PERSONS OF THE DELEGATION.

5. FYI: POSTS SHOULD BE ADVISED THAT DUE TO DEMANDS ON
THE PRESIDENT'S SCHEDULE, THERE WILL BE VIRTUALLY NO

OPPORTUNITY FOR BILATERALS. THE FOREGOING APPLIES AS WELL TO ACTING SECRETARY TALBOTT, WHO ALSO WILL ATTEND THE FUNERAL SERVICE. END FYI.

6. THE UNITED STATES SECRET SERVICE WILL PROVIDE PROTECTION FOR ALL CHIEFS OF STATE AND HEADS OF GOVERNMENT WHILE IN THE UNITED STATES. THE BUREAU OF DIPLOMATIC SECURITY WILL COORDINATE OTHER FOREIGN PROTECTIVE ARRANGEMENTS.

7. PLEASE FURNISH THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION SOONEST CONCERNING ANY FOREIGN DELEGATION COMING FROM ABROAD, BY IMMEDIATE CABLE SLUGGED "TFNX01: NIXON FUNERAL":

A. COMPLETE NAMES AND TITLES OF OFFICIAL DELEGATION AND ANY ACCOMPANYING PARTY;

B. ARRIVAL TIMES AND MEANS OF TRANSPORTATION.

8. DEPARTMENT ASSUMES THAT EMBASSY IN WASHINGTON OR CONSULATE IN CALIFORNIA, IF ONE EXISTS, WILL PROVIDE ANY NECESSARY HOUSING AND TRANSPORTATION FOR DELEGATIONS.

9. POSTS SHOULD OPEN A CONDOLENCE BOOK FOR SIGNATURE THROUGHOUT THE WEEK OF APRIL 25-29.

10. UNLESS THE COM DECIDES AN EXCEPTION IS WARRANTED AS A MATTER OF NATIONAL INTEREST, OFFICIAL PERSONNEL SHOULD FOREGO ATTENDANCE AT SOCIAL FUNCTIONS UNTIL INTERMENT.

11. ANY CONDOLENCE MESSAGES FROM FOREIGN DIGNITARIES ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OR SECRETARY OF STATE RECEIVED BY POSTS SHOULD BE SENT BY TELEGRAM SLUGGED "TFNX01: NIXON CONDOLENCE" TO THE DEPARTMENT FOR RESPONSE. CONDOLENCE MESSAGES FROM FOREIGN DIGNITARIES ADDRESSED TO THE NIXON FAMILY MAY BE DIRECTED TO:
