Purpose

To announce your intention to visit Britain and Ireland, including Northern Ireland, September 29-October 2, 1995.

Background

The British and Irish have agreed to our proposed dates of September 29 - October 2 for your visit to the United Kingdom and Ireland. In the highly positive aftermath of the White House Investment Conference and in light of the widespread speculation that your trip will include a stop in Northern Ireland, it is important to announce the trip soon and to confirm your intention to visit Belfast.

One complicating factor affecting the British portion of your schedule is the fact that the Queen will be at Balmoral Castle in Scotland throughout that period. She would not normally travel to London for an occasion which is not a State visit. The British have informally suggested, however, that the Queen would likely be pleased to host you for lunch or dinner at Balmoral. If it is logistically possible, it would be useful for you to see the Queen during your visit in order to forestall British press attempts to paint the Queen's nonparticipation as another alleged sign of chilly Anglo-American relations (as it attempted to do with the V-E Day commemoration events).

Afternoon: Fly or helicopter to Scotland

Golf

Evening: Informal family dinner with the Queen at Balmoral

RON Scotland (alternatively, return to London)

Sunday, October 1

Morning: Fly or helicopter from Scotland to Belfast

Speech to university or other young audience in Belfast

Reception with Northern Ireland political and community leaders, preceded by short meeting with James Molyneaux and John Hume, leaders of Northern Ireland's two largest political parties.

Visit to Cassidy family ancestral home (in Northern Ireland on the border with the Republic).

Afternoon: Helicopter to Dublin

Golf with Irish Prime Minister Bruton

Evening: Dinner hosted by PM Bruton or President Robinson

RON Dublin

Monday, October 2

Morning: Meeting with Irish opposition leader Bertie Aherne

Mid-Day: Depart Dublin for Washington
