BODY:

DOE'S NOMINEE FOR ASSISTANT SECRETARY FOR CONGRESSIONAL AFFAIRS last week promised to help DOE and a Republican-led Congress find ''common ground'' on a range of issues affecting the agency. Derrick <Forrister,> nominated earlier this year to replace William Taylor as assistant secretary for congressional and intergovernmental affairs, appeared Thursday before the <Senate> Energy Committee. The panel is expected to approve <Forrister's> nomination at its Oct. 11 business meeting.

<Forrister,> who joined DOE in 1993 as a policy adviser to Energy Secretary Hazel O'Leary, and worked for six years as an aide to former Tennessee Democratic Rep. Jim Cooper, said his congressional experience has shown him that the ''largest contributions to good public policy were always made in bipartisan coalitions.''

'My approach is to always look for opportunities to build alliances wherever possible and to find middle ground. I believe that this is what the American people desire most of their leaders today -- less argument and more genuine cooperation that gets the work of government done. If confirmed for this position, I offer you and the secretary a dedication to find common ground, the creativity to pursue it and the strategic capability to advance solutions to benefit the people of this great nation.'

The committee also heard testimony from Charles Burton, a former adviser on energy issues to President Clinton. Burton was nominated to serve as a member of the board of directors of the U.S. Enrichment Corp. Two Interior Dept. nominees also testified: Patricia Beneke, nominated for assistant secretary for water and science (related story elsewhere in this issue), and Eluid Martinez, nominated for commissioner of the agency's Bureau of Reclamation.

Assemblywoman Donna Ferrara

Biography

Donna Ferrara, representing the 15th District, was elected to the New York State Assembly in 1992.

The Assemblywoman is currently the Ranking Republican Member of the Assembly Committee on Tourism, Arts, and Sports Development and serves on the Assembly Judiciary and Housing Committees. Ms. Ferrara is a member of the New York State and Nassau County Bar Associations and the Columbian Lawyers Association. She is also a member of the Board of Directors of Adelphi University School of Social Work.

Assemblywoman Ferrara received her Juris Doctorate in 1984 from the St. John's University School of Law. She received her B.A. as a Dean's List student from the State University of New York at Albany, where she received degrees in English and Business.

Ms. Ferrara began her career as a Legislative Aide to Senator Norman Levy in Albany. Upon admission to the New York State Bar, Ms. Ferrara served as a Legislative Counsel to Senator Kemp Hannon on Long Island. She then went on to serve as Deputy Town Attorney for the Town of Hempstead, as the Town's Freedom of Information Officer. She was Counsel to both the Map Committee and the Department of Planning and Economic Development. Ms. Ferrara represented the Town of Hempstead in foreclosure actions, bankruptcies, and acquisition and sale of real property.

During her first legislative term, Assemblywoman Ferrara was responsible for landmark statewide legislation prohibiting discrimination by insurance companies against breast cancer victims. Ms. Ferrara was the 1994 recipient of the Nassau county League of Women Voters Women's Leadership Award.

Ms. Ferrara is married to Robert Gregory, Chief of Staff to the County of Nassau.

Dear Mr. Griffin,

I'm sure that by now you have at least skimmed through the 21-page resume for Dr. Pascal D. Forgione, Jr., who is being considered for appointment as Director of National Educational Statistics. Without attempting to summarize all 21 pages, I want simply to tell you that unlike some padded resumes we both have seen, Forgione's resume is the record of an extraordinarily productive and accomplished career in education.

Forgione is real, and it is at the cost of great potential sacrifice to my state of Delaware, where he is at present our much-admired State Superintendent of Public Instruction, that I give him my enthusiastic, unqualified endorsement.

Working from a battery of two undergraduate degrees, two master's degrees and a Stanford Ph.D. in Administration and Policy Analysis, Forgione has worked as a classroom teacher, an assistant principal, a professor of education and a district superintendent before taking on Delaware's top job in education in 1991. But educational research has been his special strength, and he has worked at and directed research for more than half of his very distinguished career. He would be very much at home, in every way, in dealing with educational statistics at the national level.

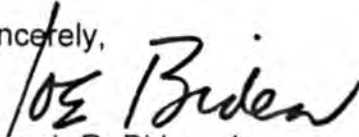
He would bring to the job of Director of National Educational Statistics a unique and sophisticated understanding of education from the challenge of the classroom to the creation of policy, at every level from the local school district to Washington itself, where he served in 1991 as Executive Director of the National Education Goals Panel and as a consultant to the U.S. Office of Education as far back as 1972. He is fully up to speed on the critical issues and developments in education, and he has demonstrated a rare ability to work with policy-makers to create and fulfill a vision of excellence and equity in education.

I have known and admired Pat Forgione since he arrived in Delaware. He is a man of enormous intellect and imagination who has led Delaware education well through some difficult years -- but the best thing I can say about him is that his very considerable success, in Delaware and elsewhere, has been based, more than anything else, on his engaging personality and his great strength of character. Whatever the challenge, he meets it in stride and carries others with him willingly on his way.

I believe he is a superior candidate for the job of Director of National Educational Statistics, and I hope he may receive favorable consideration for appointment.

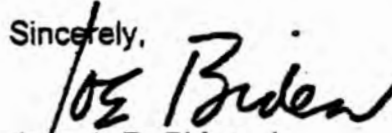
