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Dear Friends,

We are pleased to present to you the 1992 Annual Report of the AIDS Resource Center of Wisconsin, Inc. (ARCW). It is a report that demonstrates sound financial management, unprecedented expansion of service delivery, and enormous dedication of volunteers and professional staff in the face of the relentless HIV epidemic.

A highlight of 1992 was the creation of the Northwest Wisconsin AIDS Project in Eau Claire and the affiliation of the Wisconsin Community-Based Research Consortium, bringing two new agencies to ARCW which dramatically expanded our service delivery throughout Wisconsin.

Our three AIDS service organizations reached nearly 100,000 people through diverse HIV prevention programs and experienced a 26 percent increase in HIV clientele while responding to a record increase in support services requests from individuals with HIV disease. The clinical research efforts of the Consortium took shape as three new clinical drug trials were begun.

All of this could not have been accomplished without a highly professional staff of 72 full time employees and more than 600 wonderfully dedicated volunteers. We are truly blessed by the talents, energy and courage of those who have made a personal commitment to the important work of ARCW.

We are particularly pleased that the new ARCW affiliations and the enormous expansion of our prevention, client support, and research services were accomplished once again with a balanced budget. For the fourth consecutive year we exceeded our fund development goal by raising over one million dollars from the private sector. We invite you to review the financial statements in this report and we assure you that ARCW will continue to be financially well managed.

The AIDS Resource Center of Wisconsin, Inc. continues to lead the State's response to the HIV epidemic. This vital leadership role gained national recognition in 1992 with ARCW's selection as a member of the national AIDS Action Council Board of Directors, the most powerful AIDS lobby in the country. ARCW is committed to providing continued leadership in AIDS research, prevention and support services. We are determined to be prepared for the enormous demands that will be placed on our communities by the HIV epidemic in the years ahead.

Thank you for your support of the important work we do. We look forward to your continued trust and partnership as we work together to meet the enormous challenges of the HIV epidemic.
