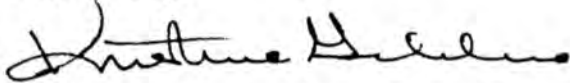

Re: Activators for Anti-HIV Drugs

I am enclosing a copy of an old letter from CDC and of the Lancet report - for the sole purpose of indicating my long-term interest in the subject.

More recently, I have developed a systemic therapy for suppressing the apparent "mutation" of microorganisms when confronted with repeated doses of adversary chemicals.

Briefly, unicellular microorganisms have an enzyme/substrate "couple" which are required for the viability of such microorganisms. This couple can be disrupted by the presence of the fluoride anion (in the bloodstream), and thus viruses and retro-viruses can be weakened.

I enclose herewith a partial list of enzymes and substrates. During the past year, I obtained a Copyright entitled "The Systemic Use of Fluorides in Non-Dental Therapy". The number of this Copyright registration is 536 347, and date was 8-11-92.

As an illustration, I enclose copy of an anti-malarial test performed by an Agency of the U.S. Government at the request of BRI (i.e. Biomedical Research Institute), and also my card at BRI. For the record, BRI is funded for research by several Agencies of our Government, but the said research is wholly unrelated to the subject matter of this letter. The "Drug BRI #3 is sodium fluoride (reagent grade).

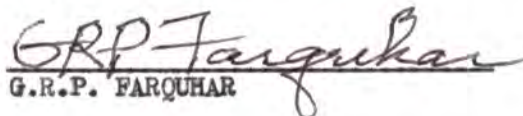
If an activator is not used, the enzyme/substrate system will defend itself by producing enzymes to destroy the antibiotic (i.e. this appears to be the mechanism of so-called "mutations" and of drug-resistant types of germs). This process is not unique to HIV!

All enclosures are stapled together in the order mentioned above.

What I am seeking is this: arranging (hopefully) with NIH/NCI for in-vitro tests of AZT against HIV - with and without sodium fluoride (i.e. the latter in the dosage prescribed by BRI).

I will appreciate hearing from you or your designate.

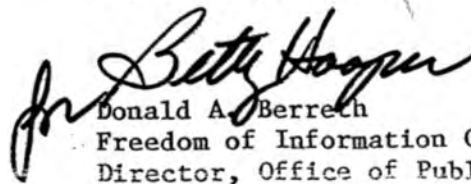

INACTIVATION OF HTLV-III/LAV-INFECTED CULTURES OF NORMAL HUMAN LYMPHOCYTES BY NONOXYNOL-9 IN VITRO

SIR,—Chemical, heat, and pH inactivation of HTLV-III/LAV in vitro have been reported.^{1,2} Nonoxynol-9, a non-ionic surfactant, is a chemical ingredient of several spermicides. In vitro, spermicides inhibit the growth of several microbes, including herpes simplex virus.³⁻⁷ We describe here the in vitro inactivation of HTLV-III/LAV by nonoxynol-9.

Peripheral blood lymphocytes from HTLV-III antibody negative volunteers not in any AIDS risk group were separated by density-gradient centrifugation. The culture medium was RPMI 1640 supplemented with 100 U/ml penicillin, 50 µg/ml streptomycin, 2 mmol/l L-glutamine, 10% heat-inactivated fetal bovine serum, and 10 µg/ml phytohaemagglutinin. Cells were incubated at 37°C in 5% carbon dioxide. After 3 days, the cells were washed twice with phosphate-buffered saline (pH 7.2). The cell pellet was then incubated with HTLV-III (reverse transcriptase activity [RT] 10⁵ per 2 × 10⁶ cells) for 30 min at 37°C in 5 ml of the above medium to which interleukin 2, 0.04% v/v sheep anti-interferon, and 0.02 µg/ml polybrene had been added, and cells were then suspended in this medium at a concentration of 10⁶/ml and incubated. Supernatant fluids were harvested by sequential centrifugation on days 2, 4, 8, 10, and 12 and stored at -70°C.

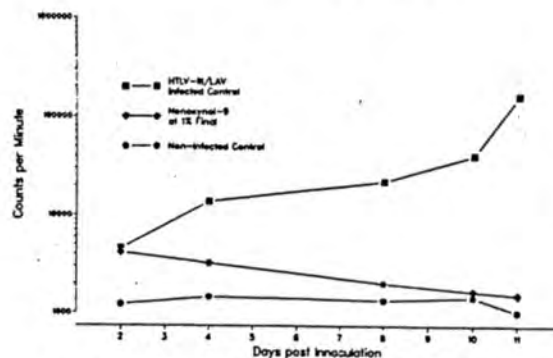
A microculture system was used to titrate infectious HTLV-III.^{2,3} RT assays⁴ were done on days 2, 4, 8, 10, and 12 on cells treated with nonoxynol-9 immediately after inoculation. The RT assay used Mg⁺⁺ as the cation and poly(rA)·poly(dT)₁₂₋₁₈ as the template primer. Assays were done in duplicate. Nonoxynol-9, in the concentrations used, did not interfere with the RT assay. Nonoxynol-9 treated and untreated HTLV-III infected cell cultures were used as negative and positive controls, respectively. Treatment of HTLV-III with nonoxynol-9 at final concentrations of 0.05% (v/v) or greater resulted in undetectable virus by the ID₅₀ assay (table). Toxicity controls suggested that 2.5% (v/v) nonoxynol-9 and lower concentrations were appropriate for ID₅₀ determinations.

To assess the effect of the cytotoxicity of nonoxynol-9 on the RT assay pure nonoxynol-9 was diluted to 50%, 25%, 10%, 5%, and 1% with RPMI 1640 (v/v) and added to actively growing uninfected PHA-stimulated normal human lymphocytes. A 5% solution of nonoxynol-9 significantly reduced lymphocyte viability and thus

the RT activity of infected cultures. At a 1% concentration about 65% of the cells remained viable throughout the experiment.

The RT activity of HTLV-III infected, nonoxynol-9 treated cultures was significantly less than that of untreated infected cultures (figure). Cultures were monitored for RT activity for 25 days.

Thus nonoxynol-9 at concentrations of 0.05% or more inactivated HTLV-III in vitro, while 1% or more reduced the live counts of the target lymphocytes. Commercially available spermicides contain 1-5% nonoxynol-9 and are often included in contraceptive jellies and foams used by women in combination with a diaphragm. Sexual transmission of HTLV-III via sperm may account for some cases of AIDS and when prevention is being considered a protective effect of nonoxynol-9 containing spermicides should be assessed.

I just heard of a possible solution to our rising AIDs population: treat them as lepers! Ship them off to a South Pacific island with treatment facilities. I am sure Christian organizations would rally to the cause.

Leprosy is no longer a fatal disease. Yet, until a few years ago, when a person was diagnosed as having leprosy, that person had to leave home immediately for the National Leprosarium, a government facility in Carville, Louisiana. Leviticus 13 gives detailed instructions regarding diagnosis and disposition of a leper. A diagnosis will be made, and if certain symptoms are present, the man is "defiled and must live outside the camp."

The Columbia Encyclopedia says: "Leprosy is not a highly communicable disease Laws concerning the segregation of lepers date from about the 7th century. Leprosariums or retreats to which lepers were sent were established in most countries; these were a factor in stamping out the epidemic, and by the end of the 16th century, it was no longer a scourge."

The Random House Dictionary of the English Language defines "plague" as "an epidemic disease of high mortality." Leprosy no longer fits this definition due to strict controls.

I taught the Bible to lepers in Japan in the early 1950's. After the initial shock of the disease and the prospect of isolation, they learn to adjust to their new surroundings and become content. There is a hospital on the compound for those who need medical care, and cabins for husbands and wives. Children are removed from their parents. Children who do have leprosy live in a special area.

I think we should consider this alternative and take immediate action to implement it. Thank you for your consideration.

On Hawaii's Niihau, Present-Day Life Is A Relic of the Past

Tiny Island Lacks Plumbing,
Electricity, Paved Roads
And, for Now, Tourists

OFFSHORE NIIHAU, Hawaii — For more than 120 years, offshore has been about as close as most people can get to Niihau, also known as the "Forbidden Island." But soon that may change.

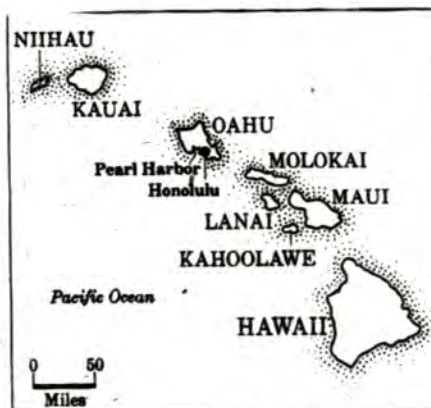
Only natives are allowed to live on this tiny, arid outpost of the Hawaiian Islands, about 150 miles from Honolulu. Access to Niihau is tightly restricted by its owners, brothers Bruce and Keith Robinson, whose ancestor paid a Hawaiian king \$10,000 for it in 1864.

Since then, the Robinsons, who themselves live on the island of Kauai, 17 miles away, have isolated Niihau. While Maui has malls and Oahu has 23 Burger Kings, Niihau is without electricity, plumbing or phones. Niihau is the only place left in the world where the predominant language is Hawaiian.

Source of Controversy

About 250 natives live on the 73-square-mile island, most working on the Robinsons' cattle and sheep ranch. Guns, alcohol and cigarettes are forbidden. There is no doctor, no jail, no paved roads. Once a week, a World War II barge brings supplies. Disputes are settled by community leaders, including the head of the island's Congregational church. On Niihau, hula dances are performed for pleasure, not tourists.

But tourists may soon descend on the island, a prospect that is a source of some controversy among Hawaiians. Bruce Robinson, who runs the Niihau ranch, is seeking a permit to allow helicopter landings on Niihau. The permit is necessary because of zoning regulations. Mr. Robinson's plan is to take tourists from Kauai to



Niihau by helicopter; he has said he will also use the craft for Niihau's medical emergencies. He has said further that he will land on remote parts of the island and won't let tourists mingle with natives.

The Office of Hawaiian Affairs, a state agency created to further native interests, protested the proposed tours, saying they would disrupt the very way of life the Robinsons have fought to protect. After the Robinsons agreed to certain restrictions, the agency withdrew formal opposition but will monitor the situation for one year if the permit is granted.

"What are they selling? A look at barren land, rocks and kiawe trees?" asks Moses Kapalekalahao Keale Sr., the chairman of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs. Mr. Keale, who was born on Niihau but no longer lives there, adds: "Pretty soon, those tourists are going to say, 'Where are those people who speak Hawaiian? I want to see them.' It's like seeing animals in the zoo."

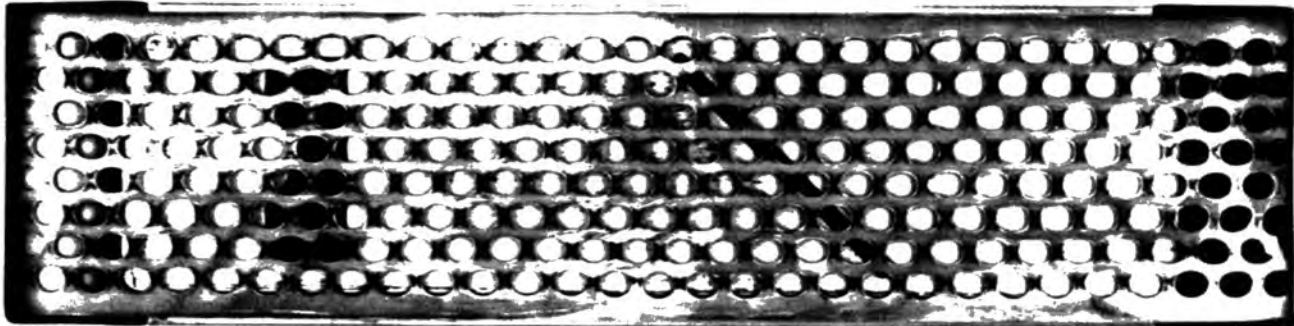
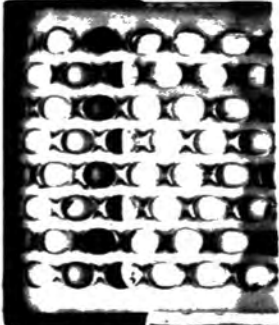
Hearings on the matter are currently being held before the Kauai County Planning Commission. Outside those hearings, the Robinsons don't say much about Niihau. Bruce Robinson declined to be interviewed for this article; Keith Robinson was willing to talk, at length—but only about the fact that he is now personally

Along with so many others, I want to send my congratulations to you on your appointment as AIDS Policy Coordinator in President Clinton's Administration. I probably have more understanding of the position than most, since I was considered as one of the candidates during the past few weeks. It is a wonderfully exciting and challenging position and I wish you the very best. I would like to offer my help in any way that you might feel is useful as you develop the position and work towards a focused and clear national HIV/AIDS policy.

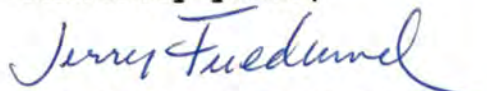
As I thought about the position myself, it seemed to me that the major priorities were 1) revisiting the entire area of prevention and behavior with particular attention to both altering community norms about sex and drugs and developing targeted, focused and explicit programs in highest risk communities 2) ensuring that the huge and growing number of people living with HIV disease will have the resources for comprehensive, compassionate and cost effective care over the next decade. 3) readdressing our nation's "War on Drugs," in light of the HIV epidemic and other health hazards associated with drug use. A strategy of harm reduction and shifting the emphasis on law enforcement to prevention and harm reduction as the theme for national drug abuse policy is crucial since this remains the motor driving the HIV epidemic in this country. 4) discrimination in all forms related to HIV and 5) support for the laboratory, clinical trial and epidemiologic research communities at the NIH and CDC. These have been strong islands of advocacy and accomplishment during the epidemic. I have felt that it was important for the CDC to be unfettered and to allow the public health professionals there to do their job

without political interference, as well as to emphasize more attention to the issue of drug abuse.

I hope that you will have adequate resources to do the job and that access to the President will be available to you directly. The unusual relationship between the White House position and HHS support staff seemed like a stumbling block to me but I hope that you will be able to overcome it, particularly with Patsy Fleming and Phil Lee as strong AIDS advocates at HHS.

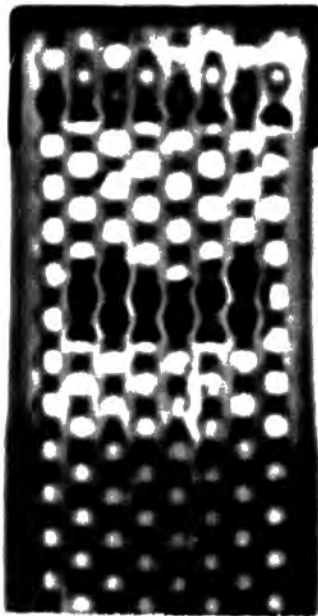
My own work in HIV/AIDS has largely been clinical and epidemiologic. I have focused on issues of HIV transmission, as you may know, particularly among injection drug users and poor inner-city populations as well as provision of comprehensive services in this setting. Although I spent the majority of the HIV epidemic in the Bronx, my work in New Haven is quite similar and we have developed an excellent comprehensive clinical program, interesting and innovative epidemiologic and policy work and are involved in clinical trials and behavioral studies. I believe that you know my colleagues Ed Kaplan and Peter Selwyn who join me in congratulating you in your new position, and again offer our help and support in any way that you might deem useful.

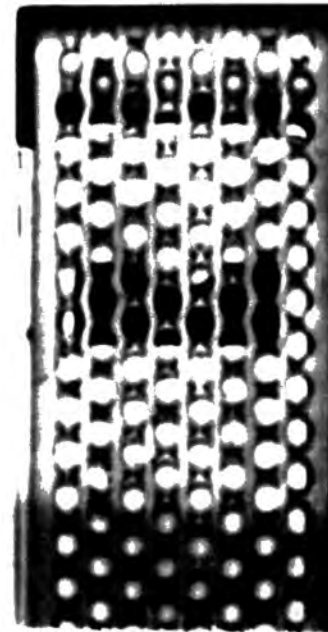

Recommendations for Health Care Reform

Many Americans enjoy the best health care in the world, and 85% of all Americans have some form of private or public health insurance.

However, an estimated 35 million men, women and children do not have health insurance. Still others worry that their health insurance coverage will be reduced, interrupted or discontinued due to escalating costs or loss of employment. At the same time, the national cost of health care currently is 14% of the Gross Domestic Product and is increasing at an unacceptable rate.

As the world's largest and most diversified health care company, Johnson & Johnson is committed to the health care goals of *improving access, slowing cost increases, maintaining quality and preserving innovation.*

We believe that these objectives can best be furthered through combined government and private sector efforts that include improved incentives for employers and individuals to purchase cost-effective benefit plans, development of managed competition, reduction of administrative and liability costs that neither increase access nor improve patient well-being, and creation of a core benefit plan.

We believe that all Americans, regardless of income, should have access to a core of health care services at an affordable cost. This would increase health security for those who fear inadequate coverage in the event of serious illness.

We believe that a system of managed competition has the potential to improve access, contribute to a gradual slowing of health care cost increases, help maintain quality, and provide people with more responsibility for their own health care.

Managed competition is a concept in which a limited number of organizations, representing providers of health care services, would compete for members among groups and individuals based on negotiated rates, price and quality of care. These organizations would be required to accept all individuals who apply, expanding their risk pools and spreading their liabilities over large population groups. Partnerships of employers and employees would form large purchasing cooperatives to negotiate the lowest price for a basic core of health care benefits. Individuals would have a choice among competing plans.

Within the context of managed competition, we support the development of a core benefit plan, including pharmaceuticals, that would be established by an independent body of experts. There should be an increased emphasis on the prevention of disease and on primary care, with priority given to children and pregnant women.

We do not support global budgets or expenditure targets. We do not believe that the way to contain costs is to simply put a limit or "cap" on expenditures. Efforts to use such a so-called global budget do not address the underlying factors that drive the demand for health care services and which cause costs to rise.

It is essential that any new health system reforms preserve our distinctively American leadership in medical research and innovation. Johnson & Johnson supports a health care system that is committed to a sustained level of governmental and private support for innovation and research in biomedical and health services. Despite our current financial burdens, society simply cannot afford to sacrifice the enormous contributions of future research and new technologies that will save millions of lives and ultimately reduce the cost of health care over the long term.

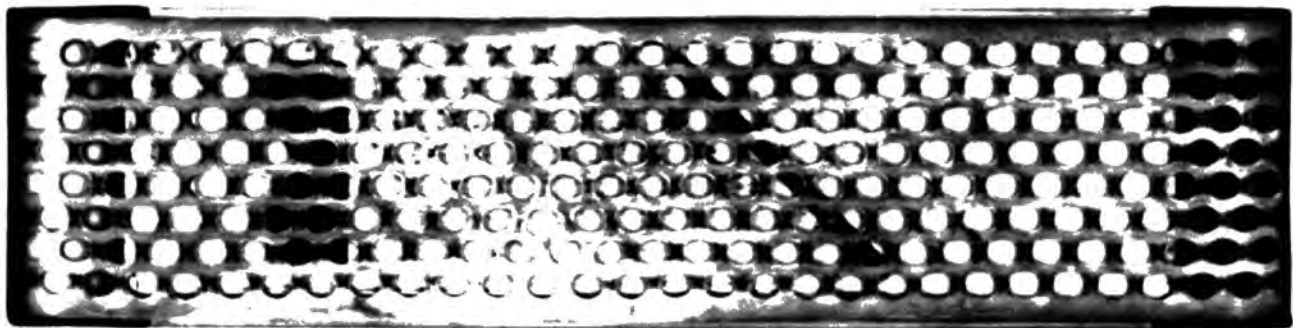

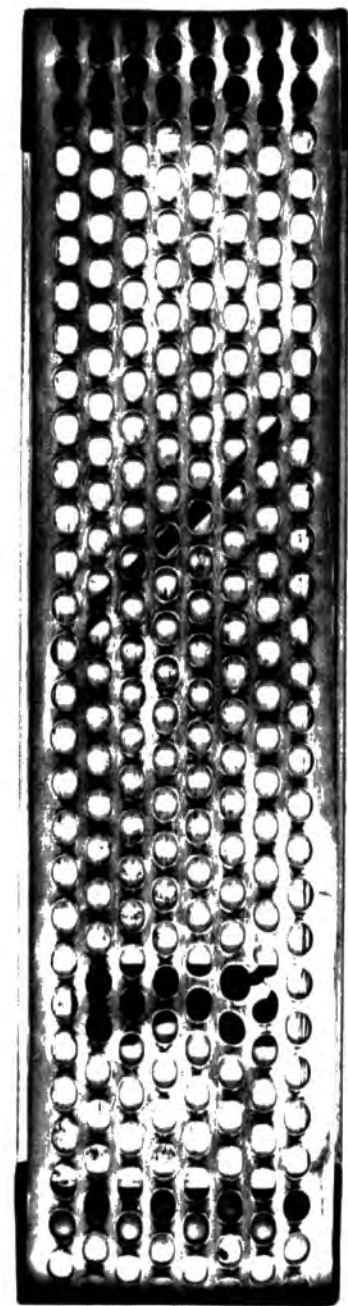
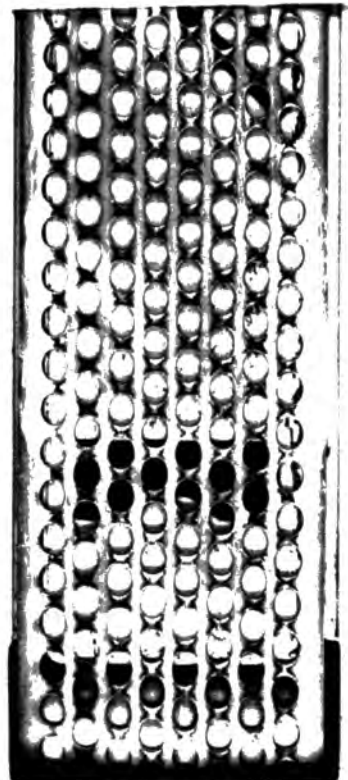

Congratulations on your appointment as White House Aids Coordinator. You are indeed being hurled "into the maelstrom" of the Aids issues as today's NY Times' articles describe it.

What brings this letter is seeing the article next to yours, "Experts Change guides on using HIV drugs." Dr. Fauci of the NIH and Dr. Saude's panel are being forced to admit publicly that AZT is not all its cracked up to be, only because of the Concorde Study* which was conducted independently of the NIH and the American Burroughs-Wellcome company. This is not news to many of us who have known the history of AZT and how toxic it proved to be decades ago when it was tried as a drug for cancer and then retired from use.

The outrageous, angering thought that Fauci and the NIH worked in complicity with Burroughs-Wellcome to encourage Aids patients to spend their money and ruin what was left of their immune systems makes many of us suspicious of the U.S. government's involvement in this crisis.

The AIDS epidemic is not, or should not be, a game of power and money. As you know, many people are suffering and dying out here, and what we have seen from the Reagan and Bush administrations towards solving this epidemic has been truly pathetic and immoral.

One might have reservations about the tactics and the methods of groups like ACT-UP; however, they truly understand the urgency of this crisis and the lies and politics being foisted on the American people by the government here and by the big money pharmaceutical companies.

What defies understanding is how stupid and uninformed our AMA doctors have been during this decade. For all his emotionalism and angry outbursts, I laud Larry Kramer and people like him, for these people are trying to shock Americans and their U.S. government in Washington out of their deep sleep, their homophobia and their complacency with what the NIH has fed them — propaganda and lies.

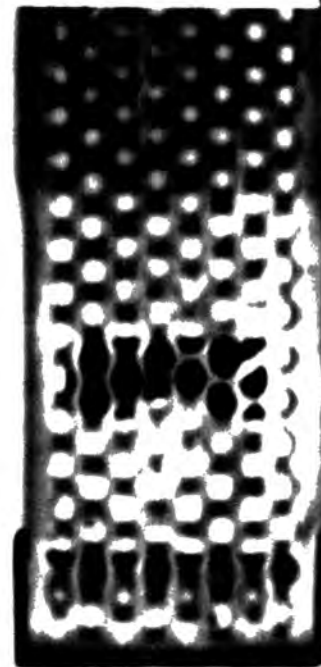
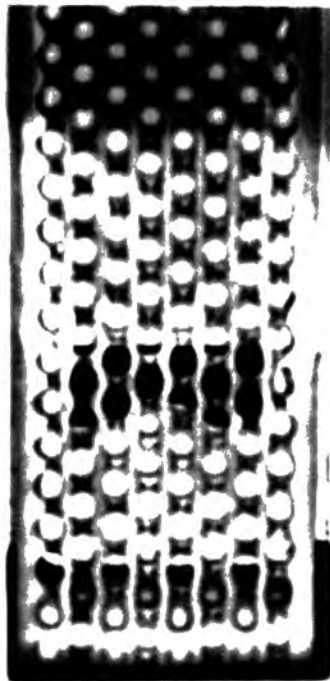

Gebbie first heard of AIDS as health officer for Oregon

■ The nation's first policy coordinator for the disease is known for her pioneering work in the field

WASHINGTON — Kristine Gebbie first read about the outbreak of mysterious, dark lesions called Kaposi's sarcoma in medical digests in early 1981.

The disease that caused them had no name. It seemed confined to a cluster of dying gay men in California, far from her office in downtown Portland.

"I remember thinking about those poor folks in California," Gebbie said Friday. "I was not thinking then that this was truly a national event."

The AIDS epidemic was just beginning. Gebbie was about to become deeply involved in the fight against it. The first case in Oregon

was diagnosed just months later. By 1984, there were 23 cases in the state. Over the next decade, the figure would grow tenfold: As of March 31, AIDS, or acquired immune deficiency syndrome, had been diagnosed in 289,320 Americans. A little more than 63 percent, or 182,275, have died since June 1, 1981, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

President Clinton recalled Gebbie's career Friday in the Rose Garden of the White House as he named her the nation's first AIDS policy coordinator.

"She hails from the Northwest, one of our nation's most progressive regions when it comes to

health care," Clinton said. "She will bring to our administration years of experience in the AIDS field. She'll work hard to make sure our nation no longer ignores an epidemic that has already claimed so many of our brothers and sisters, our friends and our colleagues."

Gebbie's job will be to oversee and coordinate the government's sometimes unfocused campaign against the AIDS epidemic.

"How well she will do depends completely on how much authority the president intends to give her," said David Rogers, vice chairman of the National Commission on AIDS, a government-sponsored group.

The road from Oregon to the Rose Garden was long and bumpy. Friends of Gebbie say she recognized the seriousness of the disease early, working closely with the late state epidemiologist Dr. Larry Foster, who died of cancer last year. She and Foster fought to get others to share their passion to fight AIDS.

"She ruffled feathers," said former Gov. Bob Straub, who first hired Gebbie from her job as a hospital administrator in St. Louis to head the Oregon Health Division in

"She was very determined to increase our efforts to deal with the AIDS problem," Straub said. "There was annoyance on the part of some people that she seemed overly concerned. At the beginning, most of us didn't recognize the serious problems."

"She has some steel in her," Straub said.

In Oregon, Gebbie started an advisory commission to come up with standards for AIDS testing. She sought other measures to prevent discrimination against those who tested positive. Much of her work was pioneering. She got to know victims such as Paul Starr, the former director of the Cascade AIDS Project, who died in January.

She carried her commitment to fight AIDS to Washington in 1989

where she went to become the state's top health official. She stayed there until February. She's been chairwoman of an AIDS advisory panel for the Centers for Disease Control since 1989.

The process for selecting the new AIDS czar was arduous. A long list of candidates was considered. And several reportedly rejected the job. "I was the last one standing," Gebbie said Friday.

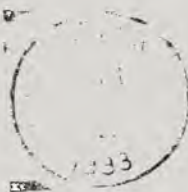
Several AIDS advocacy groups praised her selection Friday as did Northwest political leaders. But others questioned privately whether she would have the access or the political savvy to have an impact on controversial issues such as increasing sex education in the schools, increasing AIDS funding and speeding up approval of anti-AIDS drugs.

Gebbie said she had worked with politicians for 15 years, but acknowledged she would have to learn more about Washington politics.

"There are huge expectations about what a person in this position can do. They are unrealistic as far as time frame or scope," she said. "I just hope too many people don't become discouraged too fast."

Dear President Clinton and First Lady Hillary,

Hello, my name is Forrest, I'm HIV+(for about 5 years) and I'm Gay. This is how I begin my talks as a speaker in the Frontline Program. I know you believe in education and that you would like to stop the spread of AIDS. Clearly you have yet another tough fight ahead.

I am hoping that by sharing a brief description of our Frontline Program here in Washoe County (Reno-Sparks) Nevada, it will perhaps give you a sample of an AIDS Education Program that we feel is working well.

Our goals are to talk to teens, as well as other community groups to share our experiences as HIV+ people or people with AIDS. We believe and feel that putting a face to the disease, by sharing our personal stories and feelings, that we can give the teenagers some emotions and ideas to take with them which will hopefully have a positive impact on their future.

We have currently intragrated our HIV+/AIDS speakers into the 9th. grade Sex Ed Class throughout the county as a supplement to their current AIDS Education. I can honestly tell you we had to fight for 2 yrs. against conservative school board members and against even more conservative moralistic groups in our area. I'm sure you can sympathize with these problems!!

From our point of view, the program is going well. We say this by observing the way generally rowdy teens sit quietly and listen and sometimes even cry; also by the very concerned and "deep" questions that they ask us about our lives, hopes, and feelings and still further, by the hundreds, now thousands of letters the teens have written to us telling us in their own words what they felt and learned and how they will at least consider to change their future behaviors.

To date, since 1989, we have spoken to approximately 4,000 teens and adults. In the next school year alone we will talk to approximately 6,300 9th. graders throughout Washoe County as well as talks we will give to surrounding rural areas, community groups, and religious groups, class and monthly talks at local juvenile detention facilities.

I know that as President and First Lady you are soooooo busy and certainly cannot begin to read all the mail that arrives daily, but I must hope with all sincerely that this letter will get to you personally. Clearly this is a matter of life and death. Two of our own speakers have died since the program started. Sadly, it is a job without much viable security, yet the benefits, of sharing ourselves to help others I believe to be beyond measure. If I may be of any further assistance with oither input or information, please feel free to contact me at anytime.

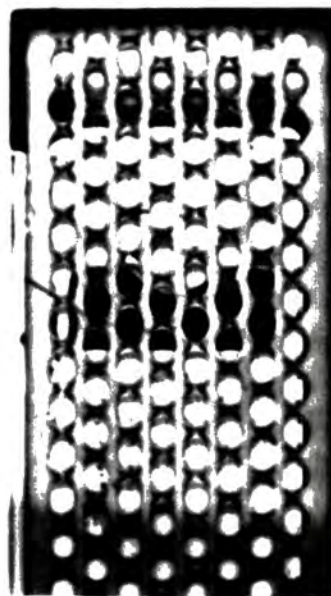
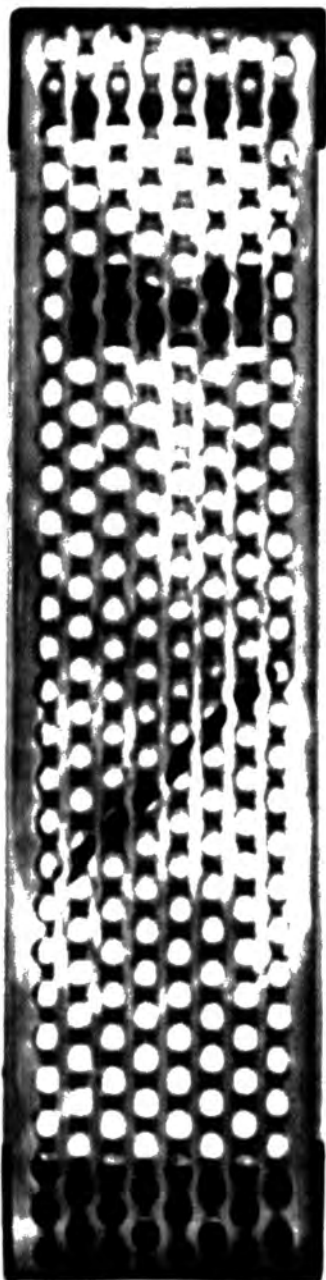
