GAYS IN MAINSTREAM MEDIA MEET IN NEW YORK

The meeting of 500 lesbian and gay journalists at the Grand Hyatt (September 10-12) is small as conferences go in New York-- but they've managed to attract some very big names. HUD Undersecretary Roberta Achtenberg; AIDS Czar Kristine Gebbie; TV anchors Tom Brokaw, Robert MacNeil, Dan Rather, and Judy Woodruff; the 6th Army's ex-Soldier of the Year Jose Zuniga; and Times' publisher Arthur Sulzberger, Jr. will speak to the assembled print, radio and TV reporters, editors, and writers.

The occasion is the 2nd annual conference of the three-year old National Lesbian and Gay Journalists Association whose 700 members have organized 16 chapters from Anchorage, Alaska to Miami, Florida. The conference kicks off with a reception Friday hosted by Sulzberger, after which the television news anchors hold forth at a panel chaired by New York chapter head Charles Kaiser. Still later Friday HBO will present a sneak preview of "And the Band Played On...", the made-for-TV movie starring Matthew Modine based on Randy Shilts' best selling book.

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An unprecedented Job Fair runs all day Friday where, for the first time, non-gay news media will recruit lesbians and gays. The list of twenty participants reads like the Who's Who of U.S. news organizations: The New York Times, Associated Press, Gannett, The Washington Post, Boston Globe, Star Tribune (Minneapolis), The Los Angeles Times, ABC, NBC, AP-Broadcast, Network 1, The Detroit Free Press, Dallas Morning News, Newsday, The Hartford Courant, National Public Radio, The American Lawyer Magazine, The Philadelphia Inquirer, The Philadelphia Daily News, and The Chicago Sun Times.

When the journalists aren't scouting the Job Fair or listening to featured speakers they'll be sampling the 17 panels on subjects ranging from the philosophical "Activists or Professionals," the pragmatic "Rural Gays and Lesbians," and the provocative, "Covering Sex."

The conference ends Sunday at a plenary session aptly titled "A View from the Top" chaired by Essence Magazine's Linda Villarosa. Five top news decision makers will react and respond to what they've seen and heard: William Ahearn, Associated Press; Robert Giles, editor/publisher, The Detroit News; Robert Murphy, senior vice president, ABC News; Geneva Overholser, editor, The Des Moines Register; and Pearl Stewart, editor, The Oakland Tribune.
