Metro System Time and Fare Information

To ride Metrorail, you must use a farecard to enter and exit the system. Each person must have a farecard. Farecard vendors, located in every station, accept nickels, dimes, quarters, \$1 and \$5 dollar bills. Some vendors also accept \$10 and \$20 dollar bills. No change is available in stations. Fares are based on the time of day and the distance traveled and are posted in buses and stations. Peak hours: 5:30 AM - 9:30 AM and 3 PM - 7 PM Monday through Friday. Off-peak hours are all other times and Federal holidays. Up to two children age 4 and younger travel free with a paying customer. For convenience, purchase sufficient fare for a round trip. To travel on Metrobus, you must have exact change for the fare. Operators do not carry cash and cannot make change.
