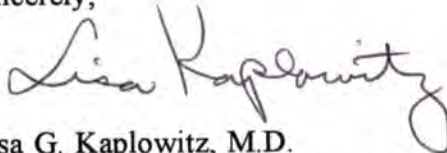

AIDS Ministry Provides More than a House - A Home - for People with AIDS

Since 1989, Richmond AIDS Ministry has operated the Guest House Program for people with AIDS. In the quiet suburbs of Henrico County and the diverse neighborhoods of the City of Richmond, people with AIDS have been welcomed by their neighbors. As 1993 comes to a close, Richmond AIDS Ministry prepares to expand their housing program to serve up to 16 people at the later stages of AIDS in two new homes being built in Richmond's Southside. Today, over 30 men and women are waiting for a bed in the Richmond AIDS Ministry Guest House Program. In addition to their health crisis, these individuals face the trials of their family being split apart, questions of child custody, financial burdens and quite often, isolation from the community because of their illness. In partnership with the current administration through the Department of Housing and Urban Development, Richmond AIDS Ministry hopes to provide a compassionate and cost-effective, community based response to the AIDS Crisis.

Immediately after the MAAETC advisory luncheon on December 8th, Kristine M. Gebbie, RN, MN, national AIDS Policy Coordinator, will tour the site of Steve's House, a Richmond AIDS Ministry Guest House currently under construction. Located at 6117 Billey Road, the house is one of two being constructed through a special pool of Section 811 funding through the Department of Housing and Urban Development. Richmond AIDS Ministry was one of only six agencies nationwide to receive this funding in 1992. The two eight-bed guest houses are scheduled to open in early 1994 and provide a home for up to eight people at the later stages of AIDS. Cathy Woodson, Housing Coordinator for Richmond AIDS Ministry, will lead short tour of the Guest House for Ms. Gebbie and the press.



Guest House Program

- * RAM is constructing 2 group homes for up to 8 adults at the later stages of AIDS.
- * These homes provide 3 meals daily and home health care 24 hours a day.
- * Volunteers will be available to help with personal care as well as provide companionship for the residents.
- * The funding for construction is from a special HIV-set aside pool of federal money (under the HUD Section 811 Program) made available in 1991 and 1992 only.
- * A local garden club will design the landscaping and garden areas. They are approximately 3,400 square feet. Each resident has a bedroom and a private toilet and sink. There is a dining room, living room and kitchen, two small sitting areas and space for volunteers and staff to work.
- * RAM has operated 5-bed and 3-bed Guest Houses since 1989.
- * Currently, 31 men and women are waiting for a bed in RAM's 3-bed home. Even with the two new houses the need will not be met. Of those waiting for space, 25% are women, many with children and 80% are African-American.
- * The Richmond AIDS Ministry Guest House Program is a cost-effective, community based response to housing for people with AIDS at less than \$100 daily.

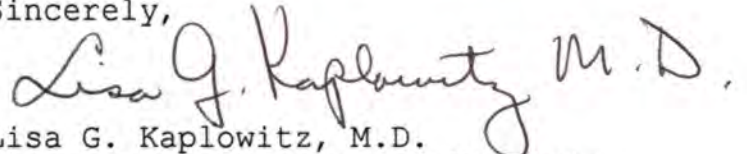
