- c.) Diagnosis
- d.) Treatment
- e.) Clinical Trials
- f.) Environment
- g.) Biotechnology
- h.) Legislation
- i.) Epidemiology
- j.) Basic Research
- k.) Health Care Delivery
- l.) Education (medical community & consumer)
- m.) Translational (research to medical use)
- n.) Information and Resource Allocation

Each break-out group will have a leader or leaders, science writer/scribe and possibly, a facilitator if we decide it is appropriate. Each group will be comprised of resource persons who are representative of various disciplines, points of view and organizations.

Resource materials will be provided to each invited participant in advance of the Conference that will include:

- a.) Commission Report
- b.) Coalition Document
- c.) National Cancer Institute's Action Plan
- d.) Defense Department materials
- e.) Inventories and Briefing Papers prepared by participating Federal agencies, foundations, organizations and industry.

At the conclusion of the break-out groups, we anticipate summations to be presented at the afternoon plenary session. Upon completion of the December 14th Conference, summary reports will be compiled and edited for a proceedings document to be provided to the Secretary within five days of the meeting.

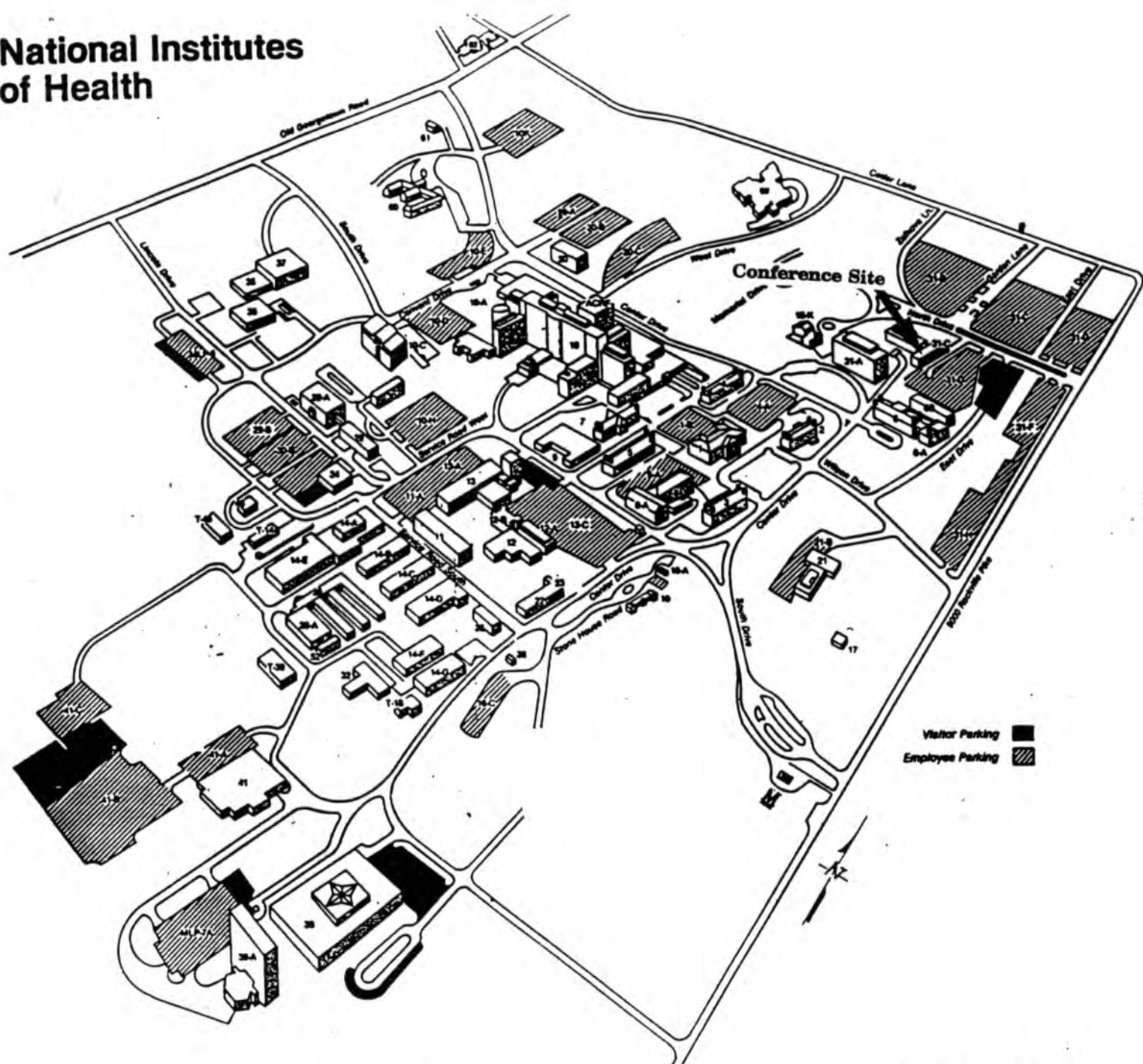
The goal of the December 14th Conference is to:

- d.) Confirm objectives, timelines and desired outcomes.

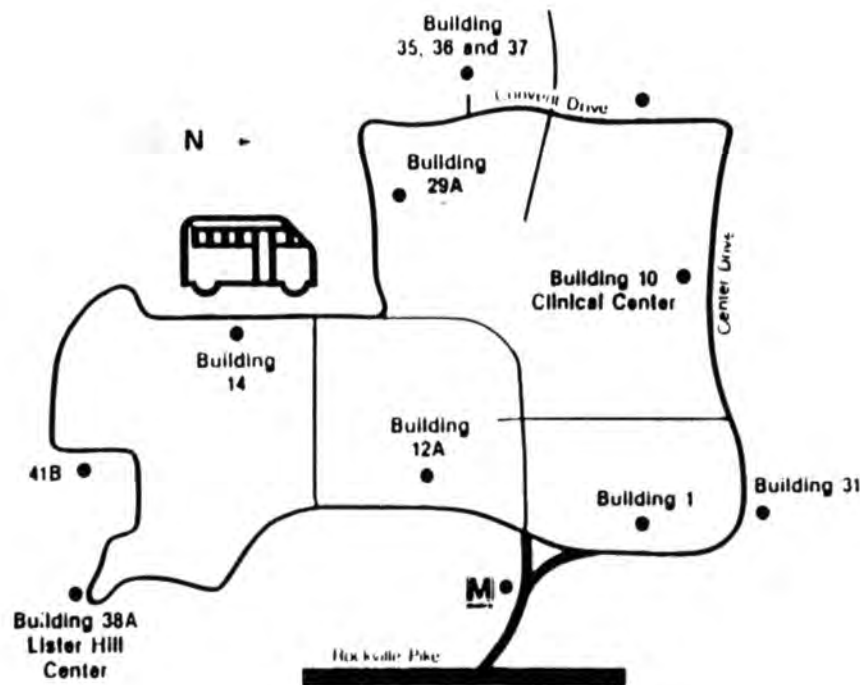
Attendees at the Secretary's Conference also will have access to a reference room. It will provide, for example:

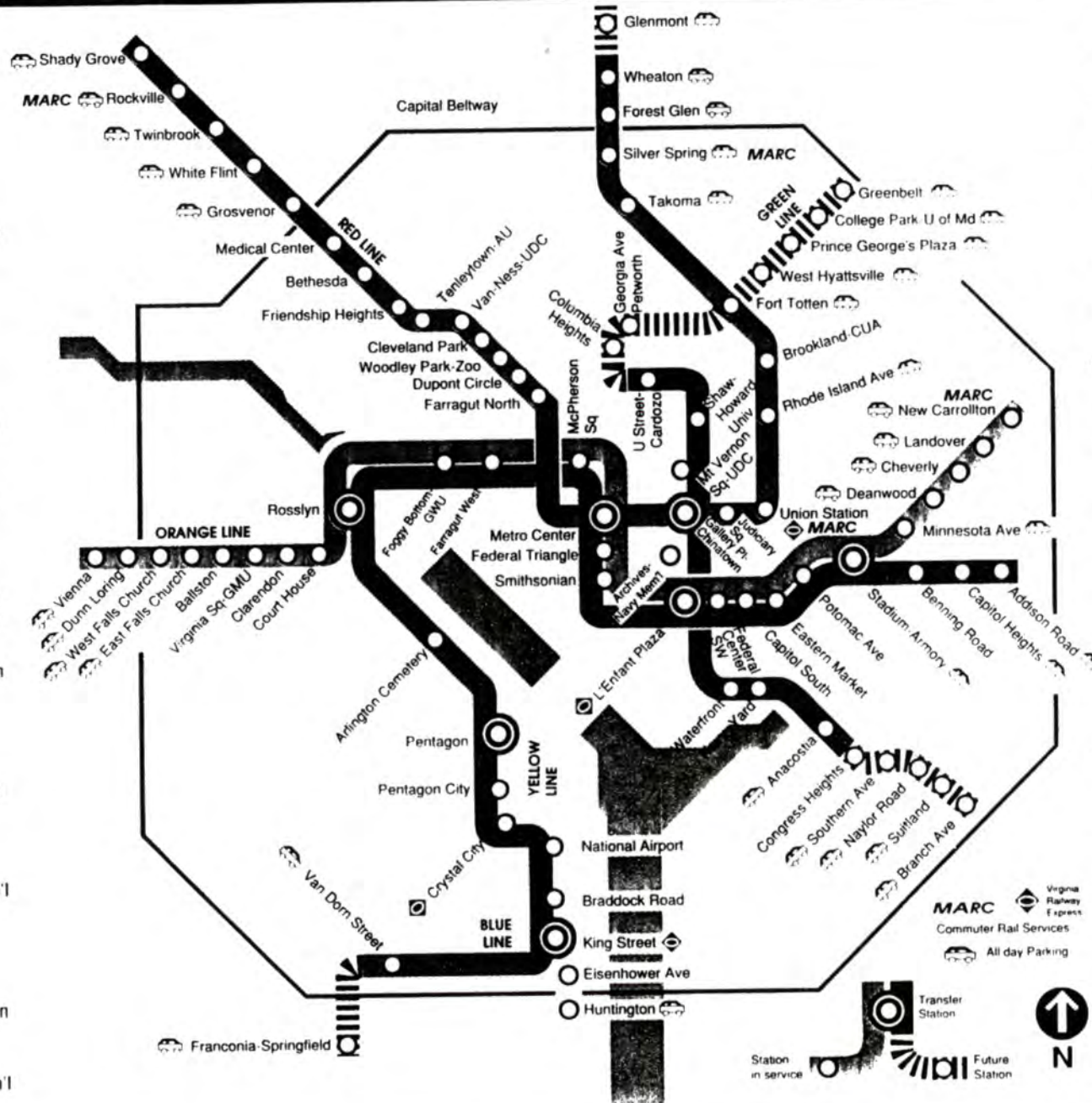
