EXECUTIVE SEARCH POSITION ANNOUNCEMENT:

Director, Division of Public Health State of Georgia

OVERVIEW

The Georgia Department of Human Resources is seeking a Director for the Division of Public Health. The position offers a challenging opportunity for an experienced individual to lead a major public health organization with program responsibilities for infant, child, and adult health as well as assessment and technical support.

The mission of the Division of Public Health is to provide leadership in the prevention of disease and injury and to assure conditions in which people can be healthy. DPH has an annual budget of \$244.5 million and 1100 employees. The central office is located in Atlanta. There are 19 district offices located throughout the state. In addition, DPH has contractual relationships with Georgia's 159 county health departments. The 3000 employees of these local health departments provide services to approximately 23 percent of the state's citizens each year.

The Department of Human Resources was created by the Georgia Legislature in 1972. A 15 member Board of Human Resources is appointed by the Governor to set policy and appoint the DHR Commissioner. The Commissioner appoints directors for the five divisions of the department -- Public Health, Aging Services, Family and Children Services, Rehabilitation Services and Mental Health/Mental Retardation/Substance Abuse.

ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The Director of the Division of Public Health will be responsible for planning, managing and evaluating all functions of the Division. This is a highly visible position, the issues involved are complex and controversial. The Director is expected to be an effective spokesperson for the Division and to help shape the debate surrounding health care reform and its impact in Georgia.

The Director must be able to articulate a vision of the purpose and direction of the Division and effectively translate this vision into policies and programs that meet the specific health needs of Georgia.

The Director must assure that the legal, moral, and ethical responsibilities of the Division are being met, including fiscal accountability, grants management, contract management, personnel administration, resource development, and program administration.

The Director must maintain and build upon the excellent communication process between the Division, District Health Directors, stakeholders, and advocates throughout the state.

THE CHALLENGE

The new Director will join the Division at a crucial time following two interim Directors. Strong permanent leadership is

critical to resolving the challenges and issues facing the Division. Health care reform, significant public health needs throughout the state, and political debate on where DPH best fits organizationally will require strong public health leadership.

A primary challenge of the position will be balancing the competing demands of serving as public decision-maker, public advocate, and public administrator with responsibility for state, district, and local office operations. The Director will need to be effective in managing the state and district offices and the state/county relationships, as well as advocate effectively for the Division to a wide spectrum of players. Balancing tensions inherent in the debate around health care reform will require fostering creativity and innovation while maintaining credibility and accountability, and, at the same time, continuing to provide high quality and consistent services.

QUALIFICATIONS

By statute the Director must be a physician. The successful candidate will have proven leadership skills and very significant knowledge of and commitment to public health. The new Director must be able to develop a compelling vision for the Division of Public Health. She/he must also have the skills to persuasively articulate and implement that vision.

The Department of Human Resources is seeking candidates with excellent communication and negotiation skills, and demonstrated capacity to build coalitions and reach consensus on politically sensitive issues. Evidence of a participatory management style which values innovation and informed risk-taking is essential.

Candidates should have a working knowledge of provider networks and health data sources as well as experience and knowledge in the areas of maternal and infant health, AIDS, child and adolescent health, teen pregnancy and adult health.

COMPENSATION AND APPLICATIONS

The salary for this position is in the \$120,000 range and includes a generous benefit package.

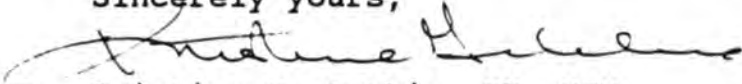

Dear Ms. Gebbie:

This letter is to follow up on the request for your help in organizing a meeting with Health and Human Services Secretary Donna Shalala and with Attorney General Janet Reno that I verbally made to you during our meeting on October 22, 1993 in San Francisco. The purpose of this meeting would be to discuss the implementation of the HIV entry exclusion with the Secretary and the Attorney General, as they are the Cabinet members responsible for the administrative implementation of the ban. The INS Commissioner, Doris Meissner, and you should also be part of this meeting on the Administration's side.

As soon as you set in motion the process of organizing this meeting, I will be happy to provide you, in coordination with Tim McFeeley of HRCF and Paul Kawata of NMAC, with a list of community representatives whose clients are directly impacted by the entry ban and, most importantly, of people who are personally affected by it.

I do not need to tell you that this ban significantly undermines efforts to curtail the spread of HIV in the U.S., or that it constitutes a grave abuse of the human rights of the individuals it affects. Any help that you can provide to lessen its effects through regulatory relief will be greatly appreciated.

I thank you very much for your attention to this matter and look forward to hearing from you.

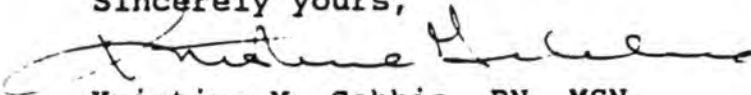
