After serving two terms as governor, Mark Hatfield was elected to the United States Senate. He is now the second ranking Republican in the Senate, the ranking minority member of the Appropriations Committee, and a major player in health care reform.

Senator Hatfield is also known for his commitment to medical research and appropriating money for such causes. He is a moderate Republican and a good inside player.

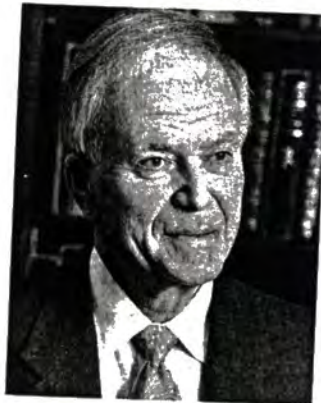
