Please don't hesitate to call me with any questions or requests. We look forward to Ms. Gebbie's presentation.

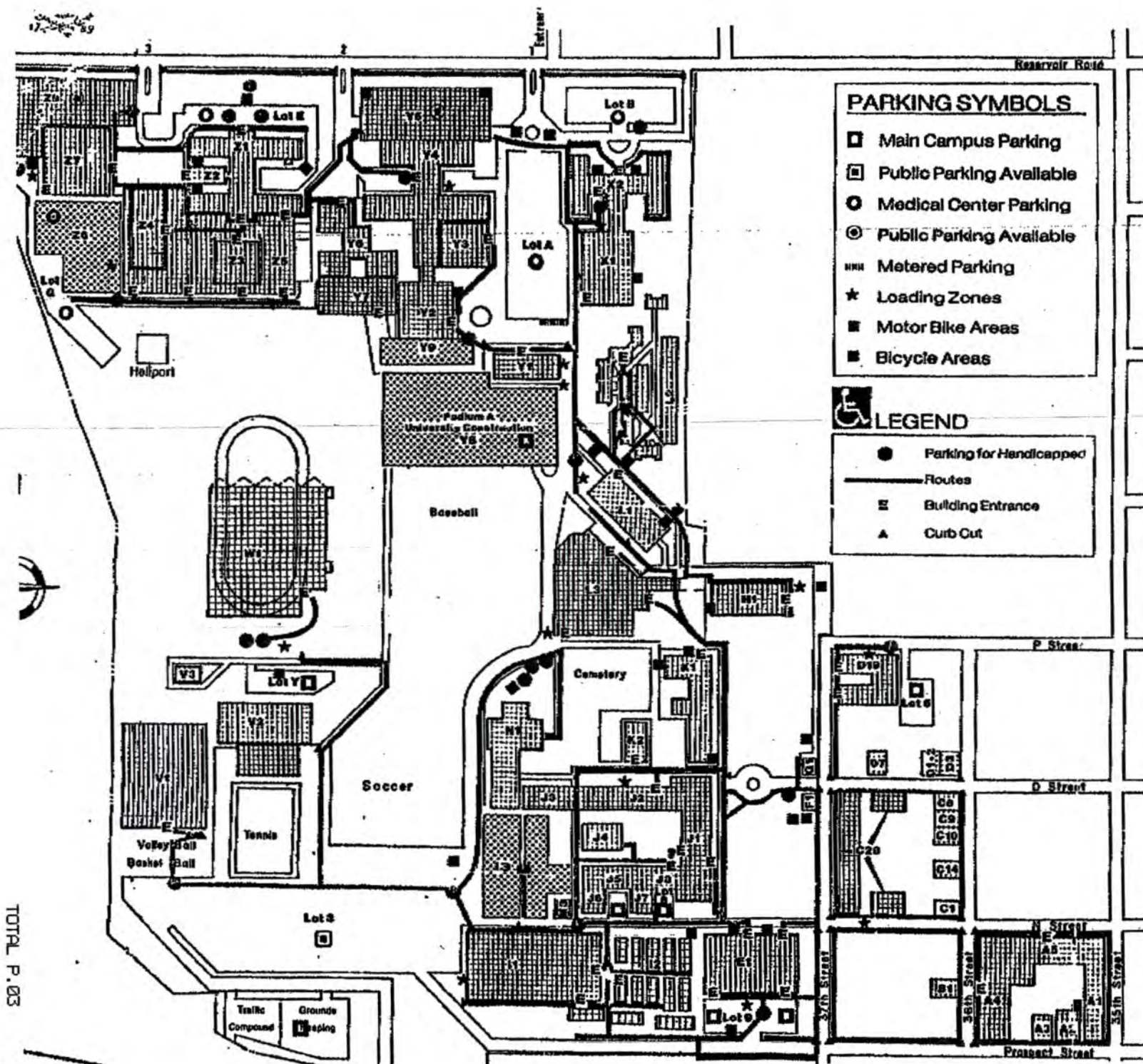
