Ms. Gebbie

In order to stop the spread of this disease among young people, we as a society face the enormous challenge of working with young people to identify and avoid risky behaviors. The challenge is no less difficult when we are working to modify the behaviors of adult professionals who have grown use to doing business in a particular way. Any educator will tell you just how difficult it is to foster behavior modification. Not only do our messages about the threat of teen AIDS and HIV have to be repeated time and again, the consequences of participating in risky behaviors or avoiding the threat HIV poses for our children have to be understood and, more important, felt by those young people we are trying to reach and those who work with them.

Ms. Cropp

Dr. Larry D'Angelo is one of the nation's leading medical experts on Adolescent HIV and AIDS. In his practice and through his work as the director of Children's Hospital's Burgess Clinic he is responsible for more HIV infected young people than anyone else throughout the region and possibly the nation.

In 1988, he founded the Washington Area Consortium on HIV Infection in Youth-TeenAIDS to bring together youth-serving professionals in an effort to cooperatively deal with the crisis because he recognized education as the only hope of stemming the rising rates of infection among teens.

The doctor, in order to deal effectively with the adolescent HIV epidemic, became the educator and advocate while his patient caseload continued to grow. As president of TeenAIDS for nearly six years, he has skillfully guided the development and the growth of a consortium unlike any other in the nation. This

year, as he steps down from his position as the President of TeenAIDS' Board of Directors, he can be proud that his efforts have made it impossible for our community to ignore the threat to our children and that we are struggling to address it.

It is a pleasure for me to present this year's David Brumbach Award for service by an individual to Dr. Larry D'Angelo.

Following Dr. D'Angelo's remarks, Kristine Gebbie:

While Dr. D'Angelo has been working to create a new way of doing business among physicians, service providers, and educators, the Northern Virginia AIDS Ministries has been helping young people understand why they must begin to take more responsibility for their behavior and their health in the face of the AIDS epidemic. Their Face to Face program has been notable for its impact on the way young people relate to AIDS. By bringing those infected to those at-risk in classrooms and wherever young people gather, AIDS has become more than a word to hundreds of teens.

The Northern Virginia AIDS Ministries has personalized AIDS for young people - an important step in the process of helping them to protect themselves. Through Face to Face and their other education programs, NOVAM has helped young people feel the pain, the isolation, and the deep sadness of AIDS. By personalizing the plight of those fighting for their lives, they have opened the eyes and the hearts of young people.

For all their efforts on behalf of young people in their community, it is my pleasure to present the 1994 David Brumbach Award for an organization to the Northern Virginia AIDS Ministry.

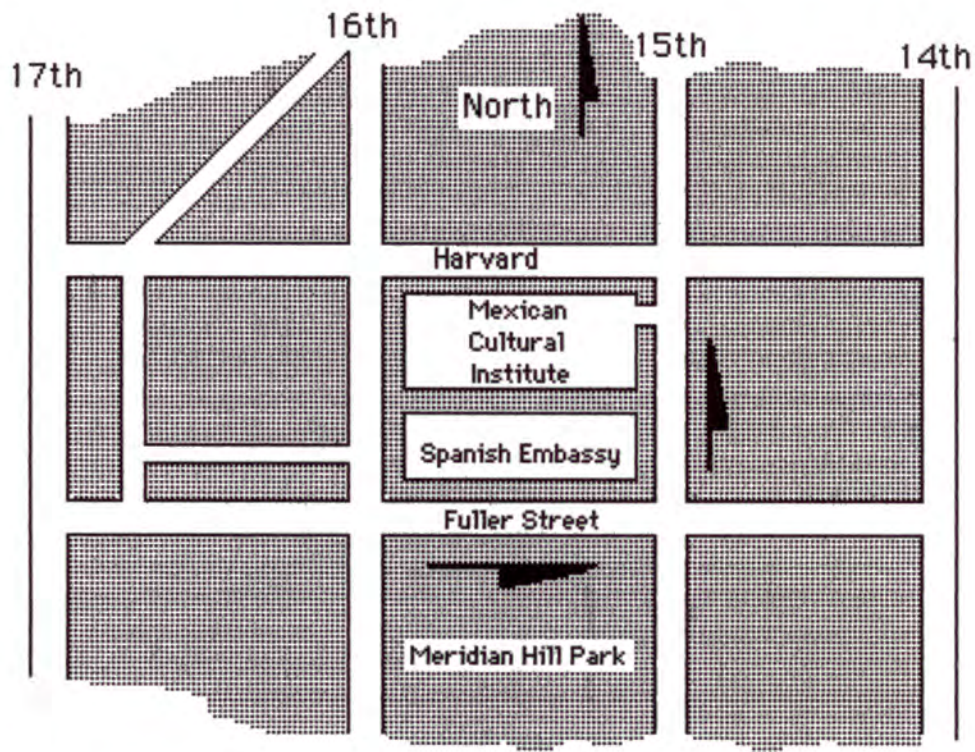
