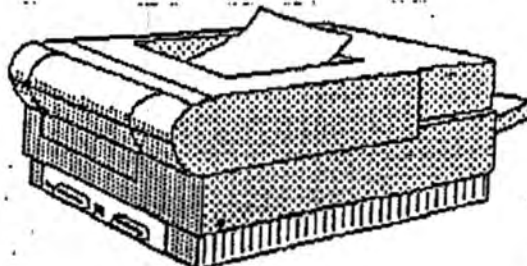

Dear Kristine:

It was wonderful to see you at the Conference of Peer Educators last Saturday. Each time I see you my admiration for you, as a human being with enormous integrity that genuinely cares about this epidemic, grows tremendously.

On Saturday, I asked you to attend this year's main event for the High School HIV/AIDS Resource Center. Below is a description of the event.

The rate of HIV infection among the adolescents of New York City is the highest in the nation. Experts estimate that as many as 100,000 adolescents in this city are infected with the virus that causes AIDS.

In responding to this crisis, the High School HIV/AIDS Resource Center is establishing a state of the art, non hospital based, high school community based, user friendly, health care facility specializing in, and sensitive to, the needs of adolescents. It will be called the **Life Care Center** and will provide free comprehensive primary health care services to adolescents in the New York City public high schools who are at risk for contracting HIV, are HIV infected, have AIDS, or are affected by HIV/AIDS.

Early diagnosis of HIV infection, prudent medical management, treatment, psychosocial support and the adopting of a healthy lifestyle, can improve the length and quality of life for adolescents with HIV infection. It is therefore vital that high school students have ensured access to a health care facility with an accepting environment, designed with them in mind, that is conducive to attracting adolescents to avail themselves of the services therein.

To help raise funds for, and awareness of, the Life Care Center, the premier performance of "**Jerry Herman Tonight**" will take place on Monday, April 18, 1994 at 8:00 p.m. at La Guardia Concert Hall, 65th Street and Amsterdam Avenue, New York, New York.

This musical benefit extravaganza will be brought to life by over 200 thrilling surprise performers, including dazzling talented teenagers from the New York City public high schools and stars of the stage and screen. Songs from Hello Dolly, Milk and Honey, Mame, Dear World, Mack & Mabel and La Cage Aux Folles will constitute this multicultural tribute to love and survival.

The performance will be in honor of Jerry Herman who will be presented with the New York City Lifetime Achievement Award.

Rodger McFarlane will also be honored and will be presented with the New York City Distinguished Service Award.

Michael Feinstein, Bernadette Peters and Tommy Tune will grace the stage.

By now, in this second decade of global devastation caused by AIDS, virtually every one of us has been affected. We have witnessed the ravages of this disease and seen loved ones perish. We must do everything possible to end the destruction caused by AIDS.

Kristine, if you could be at this event and make a brief statement about adolescents, and the impact that this terrible scourge is having on their lives, it would be so meaningful. Your presence in doing this would clearly demonstrate the Administration's strong support for the health of today's youth and tomorrow's adult citizens.

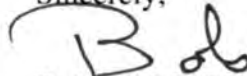

The High School HIV/AIDS Resource Center was established in 1989 as the pilot project that was part of a design to implement six, High School Superintendency-based Resource Centers. Though the other five centers never opened, the Board choosing instead to mount school-based programs, the pilot Center remained to provide technical assistance and HIV/AIDS expertise, both to individuals and to schools establishing their own, Board-mandated educational programs. Since 1989 the Center has been the sole "in-house" HIV/AIDS resource service center for high school students, their family members and all school personnel.

The Resource Center is staffed by two full-time professionals, one part-time professional, and sixteen volunteers. Two positions are funded by the Board of Education -- one centrally and one through schools which rely on this individual to provide Board-mandated HIV/AIDS education--and one position is funded by NYU Medical Center.

An annual benefit musical extravaganza event yields corporate, foundation, and individual contributions which are used to purchase supplies and informational literature for distribution to individuals and groups which request it.

The Center provides the following services that are available to over 285,000 high school students citywide, their family members and all school personnel:

Training for professionals. As schools throughout the City implemented Board-mandated HIV/AIDS education, the Center assisted in training teams of professionals to work effectively with adolescents at risk for contracting HIV.

Training for students. Board-and-State-mandated HIV/AIDS education is provided by the Center directly to students at nearly 300 small offsite educational programs, programs too small to warrant the services of fulltime health educators, as well as in high schools throughout the five boroughs.

The Hotline. This service provides information, counseling, crisis intervention, and referrals. 1,107 calls were logged during the 1992-93 school year; in the first half of the 1993-94 school year, over 2,300 calls have been received. Most are responded to by trained volunteer counselors.

Counseling. Following up on Hotline Calls, the Center counseled 534 adolescents and adults during the 1992-93 school year; 1700 such sessions have already taken place this year.

Referrals. 98 referrals were made during the 1992-93 school year for individuals needing long-term counseling or care; 206 referrals have been made thus far this year. Referrals are made to hospitals, clinics, and other community-based organizations which provide education, social services, psychological and psychiatric counseling, nursing, medical care, and legal advice.

Technical assistance and information. During the past two years, over 31,000 pieces of informational literature have been provided directly by the Center to individuals who have requested it.
