PROGRAM OBJECTIVES:

The Kunming Drug Abuse Research Center was established in 1989 and is a model for rehabilitation centers in the southwest province of Yunnan, where drug trafficking and abuse are the worst in China. During this, their first visit to the U.S., Dr. Li and Dr. Wang (who also works at the center) would like to study rehabilitation efforts in the U.S. and learn how experts share and access information on the latest developments. They are also interested in AIDS prevention programs because AIDS is becoming more of a problem in China. Specifically, they would like to:

- Visit urban and rural rehabilitation centers to observe strategies in practice;
- Learn about the role of government in solving the problem of drug abuse, overseeing rehabilitation centers, and fighting AIDS;
- Visit research facilities, including hospitals and universities, to consult with specialists in fields such as withdrawal and rehabilitation;
- Obtain U.S. views on trends in international narcotics trafficking in order to understand how their own efforts in China fit into the worldwide picture.
