SUBJECT: Process for review and comment on National HIV Action Agenda

The following is the process for review and comment.

- 1) On April 12 I had a meeting with 14 representatives of national AIDS organizations. At that meeting I handed out my cover letter and the goal statements contained in the report. I left out the commentary and the action items. However, we did learn at this meeting that most of these groups had already received a full copy from someone within HHS.
- 2) I will have additional conversations with Phil Lee on how best to receive review and comment from Public Health Service agencies. We expect to receive their comments by early May.
- 3) At the same time, I propose to send to members of the DPC a copy of the full document for their review and comment. For those federal agencies that are both part of the DPC and others like State and US-AID, we will have some in depth discussion as part of the transmittal of the document. We will expect their comments by early May as well.
- 4) Following receipt of comments from both the community and other federal agencies, we will place together an updated version of the Action Agenda and ask for a second round of review and comment.
- 5) Following appointment of the Presidential Advisory Council, we expect to share the most current draft with the new members and place this on the agenda for the Council's first meeting.
