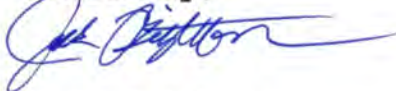

The recent showing of the Names Project AIDS Memorial Quilt in Urbana-Champaign was an enormous success, and the support we received from the National Aids Policy Office was invaluable. Many people in Central Illinois who would otherwise never have been exposed to the Quilt, nor perhaps to AIDS, have been made aware of the effect the epidemic is having locally, as well as nationally.

The local Gay Community AIDS Project is interested in continuing the progress made by keeping AIDS/HIV in front of the public. In this vein, I have been working with our local National Public Radio affiliate, WILL AM 580, to provide programming on AIDS/HIV. Specifically, I am requesting Ms. Kristine Gebbie to appear on WILL's call-in program called Focus 580. I am including a fact sheet provided by WILL which describes the Focus 580 program in more detail. Guests often participate by way of telephone link with the local station. As we have discussed, the program at 11:00 a.m. to noon on Wednesday and Thursday, April 13 and 14 are tentatively reserved for Ms. Gebbie, should her schedule permit her to speak on one program. Also, several hour-long program dates are currently open: Monday and Tuesday, May 2 and 3 at 10:00 and 11:00 a.m.; Wednesday, May 4 at 11:00 a.m. only; and Thursday and Friday, May 5 and 6 at 10:00 and 11:00 a.m.

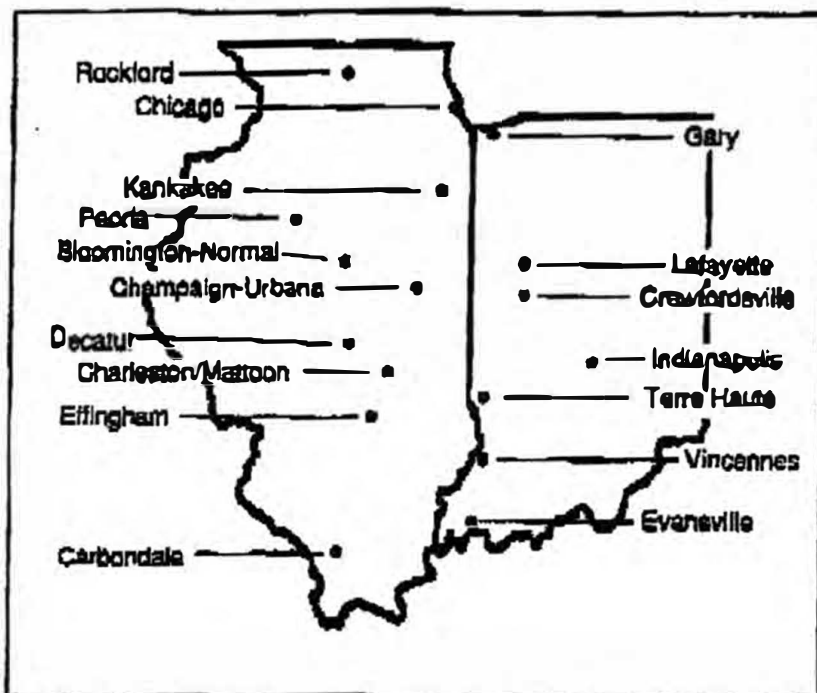
