Dear Ms. Gebbie,

The annual national meeting of the Title IIIb primary health care programs funded under the Ryan White CARE Act will be held in Washington, DC, between May 15 and 17. Over 250 community based primary care providers from 137 agencies are coming together to assess and explore how to continue to improve the delivery of primary health care services to persons with HIV infection and AIDS.

On behalf of the National Title IIIb Coalition, we want to invite you to be a key note speaker at either the morning or afternoon sessions on May 15 or May 16. The planning committee suggested two possible topics: the future of HIV services in the context of national health reform, or health care reform and the HIV patient. We are however flexible. We would welcome your ideas on topics that would be of interest to a national gathering of community based providers that 1) provide care to an ever growing number of patients, 2) must deliberate and act on health care reform and the reauthorization of the CARE Act.

The Title IIIb agencies were first funded in the fall of 1990. Programmatic responsibility for these programs rests with the Bureau of Primary Health Care, headed by Dr. Marilyn Gaston. A list of the grantees is enclosed.

The purpose of Title IIIb grants is to ensure access to early assessment and treatment by individuals with HIV infection. The funds directly support primary health care services, clinical and laboratory evaluation and continuing care. In some areas of the country funds have also been used to establish case management programs and HIV counseling and testing services.

This group of 137 agencies is staffed by a diverse cadre of community people that bring experience, intelligence and dedication to their tasks. They have brought these same qualities to the challenge of implementing efficient community based delivery systems to meet the health care needs of thousands of patients with HIV infection.

We hope your schedule will permit you to join us on May 15 or 16th and anticipate hearing from you at your earliest convenience. I can be reached at (617) 267-0900 ext 202.
