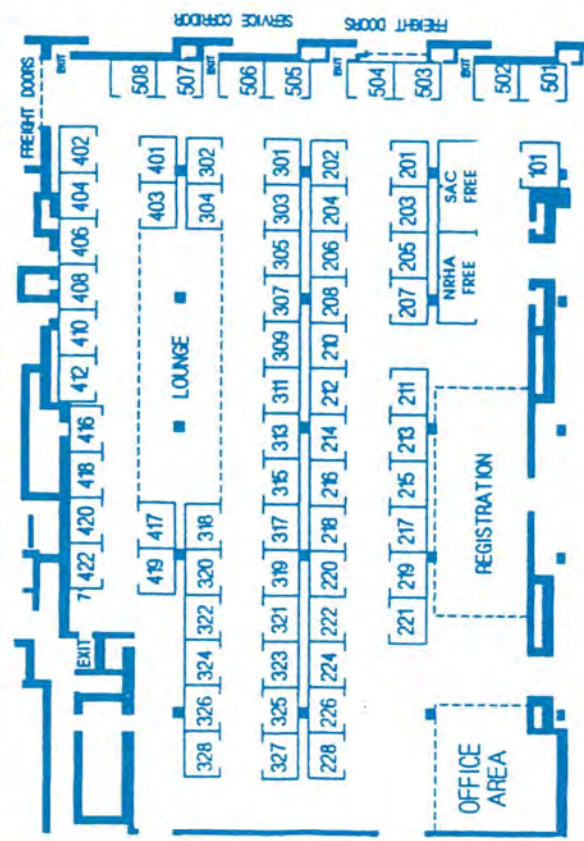

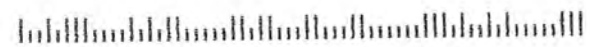
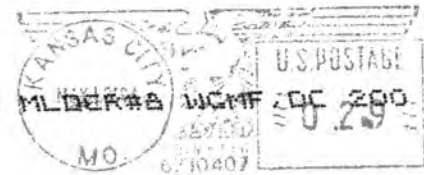

Selected Case Summaries, Rural Calls Received Between 7/93 and 2/94

MD/FP, Grand Marais, MN (2845): The female partner of an ASX male wants to get pregnant. - Do we have any clinical data/studies on "Gradient Centrifugation?" Had heard there might be some in Italy.

MD, Marietta, OH (3715): MD and wife are both HIV+. Wife tested positive 3.5 yrs ago. Neither has had any care, nor disclosed their status to anyone. She's had rash over her back for a few months, but refuses to get care.

- What should he do about rash, and what does the rash mean?

RN, Gore, OK (2987): Not pt. specific. They (school) use universal precautions.

- Are vinyl gloves effective against HIV?

RPh, Sentinel, OK (4459): (Enc. not available at the moment). Question re. references on HIV treatments.

MD/IM, Sikeston, MO (4231): 37 yr old black male, w/ CD4 = 7. Starting PCP prophylaxis w/ septr. AZT 200 tid.

- Do I need to give Hep B, influenza, pneumococcal vaccines?

- How often to get CBC, CD4?

MD/FP, Sikeston, MO (4340): 32 yr old black male, CD4 = 8. PPD-, mumps-. Anergic. Not homeless or o/w high risk pt. for TB. Pt has no household contacts w/ TB.

- Should this pt. receive INH prophylaxis?

MD/FP Fairdale, KY (3693): Young man's test results went from HIV- Ab to "indeterminant" Western Blot. Lab recommends repeat test in 1-3 months. Possible risk behavior. Pt told to watch his behavior and that he needs retesting.

- Are there any other practical tests I can do to confirm this pt's HIV status while I wait to repeat Elisa? What about PCR?

MD/FP, IHS, Cibecue, AZ (3692): Pregnant pt. w/ no known risk factors. Had several + ELISAs w/ indeterminate WBs. "Recombinant" (not sure if it is PCR test) DNA test done for HIV was negative.

- How to interpret and further evaluate this pt's persistent indeterminate WB test?

- Any special recommendations for following the child?

MD/FP, IHS, Whiteriver, AZ (3839): New pt., male, heavy alcoholic, just tested HIV+. Has new girlfriends, apparently not telling them of his HIV status.

- What is legal responsibility of physician to inform pt. exposed to HIV by other pt. who has not informed them of his status?

MD/IM, Whiteriver, AZ (3489): 55 yr old NA male, w/ AIDS. Weakness, chills, severe thrombocytopenia. Chronic active Hep C. Lab values provided for Bilirubin, platelets, LFTs. Neg. biopsy for CMV but high CMV titer. Suspicious spleen lesions. Unremarkable liver ultrasound.

- What is the typical course of illness?

- Anything else to consider?

RPh, IHS, Tuba City, AZ (3229): 12 yr old male, hemophiliac w/ CD4 count of 50. Lost 8 kg rapidly, not primarily from nausea. Admitted for non-PCP pneumonia. (Various meds

listed).

- Any pharmacologic rec's for stimulating appetite and tx wasting in 12 yr old?
- THC?

RPh, Tuba City, AZ (4093): Not pt. specific. Had heard that there may be some new dosing guidelines for ddC.

- Any new dosing recommendations for ddC as monotherapy?

Pharm D, Tuba City, AZ (3728): 32 yr male, w/ AIDS, outpt. Unknown CD4. Lomotil, Actovir, Septra, Acyclovir, Ketoconazole.

- Tx of neuropathy w/ Capsacin cream? Saw guidelines for 0,075% gid in article. We only have 0,025% cream. Are there different guidelines for a lower strenght regimen?

MD/FP, Bethel, AK (4134): 42 yr male, eskimo, SX, w/ CD4 = 300. Recurrent pneumonias, now w/ fever. Two pneumonia since Aug. (called on 1 Nov.) wchich have been Strep resistant to PCN. Did o.k. on IV Ceferoxime & oral Augmentin (8days total). After return to home - fever, chills, cough. Ceftriaxone in village & feels better. CXR showed sligh increase RLL infiltrate? Not sure if worsening. 0 Sputum.

- Not clear whether fever due to pneumonia or something else that needs to be worked up?

MD/FP, Juneau, AK (3662): Female pt., SX w/ CD4 = 300. Pt. has a court date, and MD may be asked about her life expectancy.

- What is avg life expectancy beyond AIDS diagnosis?

MD/GP, Chowchilla (Women' corrections), CA (2614): 40 yr old, black woman.

CD4 = 403. CXR shows 3-4 cm nodule 2 months ago, now 5 cm lesion. Lung biopsy showed acute/chronic inflammation. Has occasional hemoptysis & left sided chest pain. Sputum neg. Bronchial wash neg.

- What should we do next in the evaluation of this growing left sided lung mass?
- What else could this be?

MD/IM, Fort Bragg, CA (2047): No pt. data. Tcell subsets lab report revealed result called "CD19."

- What is CD19? Are they renaming CD4 cells? (Later call revealed that lab had checked off the wrong lab on the request).

MD/IM, Hollister, CA (2735): 33 yr old Hispanic male. Denies any risk. CD4 = 83. Denies any sx except oral thrush occasionally. AZT 200 tid, septr. Hgb/Hct normal. LFTs normal.

- Should she make any changes in therapy?

MD/FP, Lemoore (Corrections), CA (4011): - Would like some references recommended by another MD, e.g., Txmt '93.

MD/FP, Potter Valley, CA (2626): 40 yr old homosexual, CD4 = 450-500. Smoker.

Acyclovir for HIV, chronic active Hepatitis. No thrush in mouth. Pain in chest after eating. Fever x 2-3 weeks. CXR/sputum neg. Rx amox w/o relief. Rx Keflex 500 QID/Ventolin resulted in Temp. = 103. No headaches, cough productive for a scant brownish sputum. No dyspnea.

- What is differential for fever?
- How work up fever?

MD, Sonora, CA (2720): Female pt. in her late 30s, transmission IDU/sexual, CD4 greater than 500. C/o decreasing memory & cognitive skills. AZT trial resulted in increase of CD4 to 600 & feeling better. Stopped after a few months due to secondary GI sx. Now again feeling like fxb decreasing. Chronic fevers, manic.

- Can people have decreasing cognitive fxn in early HIV disease? - Is this early HIV dementia?
- Does this warrant txmt?

MD/FP, Champlain (2309/2310): Symptomatic white male, aged 35, w/ CD4 of 750 was exposed about 12 years ago (IDU), and tested positive w/ Elisa.

- Is there another test to check if he is truly positive?
- If is he positive, how often should his CD4 be checked?

MD/FP, Correctional facility, Brockton (2025): ASX female (CD4 = 515) with labial "Herpes."

- Could this painful "neuropathy" be a sign of Zoster?
- Should I just increase her Zovirax dose?

Q. 2706 (Alexandria Bay): A 51 year old, white, heterosexual female was treated with Septra for PCP 2-3 wks ago.

- Which medications do I use for prophylaxis?

MD/FP, Alexandria Bay (2707): Nurse was scratched with a dirty needle (from pt. in Q. 2706) 10 days ago.

- Is this a significant risk?
- Any prophylaxis available?

MD/FP, Correctional facility, Brockton (2773/2774): 27 year old male w/ AIDS and CD4 of 143. Contracted HIV from IDU/gay sex. Is opposed to AZT because previous AZT use caused dizziness, nausea, & night sweats.

- Should I push this pt. to start ddl or retry AZT?
- Do you have any information on ozone treatment?

MD/FP, Correctional facility, Brockton (2718/19): 27 year old, Black male, CD4 = 146. AZT makes him sick even at a low dose.

- Should he be on ddl?
- How do I evaluate a reactive RPR 1:32 if pt was treated for syphilis in the past?

MD/FP, Correctional facility, Brockton (3879/80/81/82): 52 year old heterosexual female, caucasian, with AIDS and CD = 216. History of PCP, with toxo titer 2.00 and new blotchy rash on face.

- What is the significance of low toxo titer?
- How frequently should he check CD4 and CD8s?
- Is this pt. ready to switch to ddl or ddC?
- What could be causing the facial rash, and what TX?
- Requesting a discussion of general health care maintenance for this pt.
