Dear Kris:

As we discussed last week, the Center for Public Policy and Administration of the University of Utah will be convening the second annual gathering of graduates of its Masters of Public Administration program on June 3-4, 1994. On behalf of the committee organizing the meeting, I would like to extend an invitation for you to participate in the gathering as the meeting's keynote speaker.

The major theme for this meeting will be the role (both perceived and real) of the public administrator as the steward of the public's trust in an environment of technological, social, and cultural change.

As currently envisioned, the meeting will be held in Snowbird, and will begin Friday evening with a dinner followed by an invited guest setting the theme for the meeting. The following day, the attendees will gather in small groups to discuss topics related to the main issue under discussion. The small groups will be facilitated by practitioners of the topic under discussion. At the end of the meeting, the participants will reassemble to report on the results of their individual meetings and to plan future efforts.

When I mentioned to Laverne Snow, president of the Utah Public Health Association, that the Center had asked that I invite you to join us for the MPA gathering, she expressed her interest in wanting to schedule a time for you to meet with the association and the local AIDS volunteer community. While the incidence of AIDS and HIV infection is low in Utah, there is an active effort to address the issues in an enlightened, caring, professional manner.

As I mentioned when we spoke last week, legislation is currently being drafted to begin the process of reforming health care delivery within the state. I have been informed that the legislation will include a mandate that the Department of Health develop a public health improvement plan to ensure that the state and local public health community are capable of fulfilling their assessment, policy development, and assurance responsibilities. Your meeting with the commission convened to identify alternative approaches to health care reform is credited as bringing into focus their understanding of the role of public health in a reformed health care system. The Utah public health community will always be grateful for your invaluable assistance.

I am hoping that I will hear that you will be able to meet with us in June.
