NAS/IOM COMMITTEE TO ASSESS NATIONAL STRATEGIES
FOR AIDS RESEARCH AND HEALTH CARE

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

WASHINGTON - The National Academy of Sciences (NAS) and the Institute of Medicine (IOM) have launched an intensive, six-month study to assess national strategies for scientific research, health care delivery, and public health measures in response to the growing national and international problem of AIDS (Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome).

The study was initiated by the governing Councils of the NAS and the IOM to provide an independent setting for identifying public and private sector policies most likely to accelerate development of effective research, prevention, and treatment of the disease.

The joint NAS/IOM study will be conducted by two panels and a coordinating steering committee.

Research on AIDS has proceeded rapidly, including early isolation of the responsible virus and development of a blood test that uses detection of AIDS antibodies to identify infected individuals. Nevertheless, there are many remaining research needs such as development of an AIDS vaccine and of effective treatment programs. The new NAS/IOM committee will examine whether additional targeting and coordination of such efforts might speed progress in coping with the disease.

Support for the study has been provided by a consortium of foundations including the Carnegie Corporation of New York, the Charles E. Culpeper Foundation, the William and Flora Hewlett Foundation, the John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation, and the Rockefeller Foundation.

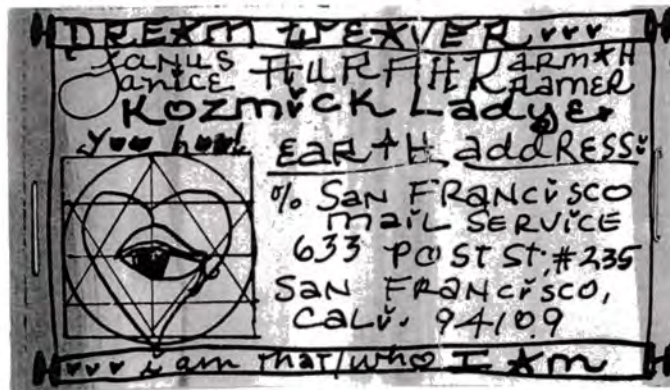
