Re: MARY CREWE, INTERNATIONAL VISITOR FROM SOUTH AFRICA

Greetings GUS! Attached is the Bio on Mary Crewe, the AIDS specialist from South Africa we discussed briefly today. She will begin her national tour with a week in Washington, DC June 20th. Below are the issue areas Ms. Crewe hopes to look at while on her 28-day U.S. visit:

PROGRAM SHOULD FOCUS ON THE FOLLOWING AREAS:

- AIDS programs for youth and women, with emphasis on decaying inner city areas. (Crewe works in Johannesburg's inner city, and her specialty is the marginalized, poor, poorly educated and multiracial)
- She would like to see how local gov'ts in the U.S. are coping with AIDS. Programs by both public and private agencies including day-care, hospices, home-based care, volunteers and "buddies".
- How does an organization generate community support in deprived neighborhoods? School-age programs? Women's groups working in AIDS?
- Preventive Health Care rather than curative (coping with STDs, and promotion of general public health).
- The theoretical debate in the academic community about social issues raised by AIDS with

particular reference to metropolitan areas. How does one effect the kinds of behavior changes which will reduce the level of infection?

- U.S. National AIDS politics. Ms. Crewe is also on the Metropolitan AIDS Task Force in Johannesburg.

Gus, as you can see Ms. Crewe is looking to get a lot out of her 28-day visit to the U.S. I think it would be both appropriate and necessary for Ms. Crewe to visit with Ms. Gebby to discuss the national politics regarding AIDS.

Pursuant to our conversation today, I have a tentative appointment set with Ms. Gebby for Friday, June 24, 1994 at 1:00pm - 3:00pm. Please contact me immediately if this schedule should suddenly become difficult to maintain.

Could you also please fax me either Ms. Gebby's Bio or a brief description of her responsibilities. Please include in this fax exactly where Ms. Crewe is to come for her appointment and any special instructions. In advance, thank you for time and attention to this matter.
