[57] ABSTRACT

A human reproduction indexing device for indicating the calendar dates for days of a menstrual cycle on which the probability of conception is the greatest includes a generally rectangular member having indicia representing the calendar dates for the days of given months positioned in three separate columns on the member and indicator-index columns aligned and positioned adjacent each of the separate columns on the member. When the calendar date corresponding to the day of the onset of the menses is known, the indicator-index columns indicate the calendar dates for an eight day interval starting ten days after the indexed date to provide the time interval during which ovulation should occur and the days on which the probability of conception are maximized.

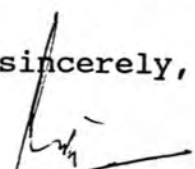
Thank you very much for your letter of May 25, 1993.

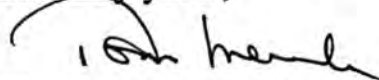
Thanks for sending me the materials you promised during our phone conversation. As I mentioned to you, my role is to let our operational staff know about important developments in our field. They, in turn, work with the member-country governments who have projects that cover family planning and reproductive health services.

Because it is a lending rather than granting agency, the Bank does not get directly involved in the procurement of contraceptives. It does advise governments about how to do it and encourages other donors to co-finance this procurement using their grant funding. We are currently preparing materials on this topic to guide the operations staff. The Bank is encouraging countries to include natural approaches where-ever it is feasible.

I think that your point about combining a fertility regulation method with use of condoms to prevent AIDS is an excellent one. A number of family planning agencies have adopted this approach.

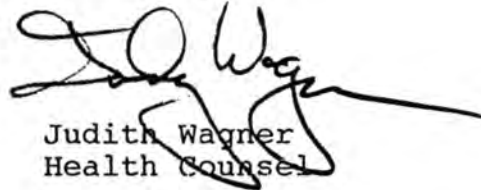

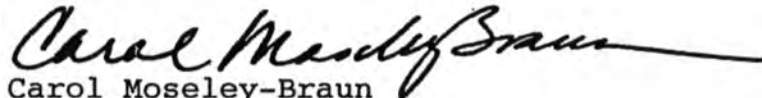

PETITS PAS VERS LE SOMMET DES CHEFS D'ETAT CONTRE LE SIDA

Six mois avant le grand rendez-vous destiné à remobiliser la coopération internationale dans la lutte contre la pandémie, une trentaine de ministres de la Santé se sont rencontrés ce week-end à Paris. Une réunion de plus où, à défaut de résultats notables, la prise de conscience du monde politique s'est affirmée.

Rien sur le Rwanda. Au sommet de Paris sur le sida, organisé par la France et où se sont retrouvés, vendredi et samedi, pas moins de 50 délégations étrangères, pas un mot sur ce pays, bien sûr ravagé par la guerre civile, mais aussi un des endroits au monde les plus touchés par le virus VIH, avec un taux de séroprevalence pouvant aller jusqu'à 20%. Le ministre de la Santé publique du pays voisin, le Burundi, a tenu des propos aigres : « Aujourd'hui, en raison de nos frontières avec le Rwanda, le Burundi est déclaré zone à risque. Et la plupart des experts étrangers qui travaillent sur le sida s'en vont ».

Un sommet pour rien alors, où les mots ont peu à voir avec les actes ? Une énième réunion sur le sida, coïncée entre le congrès de Marrakech en décembre dernier, et celui de Yokohama au Japon en août prochain, et s'achevant, comme de coutume, par une déclaration solennelle qui affirme « la permanence de la mobilisation mondiale en vue d'enrayer la progression de la pandémie et d'apporter un appui aux personnes atteintes ». Cette mobilisation n'est pas seulement médicale, mais elle doit être aussi politique, économique, sociale et culturelle. Il est de la responsabilité des dirigeants de veiller à ce qu'aucun continent, aucun pays, aucune catégorie de la société, aucun individu de la société ne soit marginalisé ou exclu ». Pourtant, au-delà de l'ordinaire des « communiqués finaux », ce sommet de Paris n'a pas été tout à fait inutile. « C'est un début, mais nous avons pu assister à un véritable frémissement du monde politique », a noté le docteur Merkun, responsable du programme mondial sur le sida à l'OMS. « Pour la première fois, les politiques s'emparent d'une maladie et d'une épidémie, et ne l'abandonnent pas aux techniciens médicaux », précisait Jean-François Girard, directeur général de la Santé en France. « Nous assistons à une mobilisation d'ordre politique tout à fait nouvelle et essentielle », a conclu Simone Veil, ministre des Affaires sociales. « Cette mobilisation va se traduire de manière très significative le 1^{er} décembre prochain, avec un sommet des chefs d'Etat sur le sida à Paris ».

Le point de départ de cette réunion avait été l'appel lancé en décembre à Marrakech par Simone Veil pour tenter de remobiliser la coopération internationale dans la lutte contre le sida, notamment en engageant plus à fond les pays bailleurs de fonds. Une nécessité quand on note le relatif repli des Etats-Unis sur ses frontières en matière de coopération, mais également quand on entend les grandes industries pharmaceutiques à vouloir à tout prix le souhait de réduire leurs investissements

dans la recherche sur le vaccin, « faute de rentabilité à moyen terme ». En clair, la coopération Nord-Sud en matière de sida est toujours aussi fragile.

Dans ce contexte, la volonté affichée par les autorités françaises était de réagir solennellement et de répéter haut et fort qu'« il est possible de maîtriser cette épidémie ». Pétillement, cet hiver, en dépit des réticences des Japonais qui craignaient une concurrence entre ce sommet et « leur » congrès de cet été, la réunion a pris peu à peu forme. Au départ, ce devait être une rencontre de chefs d'Etat. Les Français ont dû finalement se replier sur une fusée à deux étages : d'abord une réunion préparatoire au niveau des ministres de la Santé, puis, le 1^{er} décembre, un sommet réel des chefs de gouvernement. Et, surtout, pour éviter les susceptibilités diplomatiques, ces deux rencontres se feront sous l'égide de l'OMS.

« La pandémie de sida ne connaît pas de répit », a donc analysé le docteur Nakajima, directeur général de l'OMS. « A ce jour, plus de 15 millions de personnes ont été infectées par le VIH, dont 2 millions dans la seule année 1993. Ignorant les frontières, la pandémie se nourrit de nos peurs, de notre indifférence, de nos dénis. Nous sommes tous concernés, tous vulnérables. C'est ensemble que nous devons penser le sida et les politiques de prévention et de recherche, et assurer l'accueil des personnes atteintes, leur prise en charge sociale et médicale ».

Pendant deux jours, près de 50 délégations, de la Chine aux Etats-Unis en passant par l'Allemagne et le Cambodge, la moitié d'entre elles dirigées par des ministres de la Santé, se sont ainsi retrouvées. Quelques interventions fortes, voire poignantes comme celle de la vice-ministre de la Santé du Zimbabwe, qui a évoqué « la vulnérabilité des femmes, terriblement attirées ». Puis cinq ateliers ont été constitués : l'un sur la sécurité transfusionnelle ; un autre sur « vaccin et recherche » ; le troisième sur la prévention ; le quatrième sur « la réduction de la vulnérabilité des populations particulièrement exposées du fait de facteurs sociaux et économiques » ; et le dernier sur « l'amélioration de la prise en charge médicale et sociale des personnes infectées par le VIH ».

Comme c'est la règle maintenant en matière de sida, une « cellule de personnes atteintes du VIH », regroupant diverses associations mondiales, a pu participer à toutes les étapes de pré-sommet ainsi qu'au travail en atelier. « L'admission cela reste finie », nous a déclaré Arnaud Marty (L'Avant-garde, président d'Aides). « Dans les différents ateliers, c'est le plus petit dénominateur commun qui est ressorti. Les questions autour de la drogue, celle autour du poids des religieux ont été vite lais-

sées de côté. Il n'empêche, les participants ont convenu qu'il fallait partir des communautés de base, prendre en compte leurs besoins réels. Et cela, ce n'est pas rien ». En somme, un premier pas à confirmer. Même s'il faut noter au passage que le volet financier de ce pré-sommet est resté particulièrement maigre. Et la réunion du 1^{er} décembre,

qui sera donc le point d'orgue de cette démarche diplomatique, s'orientera sur une déclaration solennelle et des applications plus pratiques, regroupant les travaux des cinq ateliers.

Samedi, en tout cas, la ministre française des Affaires sociales paraissait rassurée sur la suite de son initiative. Mais, comme un lapsus qui souligne

l'ambiguïté de ces rencontres, Simone Veil a cru bon choisir, comme vice-président de ce sommet, le ministre de la Santé de Tunisie, seul pays du Maghreb où les lois sur le sida ont aussi autoritaires que policoïdes, avec déclaration nominative de séropositivité ainsi qu'enquête de voisinage.

Dozens of gay and lesbian entertainment industry workers and guild members signed up to help start employee support groups or initiate campaigns for domestic partner benefits at Hollywood Supports' booth this past weekend at the Christopher Street West Gay and Lesbian Pride Festival in West Hollywood.

The booth honored the 25th anniversary of the beginning of the modern gay and lesbian equal rights movement by being the first ever booth at the festival aimed at establishing employee support groups and equality in benefits for gay and lesbian workers.

We are asking if we may have an appointment with you that week regarding the enclosed letter to you of March 23rd.

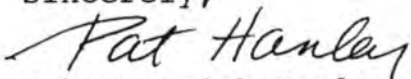
The purpose is to determine from you what the Roman Catholic program for AIDS prevention is to implement into our AIDS Project.

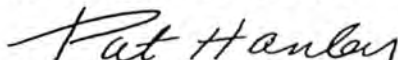

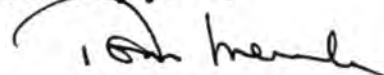
Thanks for sending me the materials you promised during our phone conversation. As I mentioned to you, my role is to let our operational staff know about important developments in our field. They, in turn, work with the member-country governments who have projects that cover family planning and reproductive health services.

Because it is a lending rather than granting agency, the Bank does not get directly involved in the procurement of contraceptives. It does advise governments about how to do it and encourages other donors to co-finance this procurement using their grant funding. We are currently preparing materials on this topic to guide the operations staff. The Bank is encouraging countries to include natural approaches where-ever it is feasible.

I think that your point about combining a fertility regulation method with use of condoms to prevent AIDS is an excellent one. A number of family planning agencies have adopted this approach.

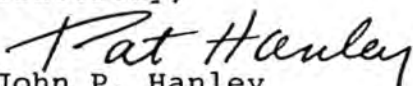

A human reproduction indexing device for indicating the calendar dates for days of a menstrual cycle on which the probability of conception is the greatest includes a generally rectangular member having indicia representing the calendar dates for the days of given months positioned in three separate columns on the member and indicator-index columns aligned and positioned adjacent each of the separate columns on the member. When the calendar date corresponding to the day of the onset of the menses is known, the indicator-index columns indicate the calendar dates for an eight day interval starting ten days after the indexed date to provide the time interval during which ovulation should occur and the days on which the probability of conception are maximized.

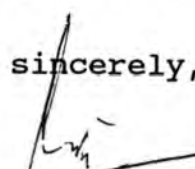
Thank you very much for your letter of May 25, 1993.

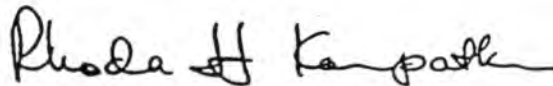
Thank you for your recent letter regarding the Fertility Finder. I appreciate your taking the time to write and share your proposal with me.

I was interested to read the information you sent regarding the Fertility Finder, and your ideas for promoting its use. Unfortunately, the Fertility Finder falls outside the scope of our current testing priorities. Consumers Union only has the resources to evaluate about 65 product categories a year, and each year we must select products to be tested from literally hundreds of recommendations.

As you know, we published test results on condoms in the March 1989 issue of Consumer Reports. In the past, CU hasn't tested contraceptives on a regular basis. However, in this case there were special factors -- the growing AIDS crisis, and the increased advertising and use of condoms -- and we felt a special responsibility to provide this type of consumer information.

Thanks again for writing to share your proposal. We appreciate your interest in our work.

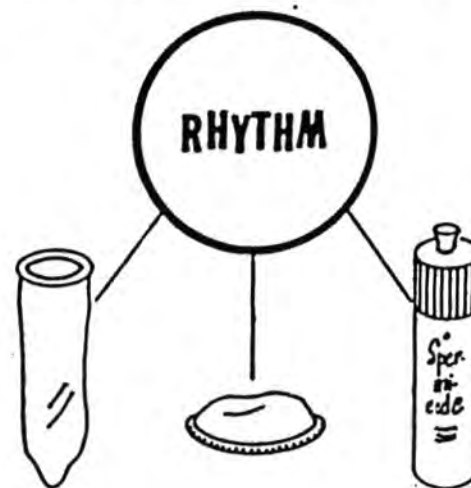

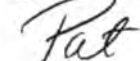

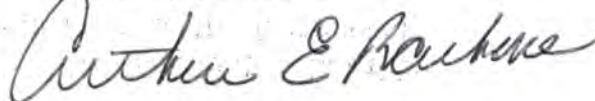

- I assume that you now recognize that you were in fact a sponsor of the conference, to the extent described in my letter.
- Are you saying that the Gay Mens Health Crisis "acknowledged" their "error" (formerly "mistake")? When and under what circumstances did they do so? The fact is, the Executive Director of GMHC wrote an angry letter to the New York Post, attacking Ray Kerrison's original column of February 16th. Perhaps you did not properly state what you meant? What do you mean?
- Your letter to Chancellor Cortines was dated February 28th. The fact is that this issue was public knowledge nearly two weeks before your letter to the Chancellor. Apparently, you are either uninformed in your area of responsibility, or misrepresenting the facts.
- Pornographic materials are not appropriate for any age group audience, let alone school children. Whether or not "effective", have you no regard for common decency? Don't you realize, that the ends do not justify the means?
- Abstinence is not "an effective means", it is the only effective means.

Finally, you need not respond to this letter. Quite frankly, it does not seem to be a "useful expenditure" of my energy to further communicate with you on this subject.

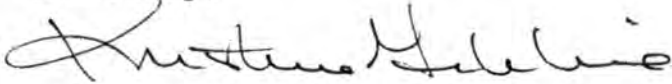

Better Health for the New Year

by Karen Masterson, C.N.

Karen Masterson is a clinical nutritionist and health educator from San Diego, California. She has worked for 15 years extensively in the field of immunology. Ms. Masterson is currently on staff with Keith Vrhel, M.D., at Park Center for Health, working primarily with HIV-positive individuals.

Digestion of the foods we eat and the supplements we may take might not seem that important when we think about our health. Yet why do we eat foods and take supplements? Enjoyment, nourishment, avoiding disease, and maintaining optimum health are all good reasons to provide our bodies with nutritious foods and valuable supplements. HOWEVER, IF YOU ARE ONE OF THE MILLIONS OF AMERICANS THAT DO NOT CHEW THEIR FOODS THOROUGHLY AT MEAL TIMES, 70% OF THE VALUABLE NUTRIENTS MAY BE LOST THROUGH IMPROPER DIGESTION AND ABSORPTION!

Step 1: Digestion in the mouth

Chewing our foods well releases an enzyme from our salivary glands called ptyalin, which begins the valuable process we call digestion. Carbohydrate digestion of fruits, vegetables and starches rely on the activity of the ptyalin enzyme in the mouth. Some scientists theorize that the mastication process signals the secretion of hydrochloric acid (HCL) and pepsin to begin flowing into the stomach for protein digestion which, in turn, builds immunity.

Step 2: Digestion in the stomach

In the stomach, gastric juices HCL and pepsin take over digestion to further break the bonds holding the proteins, carbohydrates, fats and fibers in the

foods. If foods are properly masticated, with minimal fats and oils in the diet, the stomach accepts the food contents with minimal upset, if any. Relaxation enhances digestion, as well as limiting iced beverages and large quantities of liquids for in-between meal enjoyment. Cold temperatures slow gastric juices and enzymes from performing the valuable catabolism needed in digestion. Exercise is preferred before meals or two (2) hours after eating to optimize the digestive process.

If proper digestion occurs, the foodstuff will liquify in 2 to 4 hours, becoming "chyme" which, in turn, leaves the stomach through a sphincter and enters the small intestine. DIGESTIVE SUPPLEMENTS CAN BE SAFELY ADDED BEFORE EACH MEAL AS NEEDED. Obvious signals that digestive aids are needed are:

- (1) Burping, belching, intestinal gas, whole foods being eliminated.
- (2) Indigestion, heartburn, diarrhea.

Subtle signals that digestive aids are needed are:

- (1) Parasites
- (2) Allergies
- (3) Failing health, including falling lab values (from malabsorption)

Most people, and especially individuals with health problems, need to improve digestion. Many individuals start sleeping better due to improved mineral absorption, as well as improving their overall health.

HEARING ON HEALTH CARE FRAUD: AIDS FRAUD DECEIT, DOLLARS & DESPAIR

The second in a continuing series of hearings regarding health care fraud in America was convened by the U.S. House of Representatives Committee on the Judiciary Subcommittee on Crime and Criminal Justice on May 27th on Capitol Hill in Washington,

D.C. (see *AIDS Treatment News* #174, May 7, 1993). The focus of the hearing was AIDS health care fraud. Individuals with life-threatening illnesses such as AIDS are very vulnerable due to their growing frustration with conventional treatments.

Testimony came from two panels. Panel I was comprised of People Living with AIDS (PLWAs) who claimed to have been victimized by various AIDS scams, their attorneys, and Tom Koontz, who is the executive director of the Manhattan Center for Living, "a volunteer-based organization founded upon the philosophies of mind-body connection in an effort to improve a person's outlook and quality of life."

Panel II included Dr. Randolph Wykoff, Director of the Office of AIDS Coordination at the Food and Drug Administration (FDA). Also testifying were Richard Stephens, Acting U.S. Attorney of the Northern District of Texas, and Richard Schrader, Acting Commissioner of the City of New York Department of Consumer Affairs. The Chairman of the Committee, Congressman Charles E. Schumer, (D-NY) began the proceedings with his statement that the hearings should send a clear and unequivocal message: "If you steal the dying days from a PWA, you will spend costly years in a federal prison." He plans to introduce legislation that will target outright health care fraud "on all fronts, including AIDS fraud".

Members of the first panel graphically described alleged AIDS scams that involved a type of ozone therapy and Viroxan (an ozonated chemical associated with an infusion treatment). According to the panel of PWAs and their attorneys, the practitioners of these therapies made extreme claims such as "being cured" and "seroconverting" (going from HIV-positive to HIV-negative) with garbled scientific rationale and no clinical evidence. Tom Koontz testified that he was offered a six-figure salary to endorse and become spokesperson for ozone therapy. Koontz stated that this ozone practitioner wasn't interested in appealing to PWAs who had depleted their savings,

Students get warning about AIDS

Nation's AIDS czar tells OES students danger from dreaded disease is real

There's something about statistics that causes a young mind to shut down and the eyes to glaze over.

And so it was Thursday when Kristine Gebbie, President Clinton's AIDS policy coordinator, began speaking to high school students at Oregon Episcopal School, where her son, Eric, is a senior.

As Gebbie talked about the millions of deaths worldwide from AIDS and the hundreds of thousands of

deaths in this country, it was clear that to some in the audience the epidemic was far removed from their own lives.

Some students talked, others read books. But their attention was riveted to the front of the room when Gebbie made the statistics come alive by using them in a way that forced the kids to think not only about themselves, but the person sitting next to them.

"I know that even at a nice suburban school like OES at least one of you is having sex," she said. "I know that at least one of you has had a sexually transmitted disease." She paused.

"And maybe one of you has been exposed to HIV," she said. "Most of you have a plan for your life. You want to be doctors or lawyers. That won't happen if you get HIV. Believe me, the threat is real."

Gebbie told the students that she was speaking to them as a parent and as a health official.

"I know this is a hard subject for parents and kids to talk about," she said. "But we have to. Our society thinks it's fine to put douche ads on television, showing women waltzing through a field of flowers, and yet we have no condom ads on television. Our society has not dealt well with this issue. And it is essential and lifesaving that we do so."

Changing those attitudes is just one of the tasks facing Gebbie, who is the nation's first federal AIDS czar, a post Clinton appointed her to last year. Gebbie was the administrator of the Oregon Health Division for 11 years before leaving in 1989 to become the top health official in Washington state, where she developed a national reputation for her AIDS work.

When OES learned she was re-

turning to Portland to visit with her son, it asked her to speak to the students. She agreed. On Thursday night, she gave a similar talk to school administrators and parents.

In an interview Thursday, Gebbie said she is focusing her efforts in Washington, D.C., on AIDS research, service and prevention.

"I want to make sure the research is broad and remove any roadblocks standing in the way of that research," she said. "I also want to look at health care reform. Many HIV patients are not insured, or lose their insurance once they are infected. Finally, I want to do what we can to stop this epidemic."

Gebbie said too many people view AIDS as "someone else's problem."

"As a nation, we need to understand that this is everyone's problem," she said. "Before I was appointed, there was no central focus on AIDS at the White House. That's changed. When we look at a drug strategy, for example, we see how that is a part of AIDS prevention."

Gebbie, 49, said she typically works 12- to 13-hour days and sees the president several times a month.

"It hits me now and then that I am sitting across from the president," she said. "It's like I'm in someone else's body. Ten years ago, I was at the Rotary Club in Portland talking about sex and semen and condoms and now I'm in the Cabinet room at

the White House talking about the same things.

"I view this as a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity," she said. "I feel I can make a difference. But all the programs in the world won't help unless we get individuals to make wise choices."

And that's one of the reasons why Gebbie agreed to speak to the OES students.

"Our society does not want to talk about sex, especially to kids," she said. "I think being open is important."

Gebbie gave the students a primer on how HIV is contracted and answered questions that ranged from when children should be told about AIDS (Gebbie said by the fifth grade, at the onset of puberty) to the safety of oral sex as compared to anal and vaginal intercourse.

"Sex is normal," she said. "All of us are sexual beings. The choice is how you will act out a sexual life. There are healthy and unhealthy ways."

Gebbie recommended that the students — for a variety of reasons — abstain from sex until they are adults.

"I don't know what the magic number is," she said. "But I do know that it is not at 13, 14, 15 and 16 years old. Talk with adults about these issues. All I can do is underscore the importance of talking."
