you.

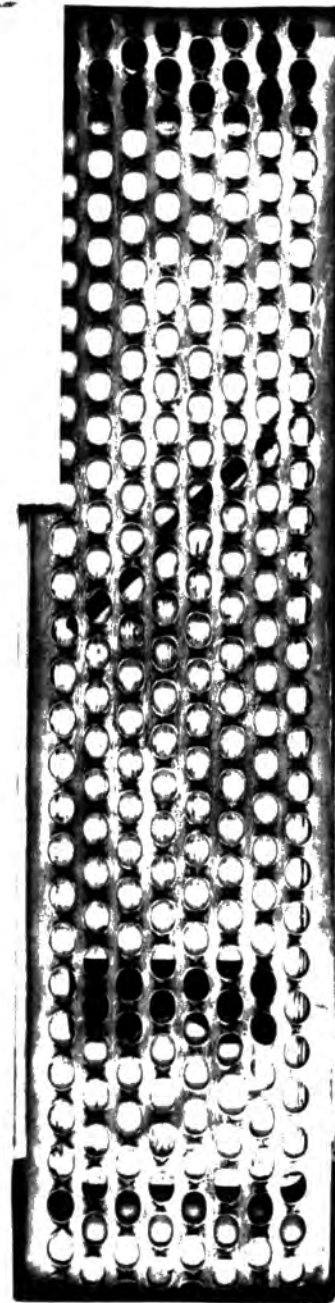
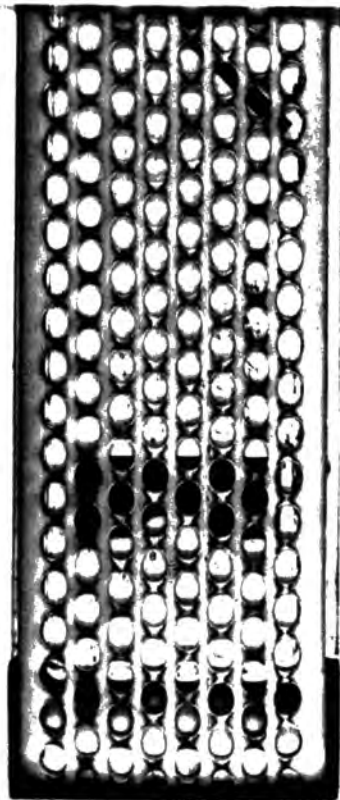

We are well aware of the expectations placed by the public and, no doubt, by the President himself, on this newly created position you have been chosen to fill. You have shown great courage in accepting unprecedented duties addressing an enormous challenge. What is CSP?

A Community Support Program (CSP) is defined as "an organized network of caring and responsible people committed to assisting persons with long-term mental illness to meet their needs and develop their potentials without being unnecessarily isolated or excluded from the community." The CSP concept includes the entire array of treatment, life support, and rehabilitation services needed to assist persons with severe, disabling mental illness to function at optimal levels within the community. 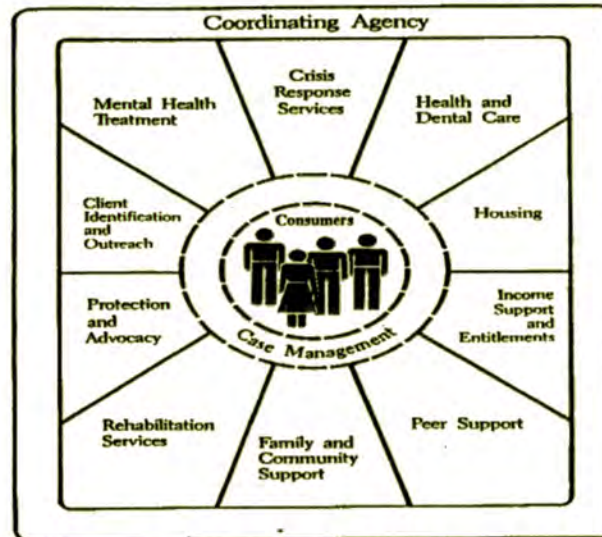

- Provide speakers to community/neighborhood groups and churches to heighten their awareness and provide education about mental illness.
- Advocate for legislation that would benefit individuals with mental illness through communications with local, state and national officials.
- Provide a forum for consumers of mental health services, family members, mental health professionals, clergy and community activists to be kept informed of the current services and trends in mental health service provision, while developing greater understanding and collaboration between the various constituencies.
